Full Year Gone By, Baby Still Missing

CHICAGO (AP)—The arrest of Mrs. Chester Fronczak remains a mystery today, one year after her infant son was taken from her.

Though thousands of people have tried to find Paul Joseph Fronczak, the one person who could return him to his grieving mother's empty arms has not come forward.

She is the middle-aged woman who was questioned as a nurse April 27, 1964, to enter the room at St. Michael's Hospital where Mrs. Fronczak, 28, was feeding her son, just 37 hours old.

Mrs. Fronczak and her husband, Chester, 33, a machinist, were hospitalized in their three-room apartment for some "word of their kidnaped son."

The mother has said, "I believe that God will return Paul to me. We keep everything ready for him."

The happy mother, whose only other child had been stillborn, gave her infant to the woman in white who said it had to be examined. Mrs. Fronczak has not seen him since.

More than 40,000 persons have been interviewed, and some 100 volumes of testimony have been gathered in the attempt to find the child. John T. Carter of the Chicago Police Department said Monday.

"We haven't given up yet," he said. "Two detectives are working on it. We average a couple of leads a week."

Gengras praised state officials and the trustees of the New Haven Railroad for their efforts to solve the problems of the bankrupt line, but said transportation management in the past has lacked "profit incentive."

He said the meeting that the New Haven's problems are the most complex facing the state. The overall solution for the railroad is good management, not government subsidies, he said.

Washington correspondents see two purposes in the scheduling of Defense Secretary Robert McNamara's special press conference yesterday.

The first major purpose of each conference, they say, is to continue the education and persuasion of the American people away from their regrettable differences of opinion over the strategies in Vietnam.

President Johnson and his top advisers, it is said, still cannot understand how and why newspapers like the New York Times commentators like Walter Lippmann, and almost half the average Americans who answer public opinion polls continue to quarrel with the administration.

At its best, this could be called education and exposition. At its worst, and crudest, it slips down into the level of propaganda.

"With the changing course, the changing nature and particularly the intensification of infiltration both of arms and personnel into South Vietnam has grown progressively more flagrant and more uncontrolled."

"The North Vietnamese battalion that is fighting in the South apparently started moving into South Vietnam before United States air strikes in the North began on Feb. 7, a well-qualified source at the United States Operation Mission said today."

Information about this unit came to our people in South Vietnam, Correspondent Langguth reports, on the basis of information given by a defector.

"American intelligence evaluators," Langguth continues, "who generally do not confirm a report until it has been supported by a second defector's testimony, have been reluctant to make a public statement."
