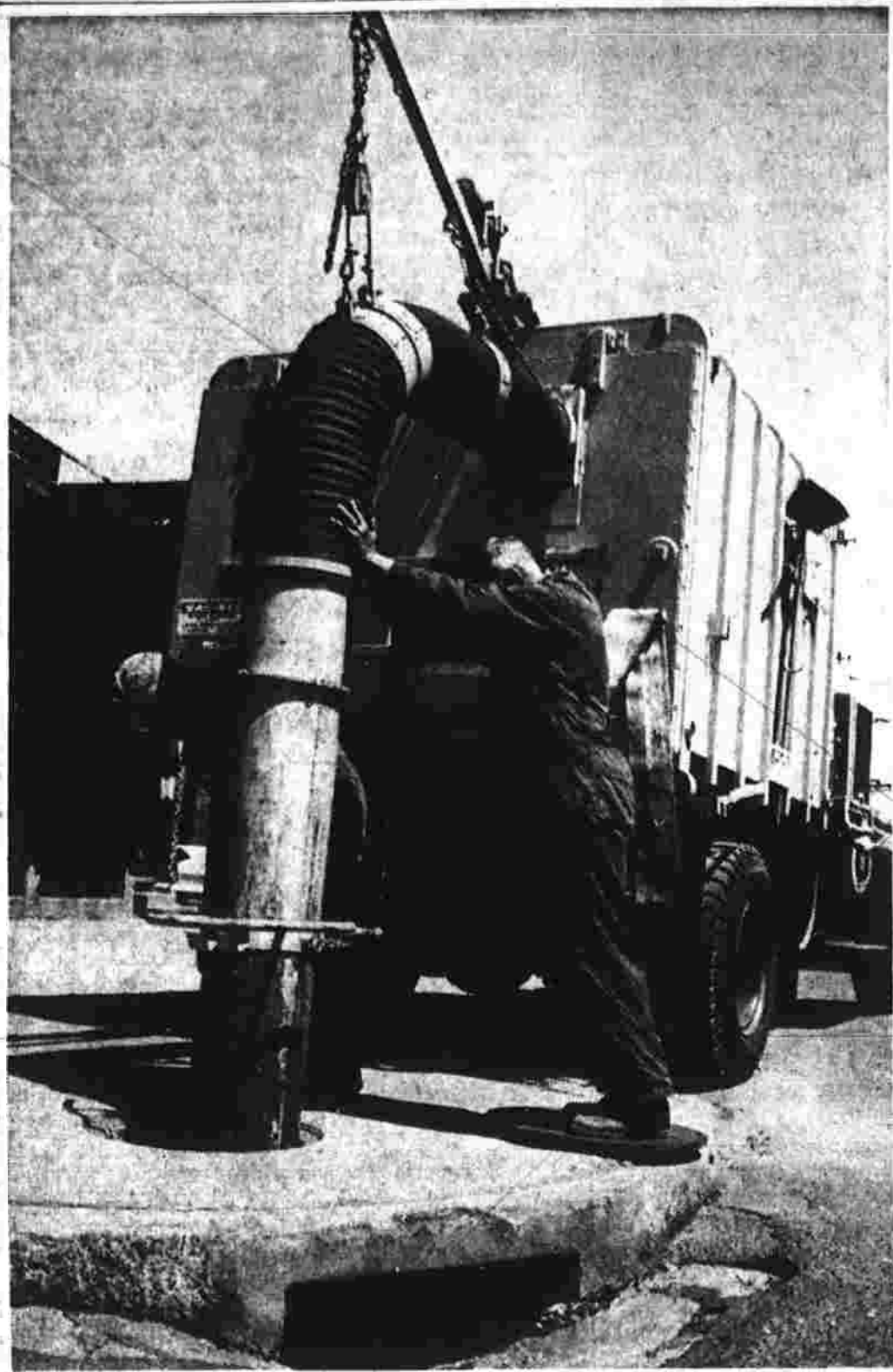

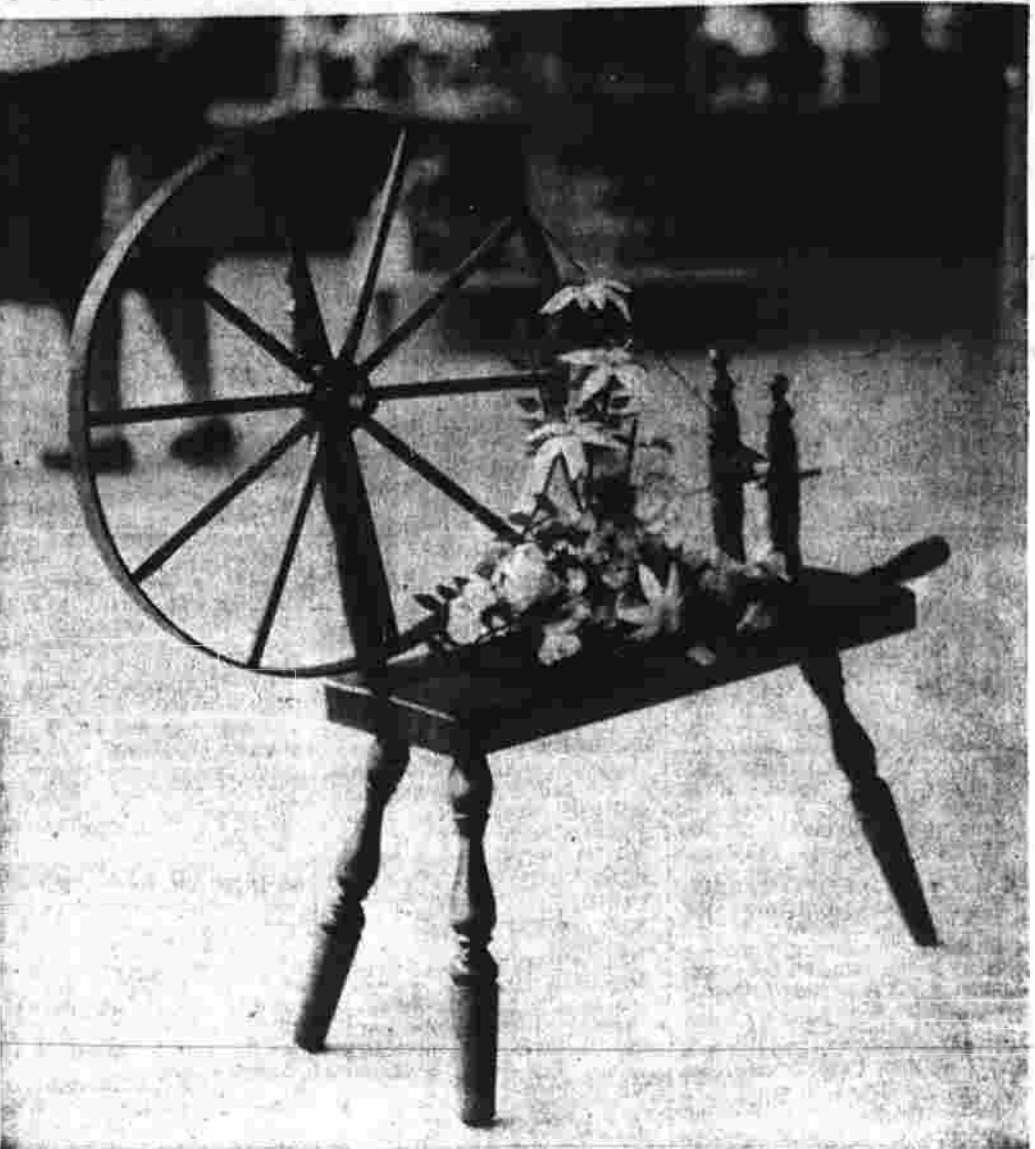

NEW YORK—(NEA)—Ronald Reagan, who has been involved in many tough struggles in his career, has just been in his biggest fight. Whether or not he won is open to question.

The Battle of Patti's Bangs is in the classic father-daughter mold. Patti Reagan is "12 going on 19," and wears her hair in the current style: Thick bangs that brush the face at mid-eyeball and the rest of the hair shoulder-length and mostly straight.

"We have been having a hell of a battle," Reagan said. "The entire household revolved around Patti's hairdo, and I finally gave in and let her have that long hair. But I think her bangs should be above the eyebrows."

None-to-Nose Conflict
The battle came to its climax when Patti was signed to appear with her father in a Borax commercial set for Death Valley Days, the 13-year-old syndicated television series of which Reagan is regular host and occasional actor.

"I am going to determine the hairdo in which she is seen in public. It got down to a sudden nose-to-nose conflict when I told her 'I dictate the hairdo or we hire an actress to do your part.'"

For the commercial, Patti's bangs just hit her eyebrows, but instead of being thick, they are slightly fringed. And so another shooting (bang-bang) war came to an uneasy truce.

Reagan, who could be a candidate for governor of California on the Republican ticket ("If the evidence in the next few months indicates that's what the party wants, I'll run") has written a book, "Where's the Rest of Me?" which details the founding of the Screen Actors Guild, the trade union strikes and an attempted Communist take-over of unions. All this in addition to biographical information.

Remembered Everything
"I have been acquainted with the publishers (Duell, Sloan and Pearce) since my days as a sports announcer in Des Moines. But it took them two years to

Astronauts Interviewed
