It is known that manufacturers and sellers of idols in ancient Greece would vie for customers by including with each purchase of an idol some attractive free gift. Whether a free premium might have been a packet of incense, a bracelet or a magical potion was not really the important point -the essential meaning of the free gift to the customer was its embodiment of something beyond a mere perfunctory. mechanical sale.

This didn't mean that the merchant offering the premium of highest value automatically insured himself of the most dynamic trade. Purchasers then as now were generally strongly influenced by the intrinsic worth and price of the mer-chandise, the personality of the seller and of his market place and perhaps also by his advance advertising. The premium was a factor in a mercant's success only when all other factors in comparison with his competitors were equal in their


