### The Press In Santo Domingo

We doubt that the operation of a free press has ever been more annoying to hose in authority and in charge of polfcy than it has been in the past few weeks in the Dominican Republic. For it has been largely the reporting and photographing of facts, in the Dominican situation, which has given the American people and the world a dismayingly realistic appraisal of the lack of consistency, authenticity, and simple

veracity in American official policy as it

has been expounded by its highest offi-

cial sources. The result of this exposure has been so damaging to the prestige and reputation of the very highest official, so regrettable in the disillusion and enmity it will help confirm among all the people south of our border, and, finally, o devilishly convenient for Communist propagandists everywhere, that there will be some who will undoubtedly sympathize with that highest official who would, at this moment in history, probably like to suspend the free press for the duration of the Dominican

But there is one thing even more reoperation of the free press may help do. It is regrettable that there should be conduct and policy which cannot stand up better under the exposure of the trained reporter and the recording cam-

The deepest tragedy is that there should come from Washington claims and accounts of which investigation on the scene makes a mockery.

But the chance that, if we have our eyes open, and facts are brought before them, the American people and people everywhere might be able to achieve some slight effort to cut down on the amount of impulse buying of confusion and disaster which has been going on, is a chance which may be all the chance there is. For that small but great favor, of having such a chance offered, of being able to see, for one moment in one instance at least, things as they really are, the operation of the free press has been responsible.

The New York police system is in rouble again, this time because it kept an innocent woman in jail for 20 days. The woman in question was arrested an a tip from one of her own neighbors. who told police she was peddling narotics. When she was arraigned, ball was set at \$25, a sum which she could t produce. When arrested, she had her some white powder, in papers hich was sent to the laboratory for nalysis. Five days later the laboratory overed the powder was harmless, apparently made some effort so to

report back to authorities. But the re port was somehow never received; the woman stayed in jall for 20 days until her case came up again. In court, the case was dismissed. The District Attorhey gave the woman \$75 out of his own pocket to smooth her entrance back into the world. The drama of her story was enhanced by the fact that she was pregnant. There is now to be a full investigation of just how all this could

some tendency on the part of the public to assume that the police are wrong again. That is a dangerous tendency, and this could be one of the cases where it should be avoided. Certainly there is no excuse for a lax-

ness of procedure which could keep the results of chemical analysis from getting back to the proper authorities. But police were dealing with a character not unknown to their previous records, and they were dealing with papers containing a white powder which looked like narcotics, and the subtle, complicated point to be kept in mind is that sometimes fake narcotics are put in circulation without the knowledge of the pusher who may be carrying or selling them. In other words, the woman who has now technically been proved innocent may have thought herself guilty at the time of her arrest. The analysis might have surprised her as well as the police.

It will be interesting to see what New York's final opinion and verdict turn out to be. But it can be stated as a general premise that, while one can find an occasional mistake among thousands of police cases, there can also be an occasional instance in which the police haven't been so far off the mark even when circumstances seemed to construct a case against them.

### The Latest Version

more revision of Russian history is now taking place, in recognition of the departure of Khrushchev. And one of the changes everybody notices instantly is that some degree of respectability is being restored to Stalin.

The way in which this is being done, however, suggests reassurance rather than alarm. For what is now taking place seems to be what the new Russian leadership itself proclaims it to be -a more rational, scientific, objective approach to history to replace what the new leadership calls the "subjectivism" of the Khrushchev era. Or, to put it in human terms, Khrush-

chev sought to achieve his healthy deards of Stalinism by destroying the memory of Stalin entirely. But the new regime is trying to be more mature and sophisticated. It is trying to concede that Stalin, faults and all, did play a role in history, and did stand, perhaps not without influence and effectiveness, as the leader of the country during World War II. The new regime does not consider it necessary to pretend that Stalin never existed, except as some sort of complete devil.

Khrushchev, for his part, had intentions which seemed good enough, but inherited and borrowed from Stalin himself the techniques he used to discredit Stalin. The result was that his history of Stalin was not much better than Stalin's history of Trotzky. Such criticism is not to detract from Khrushchev's courage and good sense in daring to try to liberate his Russia

The president appeared on a film shown by a representative from his Council on Physical Pitness, Robert Stewart. In it, he included the whole nation, all people of all ages, in a constant effort to keep physically fit.

"A nation is only as strong as its people," the President said. "The future belongs to the fit."

The fifth graders performed fmore specific acts requiring comperation and competition. Dr. Ruth V. Byler, a physical education consultant for the State Department of Education, noted that in these games and exercises were question various.
