





Hal Boyle Night Work Comes Soon For Marines

DA NANG, South Viet Nam (AP) — The Marines are friendy at the front. Maj. Mark Moore is known as the hospitable host of Backbreak Hotel. "Welcome to your home away from home," he said at the en-trance of his command tent at he base of Hill 312 where U.S. Marines have thrust out their perimeter guard of the vast Da Nang airbase. "All the conveniences you'd

want including hot and cold run-ning water." He pointed at a bag hung from some posts, and single or double sleeping bags. Moore, 38, is a lanky 6-foot, 4moore, se, is a larky e-root, a-finch officer with tow-colored hair and blue eyes that orinkle easily into laughter. He is seeing his first battle action since serving 13 months as an aerial observer during the Ko-rean campaign. He comes from Dallas, Tex., but his wife and four children now are staying in Carisbad, Calif.

Carlsbad, Calif.

As operations officer of the 2nd Battalion of the 3rd Marine Regiment, Moore helped plan the first patrols to push out from the key sirbase. It is from here that several types of planes strike at military targets in North Viet Nam. So far, the Marine patrols have been conducted in hot and sticky daylight hours. But the enemy is likely to have the sleep. enemy is likely to have its sleep disturbed in the future. "We like to work at night," said the ma-jor, "That's when the Viet Cong thinks he really owns the terri-tory — and we want to show

him that he doesn't.

"We don't want to be channelised. We want to be completely unpredictable."

As Moore spoke, Marines under shelter to protect them from the sultry sun were dozing, reading, or methodically cleaning their guns. They were as relaxed as if they were in a training area.

reaxed as it they were in a training area.

The command post was situated in thick, shoulder-high scrub in which bloomed bright yellow and purple flowers.

A few feet to one side of the tent was an open bunker banked with sandbags — just in case the enemy might huri a mortar barrage. In the valley below them the ancient work of Asia went on unchanged as it had for went on unchanged as it had for centuries with black-figures, barefoot men and women and stolid buffalo tilling the fields. Moore makes no attempt to belittle the fighting quality

"They like to pull surprises, and so do we. We hope to keep them off balance," he said.

"Until now we've really been on what amounts to a ground orientation program. We've just been running snatch patrols.

"The enemy knows what we are doing. They signal our movements by beating drums, flashing mirrors from the hill-sides and by blowing whistles.

"We've had no trouble cooperating with the Vietnamese troops. We take some of them along on our patrols, and if we take prisoners let them do the talking to them."

The Marines have been well indoctrinated into the fact that this is as much a political as a military war. The patrols take along gifts of candy and school textbooks to distribute to friendly villagers.

"This is a whole new chal-

ly villagers.

"This is a whole new challenging role for us with a lot of challenging overtones," said Moore soberly. "We've always considered ourselves a shock Smart carry case. No

"It's a long-range problem,

Lippmann In The 19th

Like all men of theory, and occasional fealism, Columnist Walter Lippmann likes to appear also as a practical man of the world, who has capacities for dealing with the world as it is as well as with the world as it ought to be.

Confronted with the situation in the Dominican Republic, on top of his previous concern with the situation in Vietnam, Mr. Lippmann, in the Hartford Courant the other morning, managed the somewhat surprising feat of not being offended at all by the American power move in the Caribbean.

But, by the time he had completed his discussion, he had made his rationalization of American action in the Caribbean clear enough.

He was conceding to the United States a special sphere of influence in which it would be justified in doing whatever might ever be necessary to "insist that, within its sphere of influence, no other great power shall exercise hostile military and political force. Conceding this right to the United can Republic, Columnist Lippmann knew very well what he might be ofring to concede to somebody else.

"Experience." Mr. Lippmann wrote, "must soon verify the truth that spheres of influence are fundamental in the very nature of international society. They are as much a fact of life as are birth and death. Great powers will resist the invasion of their spheres of influence. The Soviet Union did that in Hungary. France did it recently in Gabon, the British have always done it when the Low Countries were attacked, the United States has done it in the Dominican Republic. And, if and when we want to know and face the truth how much of what China is doing is some-

thing very similar?" There it is, then. Under a sphere of influence world, Communist agitators have as little right to be in the Dominican Republic as United States soldiers have to be in Vietnam. It is as much China's right to drive us out of Vietnam as it is our right to drive agitators out

This is the realistic, hard-boiled kind of bargain Mr. Lippmann, the theorist, now sets up for us. This is the brand of consistency he would offer us in foreign policy. And he does have to get high marks for consistency.

for principle. And, in our opinion, low marks for

principle mean low marks, as well, for long range practicalities. How any one as wise and experienced

as Mr. Lippmann can live through so much contemporary history and come out with an idea that a sphere of influence world can be a world which survives is something of a puzzle.

It is the sphere of influence world which would decree the certainty of World War III.

It is difficult to imagine a folly more extreme than one which suggests that now is the time to set it up, as a pattern for the future, that the United States shall make the law for one continental complex, and Russia make the law for another, and China the law for an-

dictate that, instead, the time has arrived for the application of one kind of law, not United States, not Russian, not Chinese, but universal world law, to the question of what force shall be allowed o operate in what particular corner of the world.

True realism, we would think, would try to abandon the idea that something It would be right for us to do in the Caribbean would be wrong for us to do in Southeast Asia.

True realism, in our opinion, cannot swallow it that Communist subversion of an unfriendly government backed by us would be all right in Southeast Asia, but a criminal act in the Caribbean. If this world is to save itself from its

own anarchical powers of nuclear sell destruction, it must be through progress toward the concept that the same kind of act is wrong, no matter who commits it, whether it is committed in Southeast Asia or the Caribbean.

And it must be through conscious, deliberate progress toward a kind of law which subjects the use of national military force to international rules and
