DellaFera Lashes MHA Dismissal of Yules Said Cheap Politics

Republican Town Chairman Francis DellaFera this morning labeled the dismissal of Atty. Herman Yules from his posts on the Manchester Housing Authority as "the worst kind of political chicanery ever to be perpetrated on the citizens of Manchester."

"The shocking procedure used by the Democratic majority to summarily dismiss Atty. Yules," he said, "was precipitated a new low in party politics."

And, he says, "The refusal of the three Democratic members of the action to discuss with Atty. Yules the basic reasoning by which they arrived at their decision is arbitrary and most high-handed, and completely unacceptable."

"The opposition to the resolution, and the absence of any explanation is a flagrant violation of the rights of the people of Manchester to be completely informed of the action to discuss with Atty. According to town chairman DellaFera, "The questionable motives which prompted the resolution, submitted by member John Hutchinson and ratified by the Housing Authority, do a complete disservice to the Democratic leadership, which I am confident is not proud of the methods of the housing authority, as reported in the Manchester Herald."

Massive Secret Guard Priceless Documents Transferred to Fair

NEW YORK (AP) — Under massive and secret guard, copies of precious national documents transferred from Washington to the Federal Building in the New York World's Fair.

Hanging of the documents in the Hall of Presidents started Friday night. The display will be ready for the fair's opening on its second and final season Wednesday.

The priceless collection was moved in armored trucks to the fair late Friday from the main vault of a branch of the Chase Manhattan Bank in Rockefeller Center.

Holy Week tourists and other visitors who crowded Rockefeller Plaza had no inkling of what was going on as the trucks pulled away behind a police escort.

A U.S. Marine detachment and special fair guards were alerted to New York in late March, unprecedented security precautions were deemed even more imperative because of the recent disclosure of an alleged plot to blow up the Statue of Liberty.

At 8 a.m. on March 25, armored trucks of the Treasury Department and the National Archives collection left Washington for New York.

The trucks moved the collection to a rear garage of Union Station in Washington where it was placed on a Pennsylvania Railroad train for New York.

Trucks, which had waited at Pennsylvania Station here, carried the treasure under heavy guard through mid-Manhattan to the fair grounds.

The special frame was needed for each piece of the collection for the fair. A few pieces were moved secretly under guard each day to a downtown building where they were being stored until prepared for the fair.

Some of the articles, however, were considered too valuable to be transported here and both the work was done behind the vault.

