There certainly is a gulf of misunderstanding if Secretary Rusk, using such words, does not really realize that we have been the ones, since February, who have been claiming the right to have a larger war in Southeast Asia "with impunity" and that we have been the ones theorizing that such a larger war would produce a decision "with impunity". It is always, of course, a nice effort to accuse the other fellow of doing what you yourself are doing, and then to deny him the right to do it. It is, perhaps, really the morality and purpose of all war.

But when, yesterday, Secretary Rusk again and again used the word "morality" in connection with reports of Russian commitment to the defense of North Vietnam, let us hope that he was not merely calling upon Russia to realize the gravity of the situation. It is not merely people "on the other side" who need to understand the seriousness of the situation. People and policy makers on this side need to realize it too, and they need to try to make sure that they are not themselves setting things up so that the other side has no choice, no matter how seriously and soberly they view the consequences.

South Windsor Tax Rate Reduced One-half Mill to 33.5

A tax rate of 33.5 mills was approved by the town council last night for the 1965-66 fiscal year. This is a one-half mill decrease over the present 34-mill tax rate.

The tax rate will finance the combined budgets of the board of education and general government for the fiscal year starting July 1, 1965 through June 30, 1966.

Mayor John Egan noted that in January of this year the council entered into deliberations on the budget. He said the council and citizens expected considerable time and energy in facing the tax rate.

"This" Mayor Egan stated, "is a step to get on a pay-as-you-go plan. The town will be able to pay for some of the capital improvements in cash and not put down on interest payments."

Mayor Egan said that although the budgets do not meet every need and desire they do meet the town's need for services and he commended the town council on its dedication and sincere interest.

Councilman James Thorne said that some one million dollars more on automobiles in the grand list was realized than anticipated. He said that many taxpayers will have an increase in their taxes due to assessment and that the town is still at an 80 per cent assessment figure.

Thorne stated the most important thing in setting the mill rate is keeping in line with the surrounding towns. He said the tax rate should be the same or lower so the town can pay its businesses. It is faculty responsible.

The new tax rate was set on a total town budget of \$3,331,400. The board of education budget of \$2,045,000 and the general government budget \$1,286,400. Some \$30,000 has been put away for capital improvements.

Estimated revenue and the general fund amounts to \$774,850. On the basis of the town's new \$77,000 grand list resulting from the recent reassessment or a value of \$2,054,821 over what was anticipated, the town will be required by taxation to \$2,557,041.

The item of leasing the town-owned lot at Spring Pond Park was tabled until the next council meeting.

## Events in World

**LONDON (AP)**—Britain's Labour government accepted the resignation of James Callaghan moved for adjournment of the session in the House of Commons early today by only one vote.

When all members are present, the Labourites have a three-vote margin. But a number of members were absent for the session Wednesday night.

Throughout the night the government won a series of votes on changes in its omnibus Finance Bill by razor-edge margins. Finally the margin dropped to one vote—153-152.

**LA PAZ, Bolivia (AP)**—The ruling military junta has restored its armed forces commander to the presidency of Bolivia following his negotiation of the truce that ended a week of bloody fighting between the army and rebellious tin miners.

Gen. Alfredo Ovando returned to the post he shared briefly with Lt. Gen. Rene Barrientos last November after the overthrow of President Victor Paz Estensabor. Public demonstrations forced Ovando to step down, leaving Barrientos in the presidency.

The fighting broke out after a general strike that nearly paralyzed the country and an attempt by the army to occupy the mines. A few mines resumed work Wednesday, but most of them were still idle.

The truce ended most of the fighting, but miners were said to have fired on an army post Wednesday near Calavi, 280 miles south of La Paz.

**NEW DELHI, India (AP)**—India marked the first anniversary today of Jawaharlal Nehru's death with pre-dawn mourning ceremonies and tearful eulogies.

They remain many problems and the "unspeakable" poverty of the Indian masses, the national newspaper The Statesman said in an editorial.

Nehru's successor, Prime Minister Lal Bahadur Shastri, and President Sarvepalli Radhakrishnan laid wreaths on Nehru's funeral pyre on the banks of the holy Ganges River outside New Delhi.

