### Congress Will Find Rivalries Split Klan

WASHINGTON (AP) — When Congress investigates the Ku Klux Klan, there are at least 14 — it will find they are not split by bickering and rivalries to form a single national organization under one leader.

The total membership is probably not over 10,000 although they spread across the Southern States and some leaders have made fantastic claims about numbers. The members in general are not credited with very high intelligence.

The fact that in this free and open society so many men would find it necessary to hide under a hood necessarily raises questions about their stability and their purpose.

They proclaim their patriotism but their main target is Negroes, with Catholics, Jews and the foreign born secondary targets. They have added new targets in recent years: the "Communist conspiracy," "Klansmen live in a childlike world of hoods, robes, symbols, secret meetings and passwords, and the kind of titles that would be more appropriate to a fairy tale than the kind of gritty world Klansmen see."

The actions of some of them are not at all ostentatious, as Chairman Edwin E. Willis, D-La., of the House Committee on Un-American Activities pointed out to reporters Tuesday after the committee unanimously voted to examine the Klan.

He said preliminary inquiries indicate that "whispering crimes are carried out by highly secret groups within the Klan, known as 'knockout squads' or 'hush' groups."

The actions of these groups would be more appropriate to a fairy tale than the kind of gritty world Klansmen see.

### Workers Return To Jobs at Cape

CAPE KENNEDY, Fla. (AP) — Construction workers are expected to return to their jobs at Cape Kennedy today after the sixth work stoppage caused by labor problems in the past 14 months.

Local 803 of the Plumbers and Pipefitters Union, which is not involved in work here, withdrew picket lines late Tuesday after they had crippled construction for two days. More than 4,200 of 5,000 union building trades workers had refused to cross the lines.

Richard H. Frank, an attorney for Local 803, said "Assistants and Secretary of Labor James Reynolds will hold a meeting Sunday in Washington with representatives of the plumbers' union to see if this matter can't be resolved. In consideration of this fact, the union has agreed to withdraw the picket lines."

Local 803 seeks to become the bargaining agent for employees of Harper Plumbing and Heating Co., of Winter Park, which has two subcontractors at the missile base.

### Events In Capital

WASHINGTON (AP) — The National Association for the Advancement of Colored People plans to appeal the dismissal in federal court of a suit seeking reduction of congressional representation in states which deny Negroes the right to vote.

U.S. Dist. Judge William B. Jones, who heard the suit two months ago, threw it out Tuesday.

He upheld a motion by the government that it be dismissed on grounds the plaintiffs — 22 citizens of both Northern and Southern states — had no standing before the court to file such a suit.

The NAACP had sought a court order requiring enforcement of Section 2 of the 14th Amendment. It provides that a state's obligation to the House of Representatives shall be reduced proportionately when it denies the vote to eligible citizens.

The suit sought to force the Census Bureau to collect information about voting registration so the provision could be enforced.

### Events in World

TOKYO (AP) — The Communist Chinese government has revived its ministry of building materials and created a state capital construction commission, indicating it is concentrating once more on heavy industry.

Feeling also announced today the replacement of Li Jen-chun, minister of building construction, by one of his deputies, Liu Yu-min. Li's dismissal was not explained.

MOSCOW (AP) — A Ghanaian student, found dead two weeks ago under mysterious circumstances, was buried without incident Tuesday, the Ghanaian Embassy announced.

The similar mysterious death of another Ghanaian student in December 1963 touched off a riotous protest by African students in Red Square.

There had been unconfirmed reports that Red Chinese students in Moscow were trying to organize another African demonstration about the second death.

CAIRO (AP) — The body of ex-King Farouk of Egypt arrived from Italy Tuesday night and was taken to the royal family cemetery for burial.

Religious services were performed in the presence of three unidentified persons and several police guards.

Farouk's sister, Faisal, accompanied the body from Rome. She was still at the airport as the plane was being refueled to make any statement.

Farouk had wanted to be buried in a Muslim land, and President Gamal Abdel Nasser consented to burial in Egypt.

