#### That White House Silence

If Americans in the past two weeks have been dimly conscious that one par-Mcular set of nerve ends was getting a kind of rest, Arthur Krock in the New York Times has pin-pointed the reason. The President of the United States has, for these two weeks, kept himself pretty much out of the public eye. His ast public speech was made May 13; he has been off television; he has been out of the news broadcasts; his voice has not been heard; he himself has not been seen.

But the President has, all the while, reports Krock, been as busy as usual, trying in quieter ways to accomplish what he was trying to accomplish by that great torrent of attempted public persuasion he was indulging himself in up to two weeks ago.

The contrast is, then, one of mode and style of operation, between the present attitude of restraint and self control on the part of the White House, and the incessant approach to the eyes and ears of the world which preceded it. The surface impression has been an

The personality and mood the President exhibited in these performances were not impressively reassuring. These surface impressions, when coupled with equally incessant gossip reports of the White House moods and modes the public did not see, created a

basic national uneasiness, The absence of all this has been sort of blessing. One hopes-but cannot garner from

Mr. Krock's own suppositions—that the interval has been one in which the President has reworked some of his own thinking, and perhaps broadened his own sources of information and advice. One hopes that, during this self-imposed restraint, there has been some presidential disposition to review some of the possibly hasty and impulsive premises which had, during the period of perhaps too much talk from the

White House, come out in the form of no-limit commitments to policies which conceivably may never work. To know that deliberative responsibil ity may have come back to the White House, the world needs something more than silence, blessed relief though it may seem. It needs a demonstration that public speech and argument, when they are resumed, reflect coherent policies,

based on a proper relationship of reliable

fact and information to the fundamental principles of this nation's being. The nation, and the world, could stand a definite assurance that the President has really come back from his interval of being what he himself, during the campaign last summer and fall, said Goldwater was.