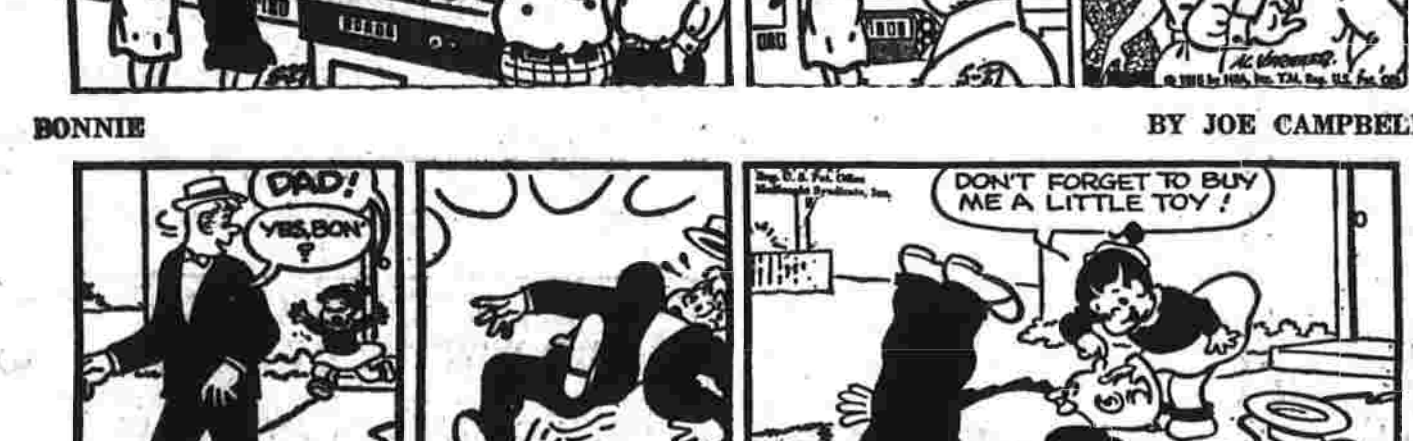