### State Argues For Law on Birth Control

WASHINGTON (AP) — Connecticut counsel, defending the state's anti-birth control law, told the Supreme Court yesterday they have the vital power of deterring immorality.

"I use the word immorality in a broad sense," explained Joseph B. Clark, assistant prosecuting attorney of New Haven. "The purpose of the law is to act as a deterrent to actual intercourse outside of marriage."

Justice Potter Stewart interrupted Clark to point out that the case before the court involves only three married women who received birth control advice from the Planned Parenthood Center in New Haven.

"Yes," Clark replied. "But the laws represent a valid exercise of police power of the state."

Clark spoke in the second day of arguments on an appeal to the court by Dr. C. Leo Buxton, chairman of the Yale Medical School's obstetrics department, and Mrs. Richard W. Griswold, executive director of the Planned Parenthood League of Connecticut.

Buxton was medical director and Mrs. Griswold acting director of the center in New Haven when they were arrested in 1961 for giving birth control information to three women. Buxton and Mrs. Griswold were fined \$100 each.

Connecticut laws ban the use of contraceptives and prohibit the giving of advice about birth control devices. Buxton and Mrs. Griswold, in their appeal, contend the laws deprive men and their patients of the constitutional right of free speech and of liberty without due process of law.

Buxton suggested at one point that the laws could be avoided by "advising" men the price of a ticket to New York. But Clark said there were New York laws covering the situation to some extent.

Clark related the state's control issue was one of the most hotly debated before the Connecticut legislature and that a bill is now pending to repeal the laws. He said he expected it would probably June.

Clark said the probability is that any change in the law would cover restrictions on sale of contraceptives.

"It is too bad this case came up now," he said. "In the past year there has been fantastic activity in this field."

He referred to medical studies involving the rhythm system, which he said the state had held does violate any Connecticut law. He related that medical diagnoses might make birth control devices pass, and there would be no need for the laws now being contested.

Under questioning by Chief Justice Earl Warren, Clark said the Connecticut laws had not been enforced against private physicians, only against clinics.

Thomas J. Emerson, of New Haven, counsel for Buxton and Mrs. Griswold, in reply argued that the Connecticut laws were being enforced in a way that denies medical services to a great many people in an area of utmost importance to them.

Justice Hugo L. Black wanted to know whether the clinic in New Haven was a business institution. His question was prompted by a statement earlier by Clark that "this is an economic case of people running a business." Clark said that one woman had been charged \$10 for a tube of pills, "and that's an awful lot of money."

Emerson insisted that the clinic was not a business institution, that it had sliding scale of fees from nothing to \$10. Emerson said Buxton served without pay. He added that he believed Mrs. Griswold was paid by the Planned Parenthood League and not the clinic.

