Viet Ground Fight Boosts Casualties

SAIGON, South Viet Nam (AP)—Heavy ground fighting continued across South Viet Nam today and government casualties for today and Thursday rose to at least 239 killed, missing or wounded. Vietnamese forces fought a day-long battle Thursday trying to break out of a guerrilla unit at Cai Lay, about 100 miles southeast of Saigon. Casualties in the first ambush of a six-vehicle convoy Thursday totaled 15 government troops killed, 15 wounded and 15 missing. Two armoured cars were destroyed, two trucks damaged and two machine guns lost. Communist losses were not reported. A relief force sent in a few hours later was hit about seven miles northeast of the first action. The government losses in this engagement were nine killed and 14 wounded. Communist and artillery fire finally routed the guerrillas. Another ambush occurred near Kontum about 285 miles northeast of Saigon, where a six-truck convoy was on a food pickup mission. A military spokesman said five trucks and 12 Vietnamese killed and missing. There were no reports of Communist losses. In the Mekong River delta, (See Page Six)

Space Capsule Back To Original Schedule HOUSTON, Tex. (AP)—Astronauts James A. McDivitt and Edward H. White II whirled into the second day of their marathon space mission today, their spirits high and their flight plan back on schedule after some hectic early hours during which White took a celestial stroll. The Mission Control Center said everything appeared favorable for the Gemini 4 spacecraft to complete its full 77-hour, 30-minute mission. If there are no hitches, America's longest manned space flight will end at 12:20 p.m. EST Monday with a parachute landing in the Atlantic Ocean 400 miles southwest of Bermuda. During a pass over the Houston control center on the 14th orbit today, White told capsule communicator Virgil I. Grissom that he was ready to attempt a spacewalk. "I'd like to get out of the capsule," he said. "I'd like to see the Earth from the outside."

White described the "vivid blue" waters of the Gulf of Mexico and the Caribbean. He said he clearly saw Houston, Galveston Bay and even Clear Lake, 20 miles away. The departure of the Marines leaves 14,300 U.S. paratroopers serving with 13th Airborne Commando troops in the Inter-American Force. Peace negotiators of the Organization of American States continue talks with rebel and junta leaders. The stalemate in the capital was reflected in the fierce Chaco Valley, the nation's best farming region and the area in which are located the second and third largest cities, Santiago and San Francisco de Macoris. Police and army units on the Chaco are loyal to the junta. But even pro-junta officials concede that the majority of the people favor the junta. Astronauts Log Space Walk Crowns Early Gemini Orbits

HOUSTON, Tex. (AP)—Astronaut Edward H. White's spectacular 20-minute space hike highlighted the first day of the Gemini 4 flight. White began his space walk during the third orbit and returned to the spacecraft as it approached the night side of the earth after soaring over the North American continent. Plans for command pilot James McDivitt to rendezvous with the second booster stage were canceled because McDivitt said he was using more fuel than expected to maneuver the spacecraft. Over Hawaii on the third revolution, McDivitt reported at 2:42 p.m. EST that White had opened the hatch and was standing up three minutes later. Mission control reported that White was walking in space. The astronauts chatted during the space walk and McDivitt took several pictures of White outside the spacecraft. White was ordered back into the spacecraft. "We have 3 1/2 days to go, buddy," McDivitt said. "I'm coming," White replied. 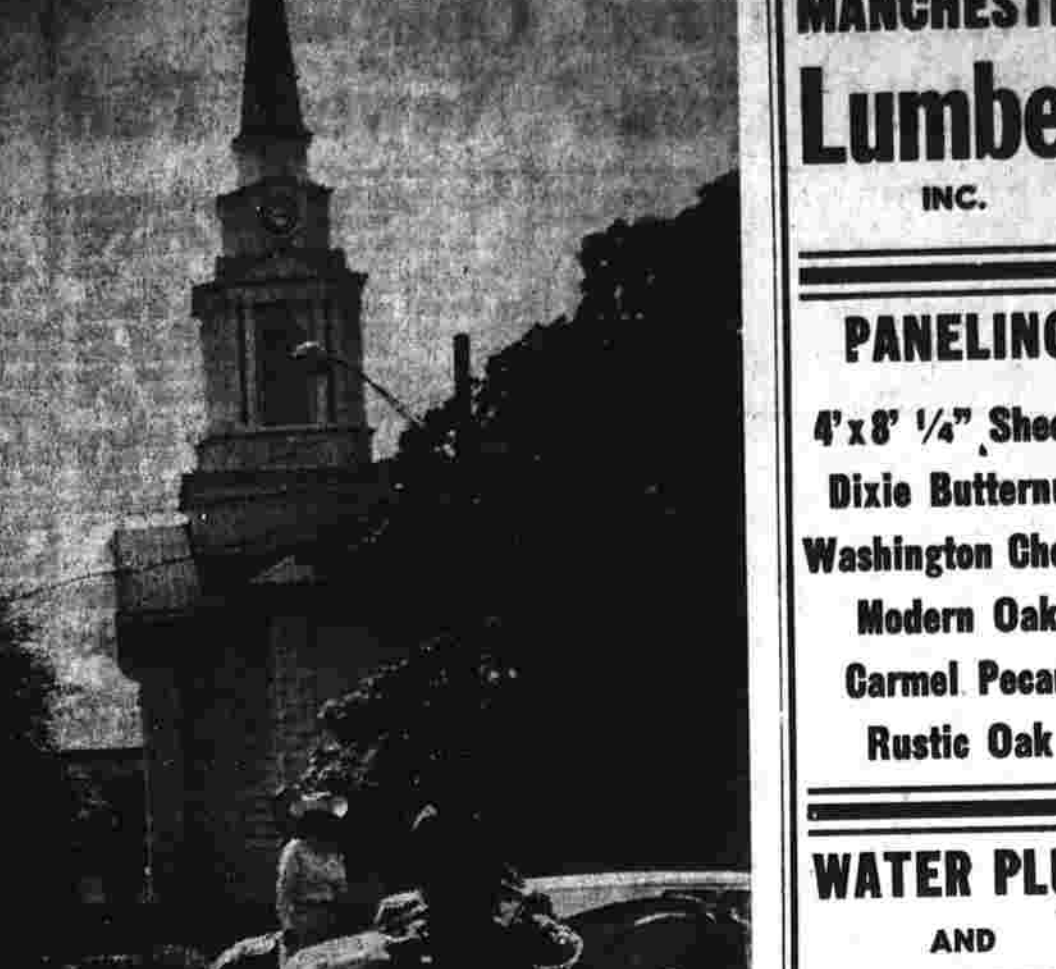