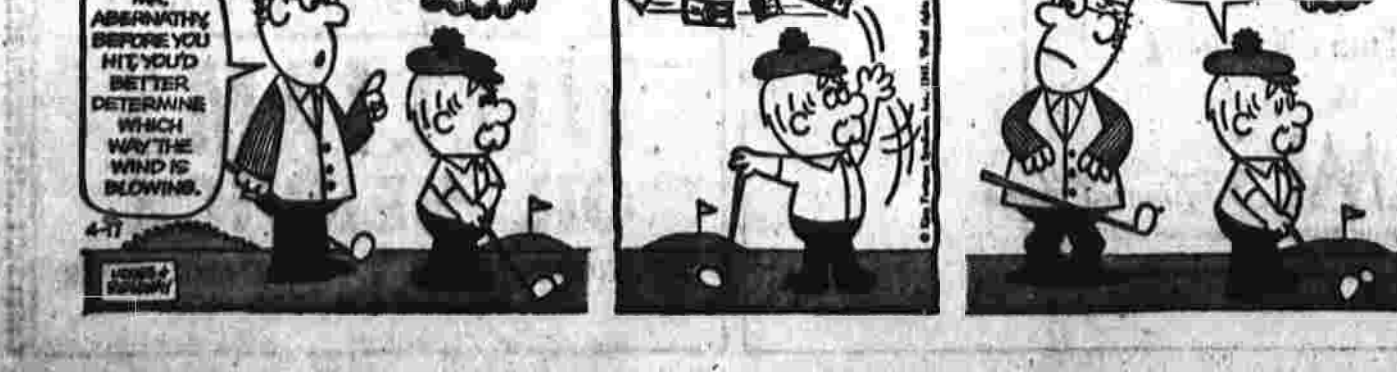

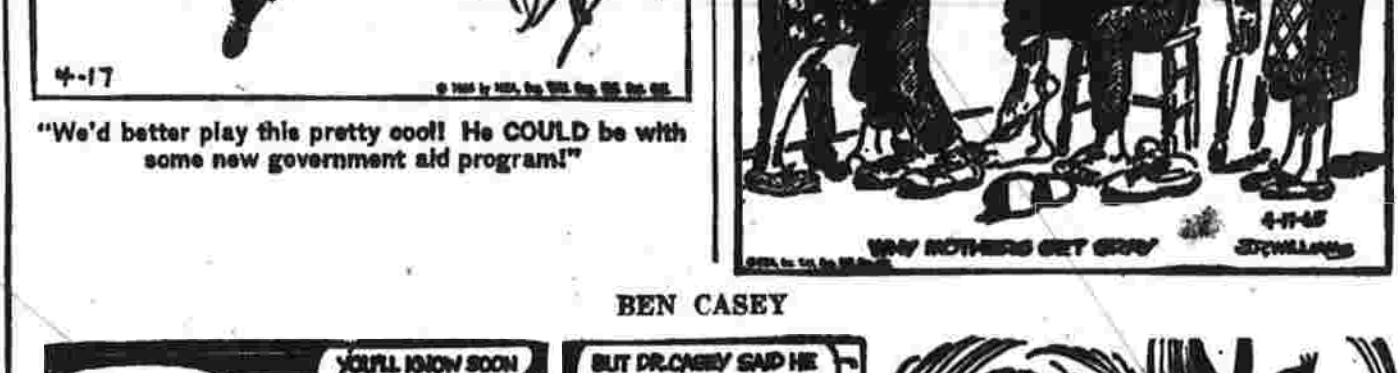

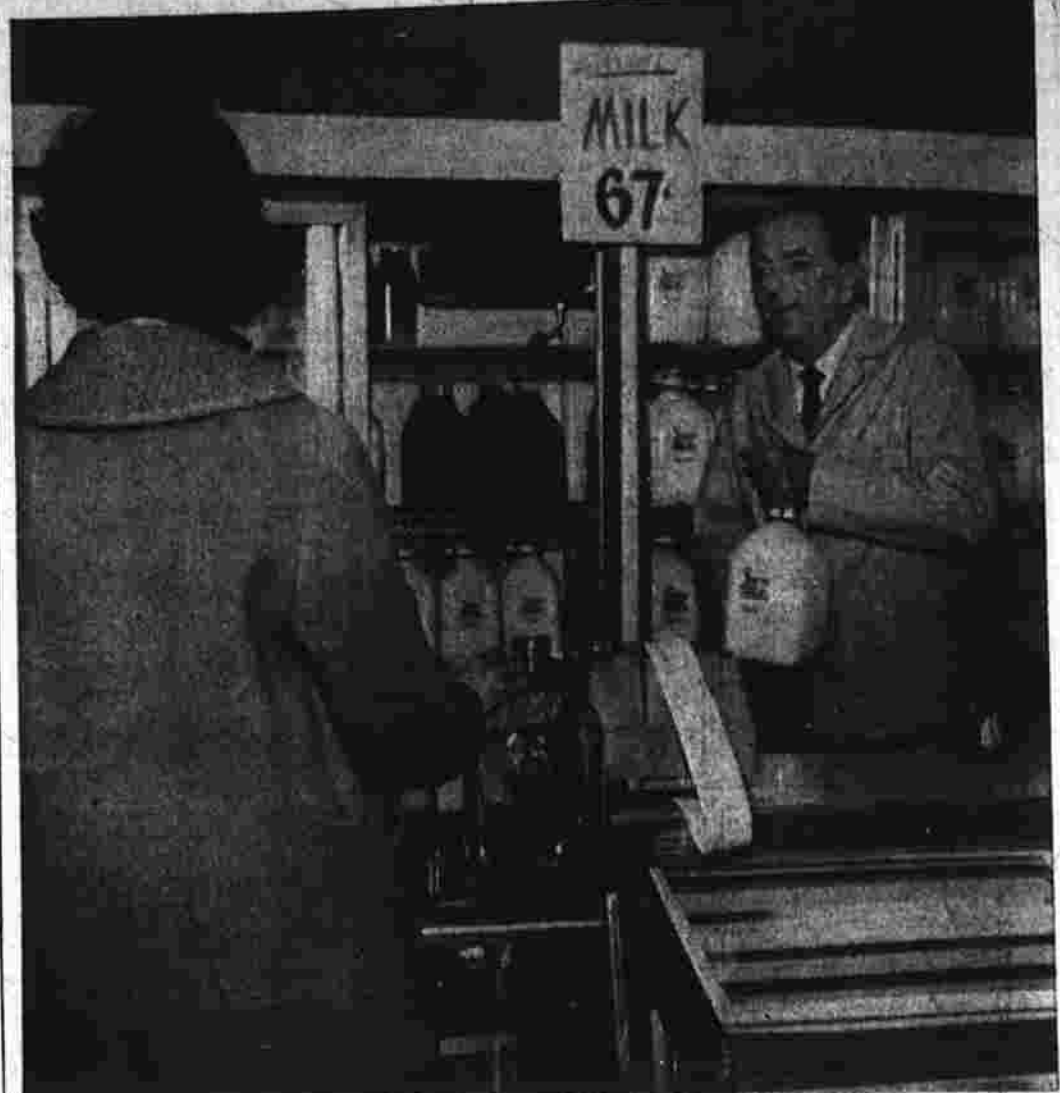

NEW YORK — (NEA) — Jean-Paul Vignon's story is the classic show-business tale: A young man goes to acting school primarily to lose his southern accent, then gets his first role, which calls for a southern accent. But in the case of handsome Jean-Paul, the accent was from the south of France!

