





Washington correspondents see two purposes in the scheduling of Defense Secretary Robert McNamara's special press conference yesterday, and in that scheduled for today by President Johnson himself.

The first major purpose of each conference, they say, is to continue the sducation and persuasion of the American people away from their regrettable differences of opinion over the strategies the United States has been pursuing in

President Johnson and his top advisers, it is said, still cannot understand how and why newspapers like the New York Times, commentators like Walter Lippmann, and almost half the average Americans who answer public opinion polls continue to quarrel with the wisdom of the strategy we have been following in Vietnam since February.
