BOTH PARTIES AGREE ON NEW JUDGESHIPS: HARTFORD (AP) — Democrats and Republican leaders have agreed that 11 new judges should be added to the state courts.

Southern Governors Launch Attack on School Bias Law

ATLANTA, Ga. (AP) — Southern governors, in a new display of solidarity, are mounting a concerted attack on the federal school desegregation requirements under the 1964 Civil Rights Act.

At stake are millions of dollars in federal funds. School systems whose desegregation plans are rejected will lose their federal money.

Setting up the "attack on the latest federal interpretation in a meeting here last Sunday was Gov. Carl E. Sanders of Georgia. George C. Wallace of Alabama, Albert S. Harrison of Virginia, Paul B. Johnson Jr. of Mississippi, Robert McNair of South Carolina and Orval Faubus of Arkansas.

They were supported by three other governors in absentee: Dan K. Moore of North Carolina, Haydon Burns of Florida and John McKeithen of Louisiana.

A primary purpose of the meeting was to get their congressional representatives directly involved in the tough political problems and practical difficulties of the ruling from the Department of Health, Education and Welfare.

Scheduled next Tuesday in Washington is a meeting of congressmen and governors.

By making with the congressmen, the governors hope to gain some softening of the HEW rulings. The federal agency has said every school system must desegregate at least four grades next fall and submit plans for complete integration and consolidation of teaching plants for 1967.

Much of what the governors term "confusion" arises from their belief that the pace of desegregation would be slower than HEW decreed. In addition, the state leaders contend that the federal action has exceeded its legal authority because the civil rights law itself provides no minimum requirements.

The Norwegian government organ Arbeiderblad said today that the Scandinavian group called Nordtroll Rikspartiet — Nordic Reich party — has a "father" in each of the Nordic countries.

Swedish Informant, the newspaper said the Swedish KKK was formed by the neo-Nazi group in Gothenburg, Sweden, last Oct. 1. The paper said the group is active in the Gothenburg area and is linked to the German concentration camps with anti-Semitic captions.

Sweden's largest newspaper, Expressen, handed over documents and photographs to state and security police. Among them was a picture of a Klan membership card it said was issued to Bjorn Lundahl, the neo-Nazi leader. It bore the signature of "Imperial Wizard" Sherman Miller of Waco, Tex.

According to notes on the card, Lundahl had been appointed "grand dragon" of the "Aryan Knights" in the "realm of Sweden."