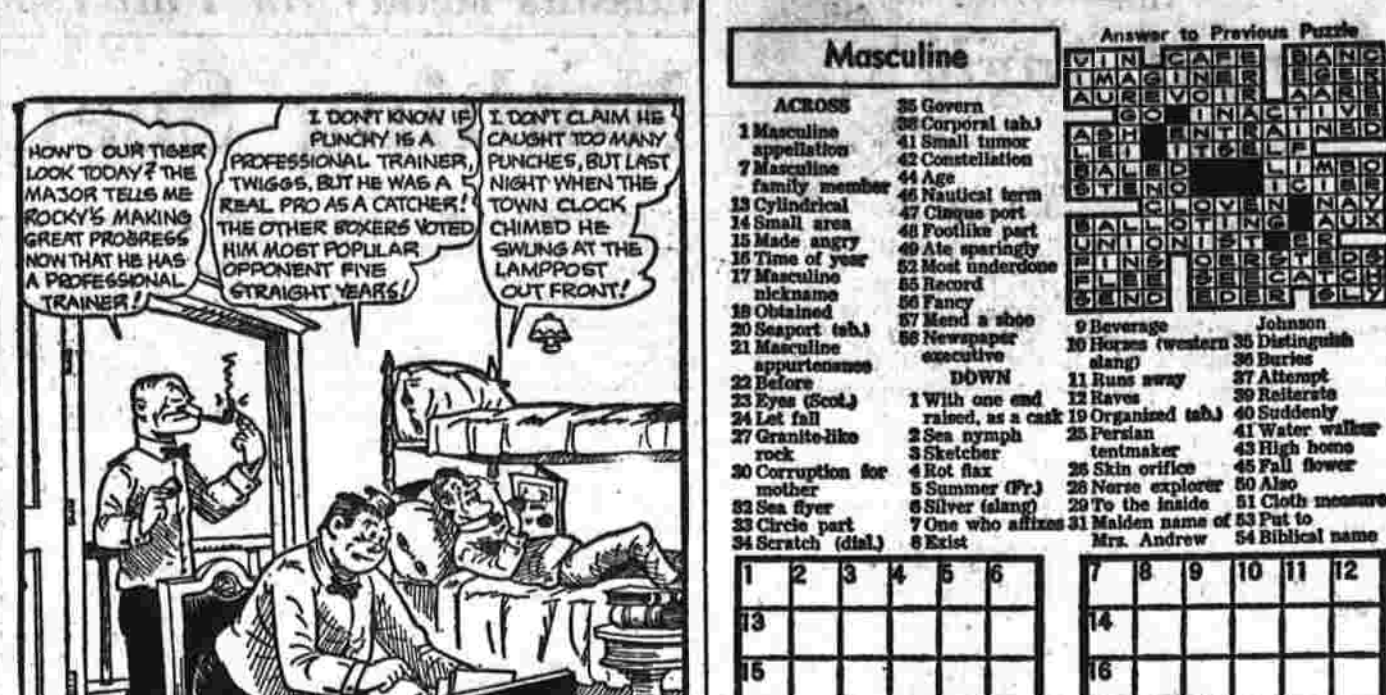

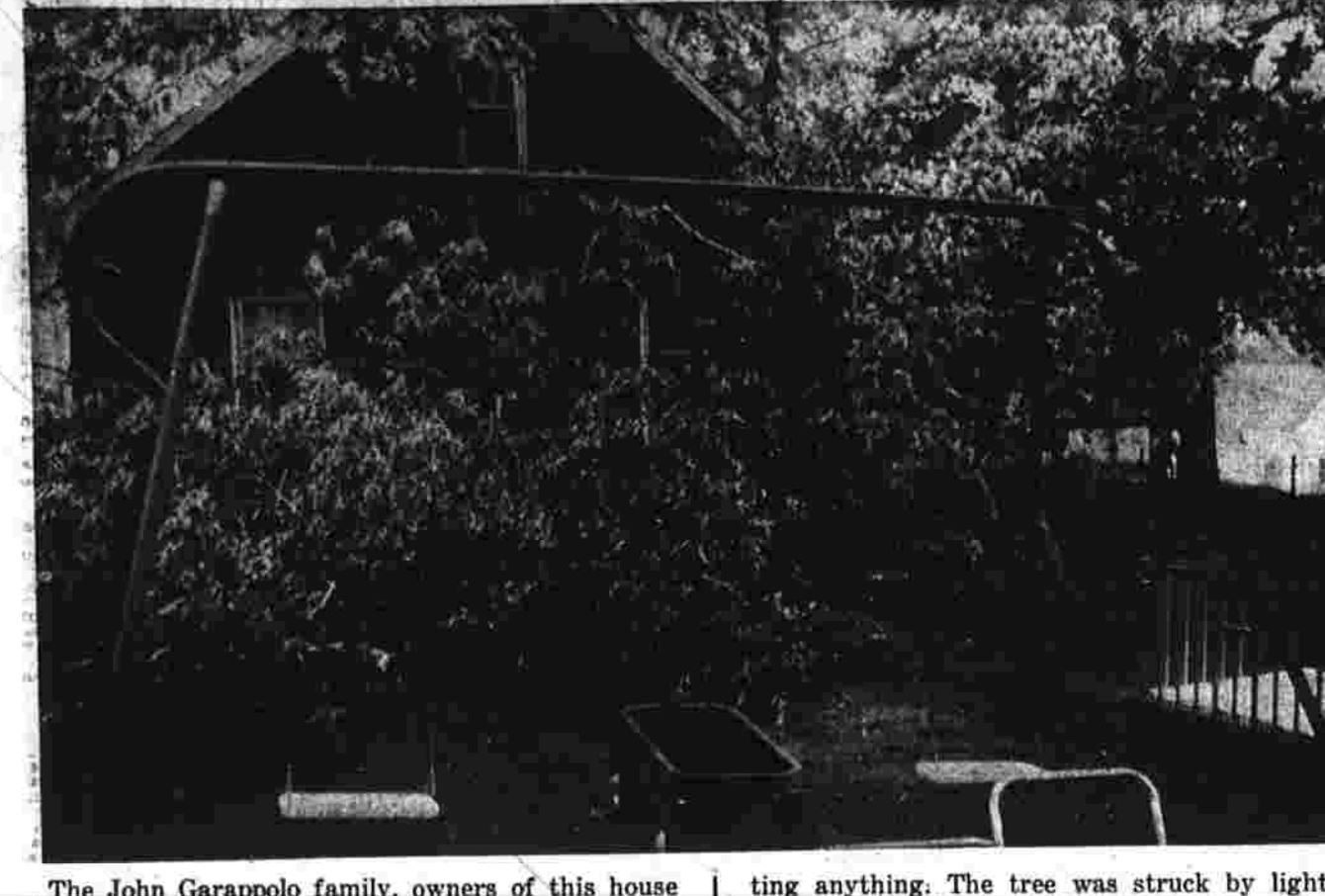