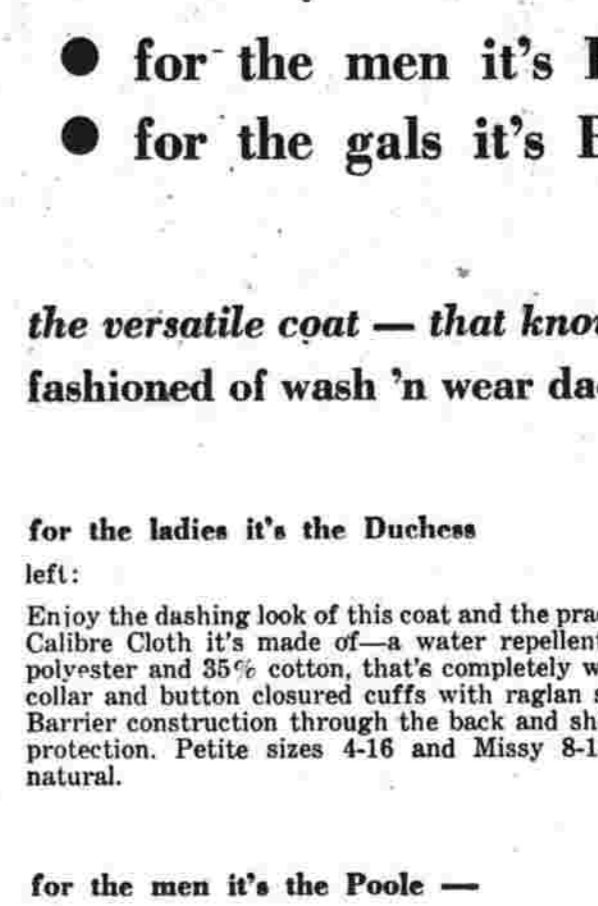

The Manchester Housing Authority is facing a problem with which almost every householder is familiar: to fit its needs within its budget. Its needs, in this case, are for a 100-unit addition to the Westhill Garden housing for the elderly project off W. Center St.

The authority has been set by the Federal Public Housing Administration at \$1,240,000. And the low bid for the project is \$1,515,000.

Not only is the low bid above the amount budgeted for the project, but it exceeds the maximum per-room cost set by federal statutes.

The authority took a first step toward reducing the discrepancy by dropping the project's budget and its estimated cost by cutting out an estimated \$130,000-worth of construction work from the building specifications.

The cut was affected by eliminating full basements from the construction plans, substituting sliding sash windows for casement windows, substituting material to kitchen cabinets, eliminating ceramic tile on some walls, and substituting plastic shower doors for glass.

The five alterations were selected from more than a dozen cost-cutting proposals suggested by the architects for the project, the New Haven firm of Hines & Pedersen.

The authority members estimated that the cuts would bring the cost of the 15 single-story buildings in the addition under the statutory per-room cost of \$2,750 — but not within the \$925,000 budget set by the federal government for the construction of the planned 100 dwelling units.

Even with the trimming, the estimated cost for the structure is still about \$160,000 over the budgeted price, according to architect Atty. Yules.

Bradford Yules, senior partner in the architectural firm said the architects would be quite willing to make "draw the line" at starting over again with a two-story building.

The authority decided early last year that it favored single-story construction for the entire project, and the architects have designed the buildings on that basis.

TANGIER, Morocco (AP) — A twin-engine chartered Spanish airliner crashed into the Atlantic near Tangier today. A Hispania airliner picked up three badly injured survivors, but it was believed the other 49 persons aboard the plane were killed.

The Convar of the Spanish Iberia airline took off in a light fog shortly after 8:30 a.m. from Tangier, on the North African coast. It was bound for Málaga, in Spain, 80 miles northeast of Gibraltar.

The Spanish trawler Virgen de Carmelo gave the alert soon after the plane had dropped into the spring.

Three other Spanish fishing boats and a Moroccan coast guard cutter were searching the scene.

### Connecticut - Brazil Klar Enthusiastic About Partnership

James S. Klar of Bolton can talk for hours about a comparatively small state in Brazil called Paraba. As chairman of the new Partners of the Alliance Planning Committee, he feels a deep sense of responsibility for the future development of the adopted state. And he acquired, during his tour of that state in February, a great enthusiasm for the people, their customs and their problems.

As Klar thinks, so could all the people of Connecticut, for this state as a sort of country cousin, quite undernourished, especially financially.

The assignment was made last fall by the Alliance for Progress. Other New England states, as well as Pennsylvania and New Jersey, have been made partners with states in the same section of Brazil.

Although these partnerships are organized on state levels, aid will come from private groups and individuals seeking to help those projects seeking aid. Requests for aid must be made and passed by committees in both states of the partnership.

Klar, who is assistant managing director of the Connecticut Development Commission, set up the planning committee at the request of Gov. John Dempsey.

The committee of about 25 members proceeded to elect Klar chairman. His counterpart, Max Siqueira, is the capital of Paraba, is head of its development committee.

Klar returned from his two-week tour of Paraba loaded with pictures and reports on the 17 initial top priority projects seeking volunteer aid from this state.

