### Thousands in Viet Nam Disfigured by Warfare

WASHINGTON (AP)—Thousands of South Vietnamese are badly disfigured by gunshot and burn wounds they'll never be able to lead useful lives, says an American plastic surgeon who recently returned from the stricken land.

Only four Vietnamese plastic surgeons are available in that country of 14 million people, a severe shortage that represents a national tragedy, said Dr. Richard B. Stark, chief of plastic surgery at St. Luke's Hospital, New York.

Stark returned recently from Saigon after spending a month training and assisting the four Vietnamese plastic surgeons who have, he said, a desperate task of treating casualty cases that include civilians and soldiers. Stark was an emissary of MEDICO, a nongovernmental medical group that provides aid in underprivileged areas of the world.

"Many of them (the victims) need 50 to 60 operations in order to be salvaged," said the doctor in a report to MEDICO. The report was made available to a reporter by CARE Inc., which is

holding a world conference in MEDICO is a service of CARE.

"Based on U.S. experience in World War II and the Korean War," the report said, "it would take 10 years to perform the amount of reconstructive surgery needed to restore these people."

"MEDICO has made an important first step in tackling the problem," he said, adding that he and seven other American plastic surgeons led and operated under a program "tailor-made to upgrade the Vietnamese surgeons."

But plastic surgery is not the only medical deficiency in the area, he said.

"South Viet Nam," Stark said, "is a medical jungle. Six doctors tell just part of the story. There are only 700 phys-

icians in the entire country. However, 600 of these are serving up to 30 years in the armed forces. That leaves 300 physicians who must care for the civilian population of 14 million.

"The casualties pouring into Saigon's crowded hospitals today from the country's battle fields are double what they were on my first visit in February 1964. More than 600 weekly are aged by helicopter to the Chuoi Hoa and Cho Ray hospitals. These casualties include civilians as well as military. I did some 38 operations (in February) as my Vietnamese colleagues looked on."

The doctor said a new phase of the plastic surgery and other surgery training program is under way with the cooperation of St. Luke's Hospital.

provide the way for Vietnamese surgeons to train in U.S. hospitals under approved internship and residency programs.

"Inadequate training in Saigon's medical school has kept its graduates from passing U.S. examinations for foreign internships. To qualify them for the house staffs of American hospitals, St. Luke's has inaugurated a unique education effort."

The program, he related, involves preparation of tape-recorded lectures at St. Luke's, recorded material in all of the major surgical services. The recordings are then played for the young Vietnamese doctors at the Saigon medical facility.

### Canada Outdoes U.S. in Trade

### U.S. Planes Crash Over Viet Base

On May 18 a series of explosions smashed through lines of U.S. and Vietnamese bombers at the other side of the Bien Hoa military base in South Vietnam, killing more than 100 U.S. officials and at least one American, but an investigation is still under way.

The U.S. and Vietnamese air forces planes pounded three radar sites and one ferry in North Viet Nam with bombs and rockets today, Heavy antiaircraft fire was reported from the area.

A spokesman said, but all planes returned to their bases.

"Twelve U.S. Thunderbolt fighters were shot down in the area, located about 10 miles offshore 120 miles north of the base," the spokesman said. "A B-57 bomber was shot down and heavy damage was inflicted to both sites, but the smoke and fire in the area prevented further damage assessments."

The B-57 radar site had been hit before.

The U.S. and Vietnamese Skylanders supported by U.S. planes struck the Quang River facility on the Quang River. Pilots reported heavy damage to the north site. No more than 100 bombs were dropped.

Attacking with mortars and rockets, Viet Cong forces overran a government outpost in the area. The Viet Cong killed 24 regional force troops and wounded 12.

A U.S. military spokesman said an unknown number of regional force troops were killed in the attack on the outpost at Quang River.

Party Viet Cong were reported to have captured 100 prisoners in Phnom Dui Province 90 miles southeast of Saigon. The operation continued today. Government forces reported 100 prisoners killed, 20 wounded and 2 U.S. Army advisers killed and 1 captured.

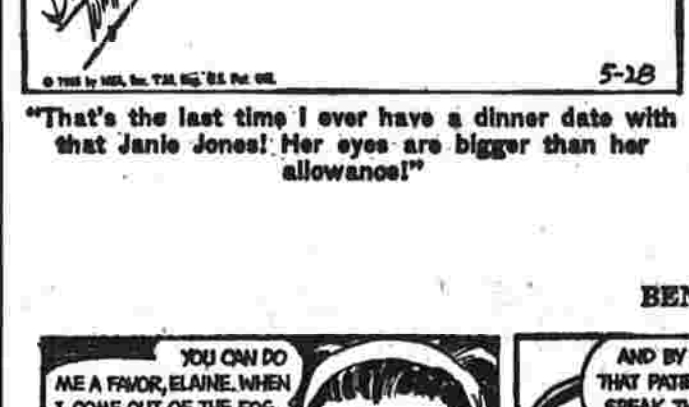
