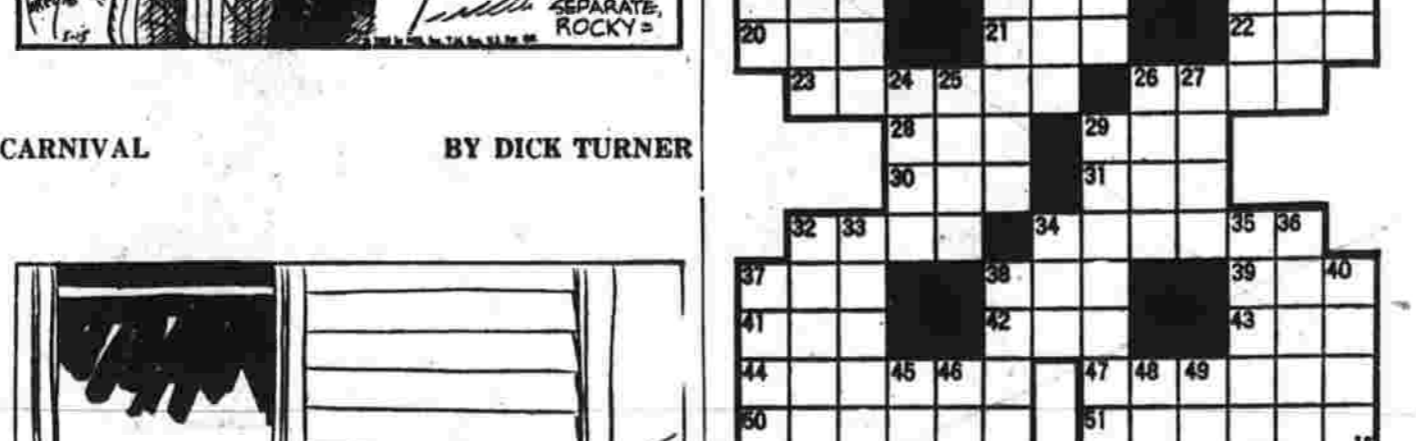

Work Wanted For Computers

WILMINGTON, Del. (AP) — The Bank of Delaware says its computers don't have enough work to do.

The bank, working with the American Bankers' Association and the American Telephone & Telegraph Co., has launched a \$50,000 two-year research project in an attempt to find some more jobs for its computers — as well as come up with some answers to other problems.

The medium-sized bank has a computer handling all its functions, but they said there still is only enough work to use the computer about one-third of the time.

The first new use being planned is the establishment of a billing service for doctors and, later, other professional men.

Bank officials also envision the day when bank customers, with the help of computers, will be able to pay all their bills by telephone. The customer would insert an identification card into his home telephone and punch in amounts he wishes charged to his account. The computer would receive this information directly, charge the customer's account and credit the account of the concern whose bill he is paying.

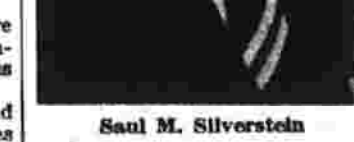

While I was doing the play, I was preparing additional television shows."

Day of Shock

"We would have one day a week off, but we would still be shaking from the days ahead of it. Sunday, the day after our show, was a day of shock. We went back to work on Monday, and sat around quarterbacking everyone else's shows. There was some good stuff then, not like today. In those days, wow, ideas were popping all over the place. By Tuesday, we would say, 'Let's stop kidding around,' and we would go to work on next Saturday's show."

"There was no time to feel sorry in those days. If a sketch didn't work, it just didn't and that was it. Sometimes, we would have to insert a new sketch the day of the show."

Spook Killed

"Once I was planning a spoof of a man who had a new television set and was so reluctant to leave it he had all the household appliances moved into the living room. Then, the day of the show, someone told me I couldn't make fun of television. 'Why are you telling me now?' I yelled. 'We sent the sketch in on Thursday, and now you tell me.' Well, we did something else that night. It took an hour and a half of constant terror to work it out, but we did."

NEW YORK — "We saw this blonde pig-tailed kid riding down the street on a bicycle. I yelled, 'Hi!' She yelled, 'Hi!' And I said, 'Stop the car!'"

This is the way George A. Heinemann, executive producer of "NBC Children's Theatre," explains how he found eight-year-old Katie Condon, of New Lebanon, N. Y., who plays one of the two leads in "Kristie," a full-hour color production to be telecast tomorrow from 6:30-7:30 p.m.

For this story, which deals with a young boy, his sister and their love for their stubborn horse, Heinemann sought out authentic farm and horse country. He found what he wanted in New York's Taconic Valley, and there he turned residents of four hamlets into actors for the story. (Only Ed Begley, the narrator, is a professional actor).

The second real-life star in "Kristie" is seven-year-old Angus Eaton, of Old Chatham, N. Y. Heinemann and his staff found Angus after talks with school personnel. "We first went to the local principals, and they in turn led us to teachers of the seven-to-eight age group," Heinemann says. "One teacher told us that Angus was the most sensitive

little boy she had in her class. We went to see him. We found out he was the son of a local high school history teacher. We went out into a field where the father was hacking down oak trees. And there was Angus, barefoot."

# The Biggest Story

**NEW YORK (AP)** — Genie Chance, wife of an Anchorage, Alaska, automobile dealer and mother of three children, had the kind of free-wheeling job every broadcast journalist dreams about.

As a regular reporter for an Anchorage radio station 14 months ago, her beat covered an area of about 15,000 square miles. She chased police cars and fire engines in Anchorage, but sometimes found herself with camera and tape recorder, aboard a crab boat en route to a remote Eskimo village; in a helicopter covering troops training for arctic warfare; in a plane with smoke jumpers fighting a 10,000-acre tundra fire.

Under such circumstances, it was ironic that Genie Chance's biggest story broke when she was riding quietly down an Anchorage street in her automobile. It was on March 27, 1964, and all of a sudden her car began to bounce.

"I thought at first it was a flat tire," she recalls. "Then I saw people running out of buildings and looking up — and buildings literally began to wave."

It was the great Alaskan earthquake. Mrs. Chance drove immediately — automatically — to the city's public safety building which was anything but safe after the quake and using the broadcasting equipment in her automobile remained on duty continuously for 59 hours. She sent out news to a city and countryside whose telephone communications were cut by disaster, organized ham radio operators, gathered rescue information, reunited separated families and helped set up public shelters and rescue teams.

In recognition of her level-headed marathon, Texas-born Mrs. Chance recently was given the top "Golden Mike" award of a national women's magazine McCalls which included her first trip to New York City.

# Old Package, New Cover For Summer

**NEW YORK (AP)** — Network television's sleepy season arrived Tuesday night with a traditional harbinger—the premier of what the publicists call a "summer series" and the trade calls a "package deal."

To viewers with long memories, NBC's "Cloak of Mystery" was an old package in a new wrapping. It was a half-hour program starring Simone Signoret and Lee Marvin which this viewer remembers vaguely from five seasons back.

Non-memorable dramatic entertainment is quickly forgotten and this little suspense tale was a frail bark when new. However, it is always interesting to watch Miss Signoret.

Within a couple of weeks, most evening television will consist of reruns from the past season and other seasons before that. These oft-told tales pop up like dandelions in warm weather because it is less expensive to make 30-odd episodes a year than 52 and be-

cause people are reputed to watch less television when the outdoor calls.

Audience sampling services each year report a marked drop in audience size during warm weather, but some researchers believe the decline is becoming less each year as more homes install air conditioners and ways are found to research viewing habits of guests in hotels, motels and other summer resorts.