Klar is a state university with 1,600 students in João Pessoa, the state capital. (Klar pronounced "João" like the "Jo" in "Joan" and it means "John Person.")

One of the projects seeking aid is in João Pessoa, a city of 22,000, the largest in the Northeast. Klar started by father and son doctors, who eventually became a pediatric hospital, the only one of its kind in Northeast Brazil.

while it was impossible to borrow money at all, it can be borrowed at extremely high rates of interest.

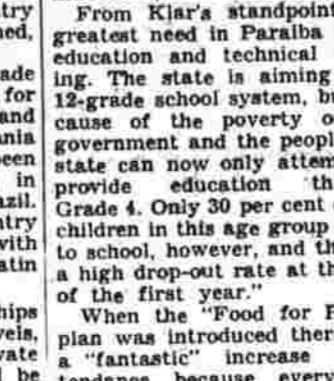

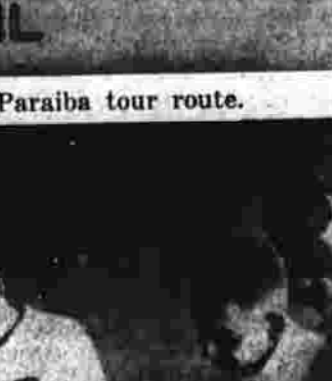

### Rockville-Vernon Fourth Government Starting Tomorrow

### Mrs. Neville's Newest Book Takes City Boy to Country

Former Manchesterite Emily Cheney Neville has written another novel about a city boy who, although not a sequel to her 1964 Newbery Award-winning novel, "It's Like This, Cat," it contains the same understanding of children and their sympathetic approach of their delightful story.

"Unlike 'Cat,' which described the adventures of a New York City teenager, while exploring the strange and fascinating people and places of his beloved city, 'Barnes Goodman' is about a nine-year-old New York boy who, for two years, discovers the joys and frustrations of country living.

Mrs. Neville, daughter of the late Mr. and Mrs. Howell Cheney, lived in the family mansion on Hartford Rd. and, until the seventh grade, attended the Cheney family private school on the West Side of the building which now houses the Laiz Junior Museum.

She attended seventh and eighth grades at Barnard School, now Barnard High, and was then enrolled at Oxford School in West Hartford, and later at Bryn Mawr College, where she majored in economics.

After graduation from Bryn Mawr she became a copy girl for the New York News and later became a staff member of the N.Y. Mirror.

She is the wife of newspaperman Glen Neville and the mother of five children, ages 20 to 26.

The Neville live at Gramercy Park, the New York setting of "It's Like This, Cat."

In her latest book, "Barnes" (christened "Barnes"), a city boy to the tips of his fingers, leads a lonely and unexciting life in a rented house in the country, situated in the trip next door.

He finds a friend at school in Sidney Pine, a Jewish boy, living in a town which practices segregation in its schools, late dealings, and "Gentlemen's Agreements" in its social life.

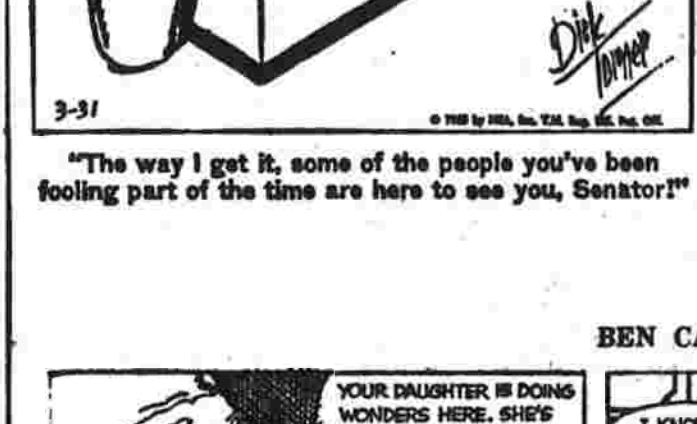