We were talking with our family physician the other day, and the subject of our conversation turned to the little labels you see on your prescription. "Sometimes I wonder," the doctor said, "if people know how important it is to follow those directions—particularly to take all the medication."

So often, he said, a patient will come to him for help, receive a prescription, have it filled by the pharmacist, take a little medicine, get some relief—and then let the bottle or box lie in the medicine cabinet. With a bacterial infection, this half-medication is not only false economy—it's asking for trouble. Just because you can't feel the pain any longer or see the inflammation doesn't mean that you have given your doctor's prescription a chance to do its full work for you. Infection can be deep-seated. Half-medication only gives the infection time for a counter-attack.

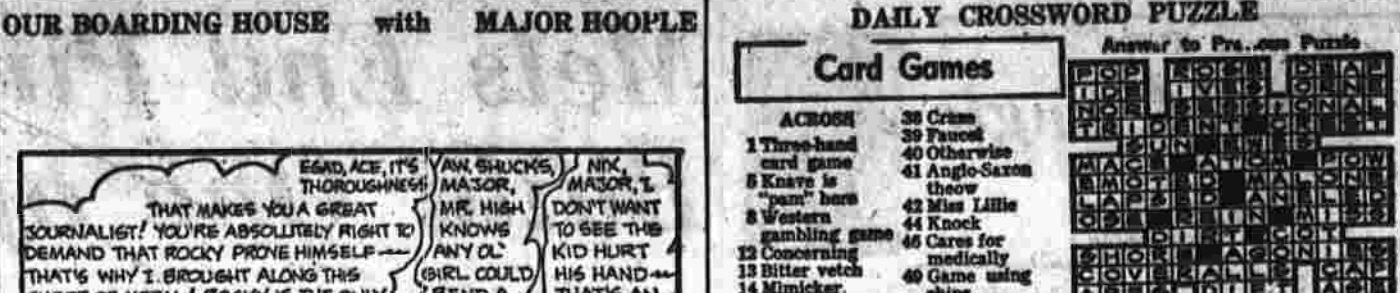

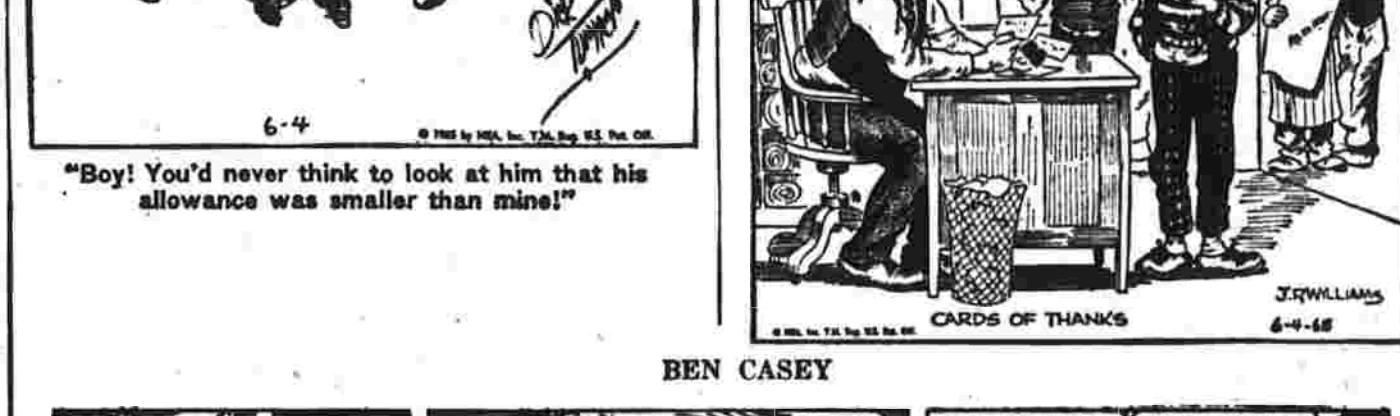