A singer with all the charm of a young Maurice Chevalier, Jean-Paul's first American record album for Columbia, "Because I Love You," proves him a young man of considerable talent. **Name Meant Show**  
The 24-year-old French-Italian was born in Direedawa, Ethiopia and raised in Djibouti, French Somaliland. (His mother was born in Port Said, Egypt, while her parents were migrating from Italy to Ethiopia, to add to the exotic places connected with the family.) His real name is Jean-Paul Soumer. "That means shoe, so you can see why I changed it," he smiles. When his family moved from Ethiopia to France, they settled in Avignon, and at the drop of an "a," Jean-Paul had a new name.

After a move to Paris, and his enrollment in a dramatic school to lose the "Mals out, you-all" accent, he sang in Parisian cabarets, acted in a couple of movies and served in the army.

**Hail New York**  
He is the first professional entertainer in his family, although "my family has always loved singing and music. We were all inclined to the theater, music and art. Now I am a resident of the United States and I will be a citizen in three more years. I love it. For me, there is only one town—New York. I love it even more than Paris. Paris is more beautiful, but New York is the place to live."

Jean-Paul's name is pronounced "Vin-yon," and it has been written like that on Ed Sullivan's Tele-Prompter. Sullivan, impressed with the young man's talent, decided to give him a good plug in his newspaper column. "Only," Jean-Paul says with a rueful smile, "he spelled it Vinyon. Do you think I should change it again?"

Special Breed Needed for Night Shows

NEW YORK (AP) — It has now been pretty well established by trial and error that the job of presiding over a late evening, informal, fun-and-entertainment session on television requires a special talent. It's mostly because the people who watch these shows are a special kind of audience.

The most recent Nielsen statistics indicate that television sets in about one of every four homes remain turned on between 11 p.m. and 1 a.m., and that around 24 million viewers watch the late news and weather and then stay awake for an old movie or something like NBC's "Tonight" show or ABC's "Nightlife."

In the non-old-movie area, Johnny Carson's NBC show attracts the largest number of viewers, estimated by Nielsen at around 3 1/2 million homes.

"Tonight," first under the stormy aegis of Jack Paar and then the less turbulent Carson, has proved to be the outstanding success in this type of program.

ABC trying to attract some of the late viewers, launched "The Les Crane Show" this season, but low ratings and critical drubbing killed the show after a short time. Now remodeled as "Nightlife," it is still attracting a comparatively small audience — something under a million homes.

Part of the program's problem is that it lacks any continuity. Comedians like Shelley Longman, Jack Carter and Allan Sherman plus singer Pat Boone, have been sitting in for a week or two at a time as hosts but none has caused any hat-throwing by the audience. The comedians have worked frantically

"A vow of poverty doesn't mean destitution," says Sister Mary Venise of Buffalo, N.Y., the 18-voice choir's lead singer. "We would like to make some money, but to aid all our works in Africa. The nations are new and have their own problems, and we can't expect help from the local governments."

The White Sisters, an international order of nuns who serve in the African missions for 10 to 20 years, began singing in their convent in Washington, D.C. The repertoire consisted of African songs brought back by returning nuns. One day they were heard by a vis-

Welk's Band

A \$200 Investment

By JAMES BACON  
 HOLLYWOOD (AP) — Just 15 years ago, Sam Lutz, manager of Lawrence Welk, paid a local television station \$200 to put the Welk band on the air.  
 Now Lawrence Welk, who has missed but one Saturday night on television since, grosses \$4 million a year.  
 That puts Welk up among the titans of show business.  
 "And everybody who associates with Welk makes money," says Lutz. "Myron Floren and his accordion gross better than \$100,000 a year on personal appearances. The Lennon sisters average around \$350,000. Welk is a Hollywood oil well."  
 It wasn't that easy 15 years ago.  
 Lutz, who also was behind the Liberace boom, first met Welk during World War II.  
 "I was a special service office in Chicago and Lawrence was playing at the Aragon Ballroom. Everytime we put on a show for servicemen, Welk was the first to volunteer his band.  
 "I could see how popular he was in Chicago and the Midwest. After the war, I brought him out here and put him in another Aragon Ballroom at Santa Monica.  
 "The crowds came. Television, in those days, was just getting going good. I figured Lawrence a natural for it.

"But it was tough selling him. Big bands were passe and I couldn't get Klaus Landsberg, head of Channel 5 on the phone.  
 "It was the top outfit in those days. So I gave orders to my secretary to put in a call to Landsberg every 15 minutes.  
 "Finally, one day he got on the phone. He finally said he would try Lawrence for one show provided we paid the musicians — about \$200.  
 "The Welk band was only on the air 15 minutes before the KTLA switchboard started lighting up. Before the show was finished, Landsberg was ready to talk business.  
 "Soon, a car sponsor bought the show and for five years, sales boomed in the Los Angeles area. That's when the big boys in Detroit got interested. Soon the same sponsor wanted Lawrence on national television.  
 "That was 10 years ago.  
 "He has only missed one Saturday night — the weekend of President Kennedy's assassination. With his records, personal appearances and television and other enterprises, Welk grosses \$4 million.  
 "It was the best \$200 bet I ever made."  
 Modern jazz aficionados sometimes make fun of Welk's music.  
 But the public and the bankers love him.
