Dirt And Thirst?

maneuvers being indulged in by New York City's Water Commissioner D'Angelo provide a rather handy index to the continuing seriousness of the water situation everywhere

Not having accomplished much with his plan for turning off fountains, even when they were fountains which resirculated the same water all summer long, Commissioner D'Angelo is now asking some 60,000 commercial establishments in New York City to turn on their air conditioners an hour and a half later than usual in the morning and turn them off an hour and a half arrier at night. This, it is estimated, could save the City as many as 20 mil-

lion gallons of water a day. What Commissioner D'Angelo afraid of, if he doesn't get New York to save some water, and if the real rains don't come, is a real water famine, in which his millions of people might be lorced to try to get along without the

decent life.

Anyway, it is handy to keep your myes on New York City, for it is there, in the very largest community, that the water shortage may strike first.

The shortage will, if it continues, hit first at the very biggest. It will skip around among middle-sized communities. And then it will hit hard again at the very smallest community, that of the one family using one well of its own. The low level of the reservoirs which have not come up for the big cities is comparable to the deficiency in the water table underneath all the individual wells of the Eastern seaboard. The one shortage can be seen; the other is hidden; but rains such as we have had recently, blessed as they were for giving a new lease on life to the green, have made no fundamental or measurable contribution to either kind of shortage. To the contrary, the short supplies with which reservoirs and water tables entered the spring have now begun to be depieted nore and more. It will take much more than a rain a week to reverse

Unless the weather performs mirasles, there are dirt and thirst shead. The real truth is this: that anybody. anywhere, who uses, from any source whatever, water it is not necessary to use is running the risk of creating the day when none of us has water for anything. Resources would not have to mink very much for us all to realize that we are all piped into the same basic.

Moscoso, in a letter to the New York fimes, emphasized the inevitable revointionary desires of ordinary people and moderate political leadership south of our border, and said that the "quick and easy way to steer Latin America into anti-United States postures" is for us to "misunderstand, resent and unwisely resist" this instinct. He was able, unfortunately, to illustrate from events in the Dominican Re-

people should be free to decide their own fate" and then proceeds "to tell the Dominicans what they should want and what is good for them. And to apply U.S. standards of extremism to Latin America, where most societies are polarized between the elite and the masses and where social tensions are high, is to misunderstand present events. In many a Latin-American country the equivalent of the John Birch Society is not the hinatic fringe, but a powerful influence in or on the

We are, wrote Moscoso, "close to giving the O.A.S. the kiss of death. We are embracing and pressing it so hard to do our work that it is rapidly losing whatever effectiveness and stature it had as a regional group in which the interests of all member states are represented and distilled into genuinely

Moscoso, sadly, has no easy formula for a way out of the particular mess in Dominica. Viet Cong

Nam (AP) - Vietnamese troops battled tonight to drive off some 1.500 Viet Cong who overran the district capital of Dong Xoai and engulfed a nearby U.S. camp, killing 14 Americans and wounding at least 13, A U.S. military spokesmar said the losses at Dong Xoal, 60 miles north of Saigon, were the heaviest suffered by the United States in a single engagement of the Vietnamese war, A U.S. Navy fighter-bomber plunged into a ridge and the pilot was apparently killed as U.S. Air Force and Navy planes pounded a wide range of targets The number of Americans killed in combat since December 1961 rose to 420. The camp at Dong Xoai was fled to a district compound where hard-pressed government troops were holed up.

Vietnamese casualties were not known in Saigon, but they were presumed to be high. About 300 Vietnamese irregular were believed to be Navy Seaair strip at the camp. U.S. planes and helicopters
