Viet Changes Likely

Shakeup Talk Heard Again

SAIGON, South Viet Nam (AP)—Reports of an impending shakeup in South Viet Nam's military high command circulated in Saigon today. There were reports that some changes in the Viet Nam government also were likely.

It was expected that the Armed Forces Council, a consulting military body that has served the Viet Nam government since the fall of the Diem regime, would be dissolved.

At least one company made heavy contact with the Viet Cong. Details of the action were not immediately available.

Heavy rains marking the beginning of the monsoon season have begun to hamper air operations, but U.S. Navy jets maintained North Viet Nam on Communist North Viet Nam and South Viet Nam.

Navy planes made four strikes against North Viet Nam today. Monday night, pilots said they destroyed or damaged four North Viet Nam military targets.

A U.S. military spokesman said 10 Navy jets straddled two locomotives and 30 railroad cars that were spotted 120 miles south of Hanoi today. The pilot reported they saw heavy secondary explosions in the wreckage.

California Desperate For Harvesting Help

SACRAMENTO, Calif. (AP)—California is looking into classrooms, kitchens and Army barracks in a desperate search for workers to harvest a multimillion-dollar strawberry crop reportedly rotting under a warm spring sun.

The recruiting drive began today as the state's strawberry harvest enters its peak. California's lush fields, brought on by unusually early rains, are now ripe with fruit.

Strike Perils Fall Fashions

NEW YORK (AP)—Hundreds of picketed department stores today are in a state of confusion as a strike of 10,000 clerks and office workers.

The strike for improved contracts and better job opportunities for members of the union started slowly Sunday. It spread Monday through the garment center, hub of the nation's women's ready-to-wear industry.

It came just as the industry is beginning work on fall models and ready-to-wear dresses and sportswear. If it is prolonged, it could snuff off the industry's supply of models.

The strikers' leaders claimed that the union is being used as a bargaining chip by the industry. They said they need "real" contracts.

Not a piece of goods has moved in the area since the strike began, according to the National Retail Federation, which said it is up to the industry to choose between the strikers and the public.

SEATO Bloc Backs Cong Withdrawal

LONDON (AP)—A majority of the Southeast Asia Treaty Organization, with France and Pakistan in the position of dissenters, agreed today that Communist penetration of South Viet Nam should be halted once and for all.

The U.S. State Department said the future of Southeast Asia came under review in a closed meeting in Manila today.

Differences appeared to center more on tactics than on aims. They revolved around when and how to negotiate for a settlement.

British Foreign Secretary Michael Stewart, expressing the majority viewpoint, supported American policies. He said the use of force is necessary in some cases to bring about a settlement.

Thailand's foreign minister, Thanet Khomut, told the other delegates that Communist elements are inciting an active insurgency movement in his country and have moved to organize a puppet government. He said there may be a guerrilla war in Thailand "before the year is out."

Foreign Minister Paul Hanke of Australia said the solution of economic problems in Southeast Asia is to be found in a "great deal of progress toward a solution of the problems of the region."

The committee met with Col. Francisco Casmano Dem, rebel military commander and his lieutenant, who said they were in rebel-held territory in downtown Santo Domingo. Earlier the inter-American group met with leaders of the military junta set up by Brig. Gen. Elias Wessin y Wessin.

U.S. Marines and paratroopers boxed in the insurgent stronghold in the downtown area by establishing a corridor across the remaining exposed edges of the sector. It was supposed to assure a flow of supplies to an international aid center set up for the protection of foreigners. Since the revolt erupted five days ago from a landing craft off Santo Domingo, it has been supplied by helicopter.

It has been estimated that 1,000 Dominican rebels have been killed and 1,200 wounded in the revolt. U.S. officials in Washington said they had received reports that some of the rebels were beginning to hide their weapons and give up the struggle, at least in the north.

Other reports received in Washington said Communist elements in the rebel movement had broken up their headquarters in the north and were moving toward the Caribbean Sea.

U.S. authorities said they are determined to make sure all measures will be taken to eliminate the Communist presence in the Dominican Republic. U.S. troops have been ordered to meet today if the rebels refuse to accept the terms of the agreement.

An unconfirmed report said a U.S. paratrooper was killed Monday in the Dominican Republic. He was killed in the Caribbean Sea.

A U.S. Navy spokesman said 23 Marines and 21 Marines have been wounded in the Dominican Republic. An American was listed as missing in action after disappearing from a landing craft off Santo Domingo.

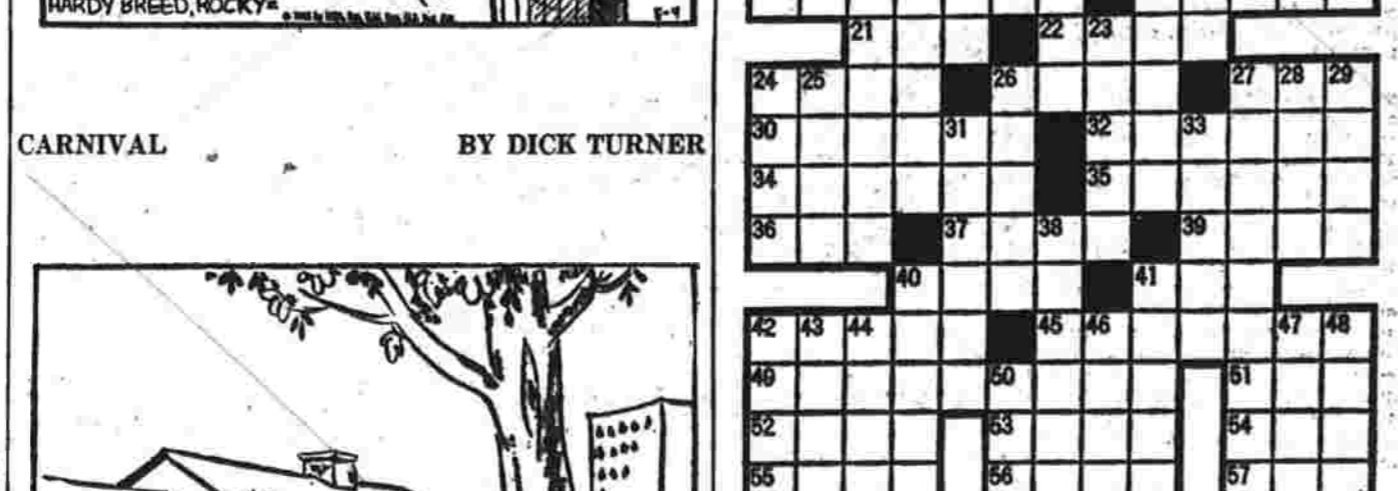
