Proposed Zone Limits Factory Site Layouts

A new Special Industrial Zone amendment to the town zoning regulations, with lot size and use requirements, is being considered by the Town Planning Commission.

The new amendment will be considered at a May 26 public hearing, along with a series of zoning regulations that were taken up by the commission in February.

It also states that the commission shall have the right to vary, subject to appropriate conditions, such requirements of these regulations.

Changes in the regulations governing Residence Zone C—held over from a public hearing in May 26. Some controls on an industrial building now in a Residence Zone C tract would be equal to a Residence Zone A.

The present industrial zone includes none of the restrictions proposed for the new special zone.

The suggested regulation also sets out the kinds of uses that would be permitted in an industrial zone.

The new section delineating the commission's powers of special permits which would apply to requests for such excavation, golf courses and some office buildings as well as group dwellings—states that the commission will study the proposed development in its relationship to the following factors:

1. The impact of the proposed project upon existing and anticipated future traffic flow.

2. The impact of the bulk of the project upon the neighborhood and adjacent buildings.

3. The presence or absence of public or private utility services adequate to supply the proposed development.

4. The actual use, age and condition of the buildings and properties in the neighborhood.

Troopers Guard Women Prisoners After Night Riot

ST. Gabriel, La. (AP)—State troopers guarded women prisoners at the Louisiana State Prison for the Louisiana State Prison for Women after quelling a shrieking, mad-battering riot Thursday night with tear gas and streams of water from fire hoses.

State Police Sgt. Tom Burbank, who hurried in with about 50 men during the three-hour uproar, said there were no serious troubles.

Warden Clyde Griffin said the trouble started after one of the 150 inmates was placed in solitary for hitting a matron in an argument over food.

Seventeen women, four of them Negroes, crawled up to the roof of a two-story dormitory and refused to come down unless the inmates placed in "the hole" was released. They were armed with garden tools. About 50 others milled around in the prison yard, screaming insults and throwing mud at the guards.

The rioting is located on the 50-acre site of the prison, about 30 miles south of Baton Rouge.

Arbor Day was observed in Manchester today with the planting of trees by the town park department on the lawns of Bowers, Nathan Hale, Buckland, Verplanck and Buckley Schools. On Monday, trees will be planted at Bentley and Kenney St. Schools and, on Tuesday, at Wadwell School.

In a ceremony at Bowers School this morning, witnessed by the entire school body, Dr. Charles E. Jacobson, chairman of the Manchester Chamber of Commerce City Beautiful Committee, told the boys and girls to remember the motto, "Manchester's Beauty Is Everyone's Duty."

He lauded the faculty and students "for establishing a tradition at Bowers over the past 10 years, planting a tree on each Arbor Day."

He said "He who plants a tree provides something for the next generation. Just as we all owe something to the past, so we should make our contribution to tomorrow."

Today's program at Bowers School was conducted by the sixth grade.

Gov. John Dempsey's proclamation, designating Arbor Day, was read by Shirley Miller, Colleen Kennan, Michael Bayles and Dennis Delade.

Elizabeth Walker, Thomas Furlong and Darlene Pateman gave a brief history of Arbor Day, and Jacqueline Quintin, Elizabeth Juberovic and Patricia Backus read a poem about trees.

The entire school body joined in singing "America the Beautiful" accompanied by the school ensemble.

Carrier-Based Planes Smash Supply Depots

The 82-foot cutters normally are armed with 20mm guns.

The announcement said the boats are well suited for operations against enemy supply depots, boats as well as disguised fishing boats which mingle with the familiar Vietnamese junk.

The Saigon government announced that it had received reports that the Australian-United States Navy task force had destroyed a Viet Nam supply depot in the near future.

Sydney newspapers reported that the Australian navy's crack 1st battalion is expected to be in action by the end of June.

On the diplomatic front, France joined the Soviet Union in a virtual call for withdrawal of American troops from Viet Nam and merger of the south with Red-ruled North Viet Nam.

A joint statement issued at the windup of talks between French Foreign Minister Maurice Couve de Murville and Soviet Foreign Minister Andrei A. Gromyko declared that the events in Viet Nam are endangering world peace. The statement asserted that a solution of the problems in Viet Nam must be based on the Geneva agreements of 1954 on Indochina. The agreements viewed Viet Nam as a single country temporarily divided.

The two foreign ministers said the Geneva agreements are based on "the recognition of the independence and sovereignty of these states and on noninterference in their internal affairs."

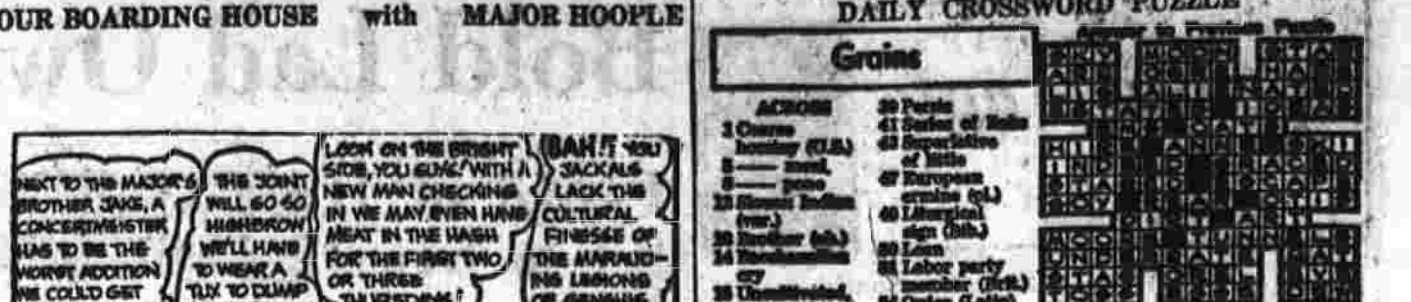

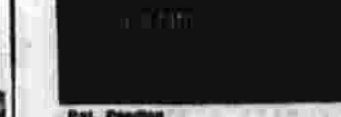

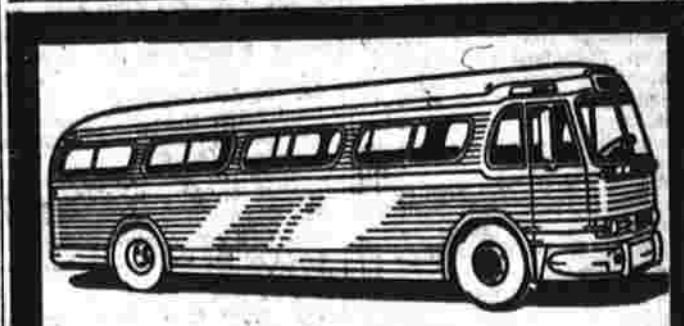
