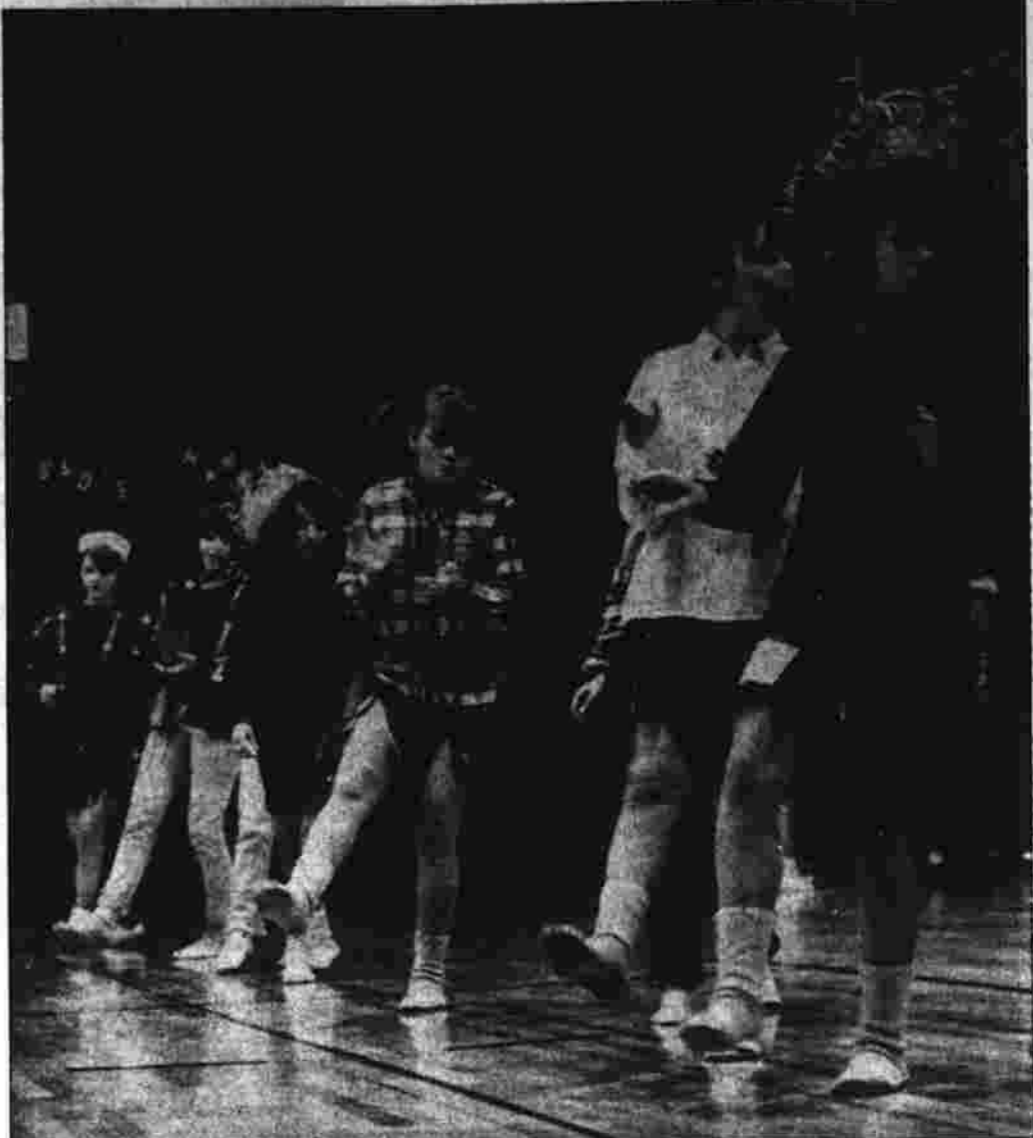

Martin Budget Goes To Public Monday

A public hearing on General Manager Richard Martin's recommended budgets for the 1965-66 fiscal year will be held Monday at 8 p.m. in Illing Junior High School Auditorium.

Martin is recommending a General Funds Budget of \$9,658,319, which is about \$800,000 above the current budget and recommending a two-mill increase in the town's 42-mill tax rate.

In recommending the two-mill tax rate, Martin is anticipating a \$139,000 surplus from current operating funds and is predicting that the town will receive \$250,000 from the state in new educational grants. In addition, he has estimated that an additional increase of \$29,000 in school construction aid will be forthcoming from the state.

Although Martin has cut \$207,000 from the board of education's requested budget for next year, his total General Fund budget is only \$198,000 below the combined sum requested by all departments.

In most cases he has approved all requests, in a few instances has cut some and in other instances has increased them.

The board of directors has a May 7 deadline for adopting the town budgets and for setting the tax rates. The town's fiscal year starts on July 1.

NEW YORK (AP) — There are now 14 daytime game shows on the three major television networks occupying a total of seven hours.

Games and panel show fans can settle down at 10 a.m. and, with a half-hour break for a late lunch, see nothing else until 4 p.m.

There also are 13 soap operas filling six of the daytime hours, thus guaranteeing the true devotees of tragedy and suffering plenty to brood about from noon to four.

Amazingly there are few conflicts among the game shows on the networks — ABC's "The Price Is Right" is on at the same time as NBC's "Jeopardy" and ABC's new "The Rebus Game" competes with NBC's "Everything's Relative," but that is seen only on a handful of NBC-owned stations anyway.

The daytime serial addict, however, has some grave decisions to make between 2 p.m. and 3:30, a period when nine different soaps are jammed into the schedule. ABC's "Flame in the Wind" is on at the same time as NBC's "Moment of Truth" and ABC's "Young Marrieds" struggles against CBS' "Edge of Night" among other conflicts.

With a lavish feast served up daily for game lovers, it is hard to understand the necessity of adding two new ones to the schedule, as did NBC Tuesday. First there was "Call My Bluff." In this one, two rival teams of three, including the usual celebrities, try to per-

suade their opponents to believe a fake definition of a rare word or, in the alternative, to doubt the real definition.

The second show, "I'll Bet," has two teams of celebrities, each accompanied by his or her spouse. The game is betting on

husbands' or wife's ability to answer simple questions. There was a certain amount of interest in seeing Patricia Blair's new husband's expression of shocked incredulity when

More Color For Future

NEW YORK (AP) — By 1971 there will be 40 million color TV sets in American homes (compared with today's 3 million) and by 1976 almost every TV home will be equipped with at least two sets (around 20 per cent of our homes are so equipped now).

These are the predictions of Rodney Erickson, vice president of a research organization (American Research Bureau) in a speech to members of the television industry this week.

In 10 years, Erickson said, "the color set will become the family — or adult — set, and the other sets will be for the kids or in the bedrooms, kitchens and even in the back of the car."

If he has his projection sights accurately set, this means that within 10 years the American family will split to various rooms in the house — even the garage — to view the program of their individual choice.

When television was young it was hailed as a medium which drew the family together. Later

it was said that although the family was physically together, this resulted in little if any conversation — just rapt concentration on the set in a semidarkened room.