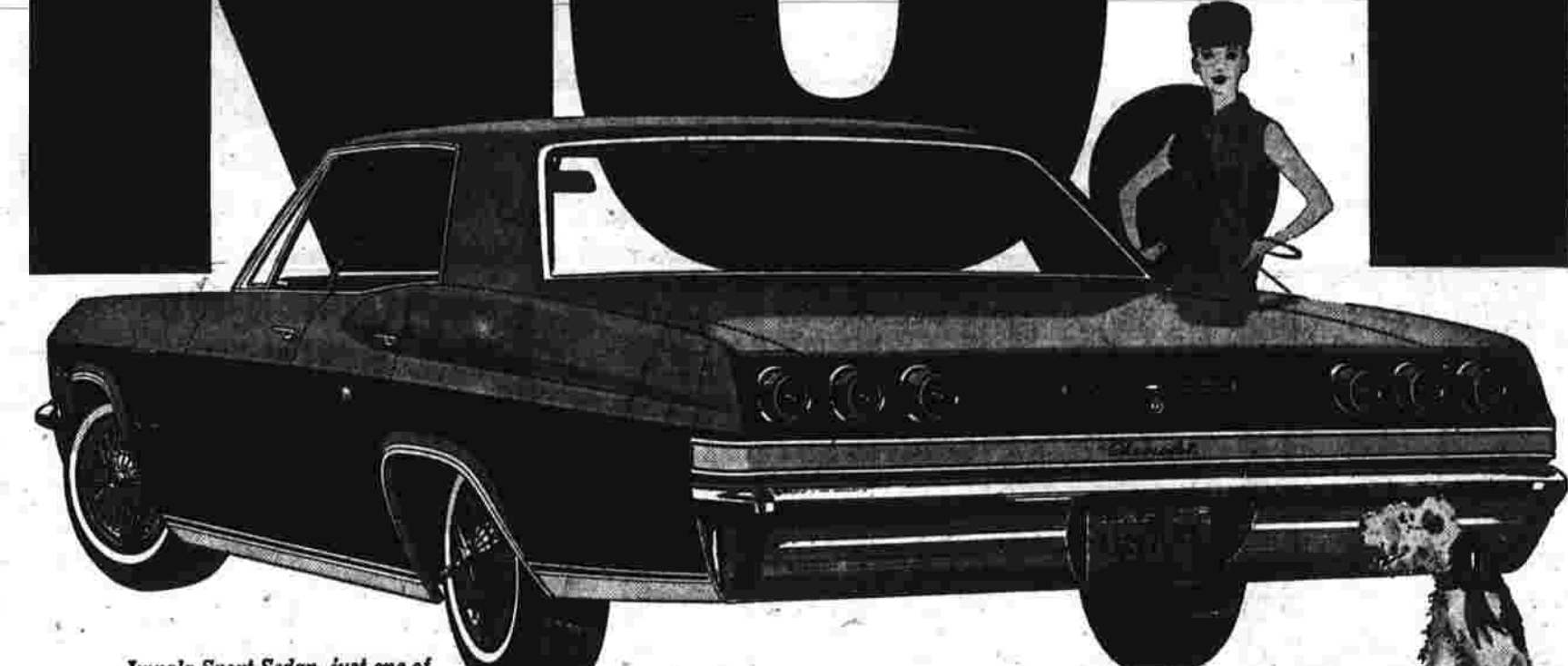

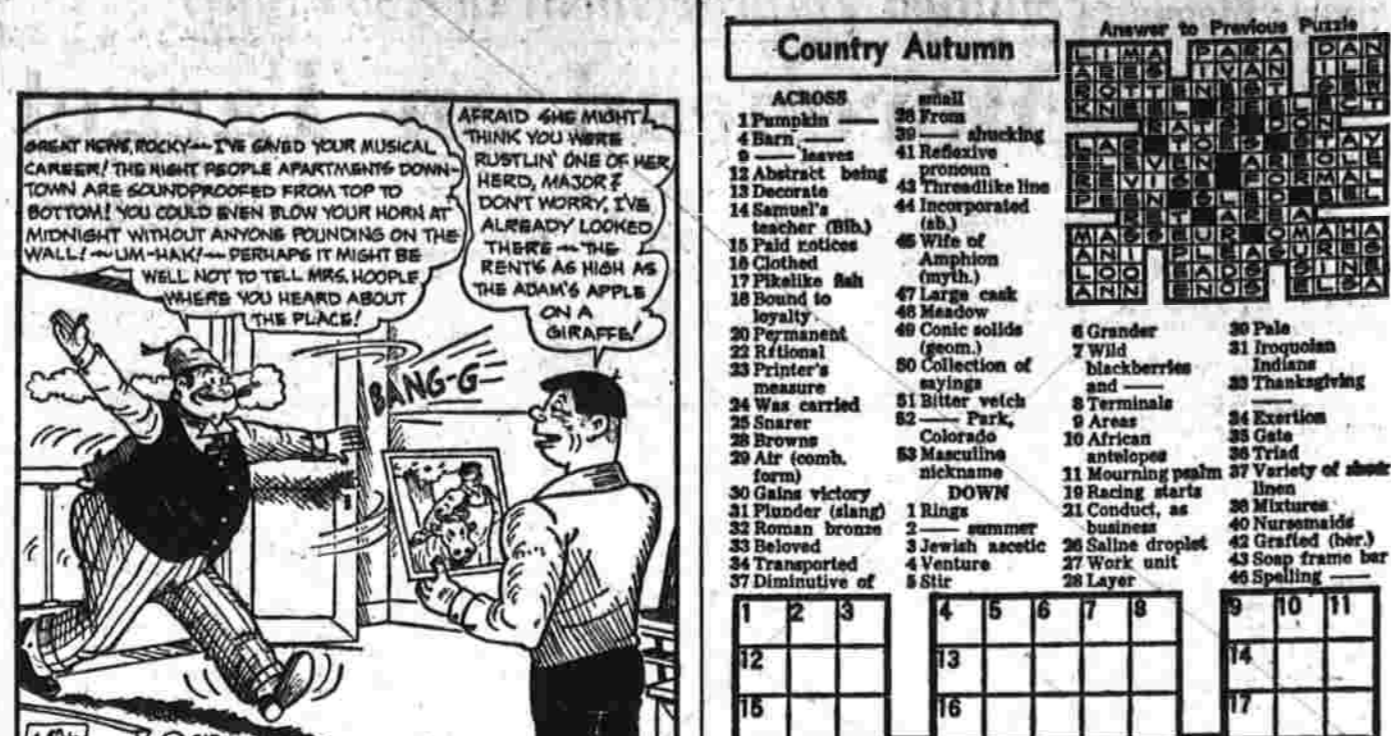
