NEW YORK (AP) — Mayor Robert F. Wagner's decision not to seek a fourth term touched off a scramble for the Democratic mayoral nomination to-day and promised to have national political repercussions in both parties.

The decision Thursday, which the three-term mayor said was made after a long and arduous process, could produce some political pressure on the national level for the selection and financing of a powerful Democratic opponent to Republican Rep. John V. Lindsay in the Nov. 2 election.

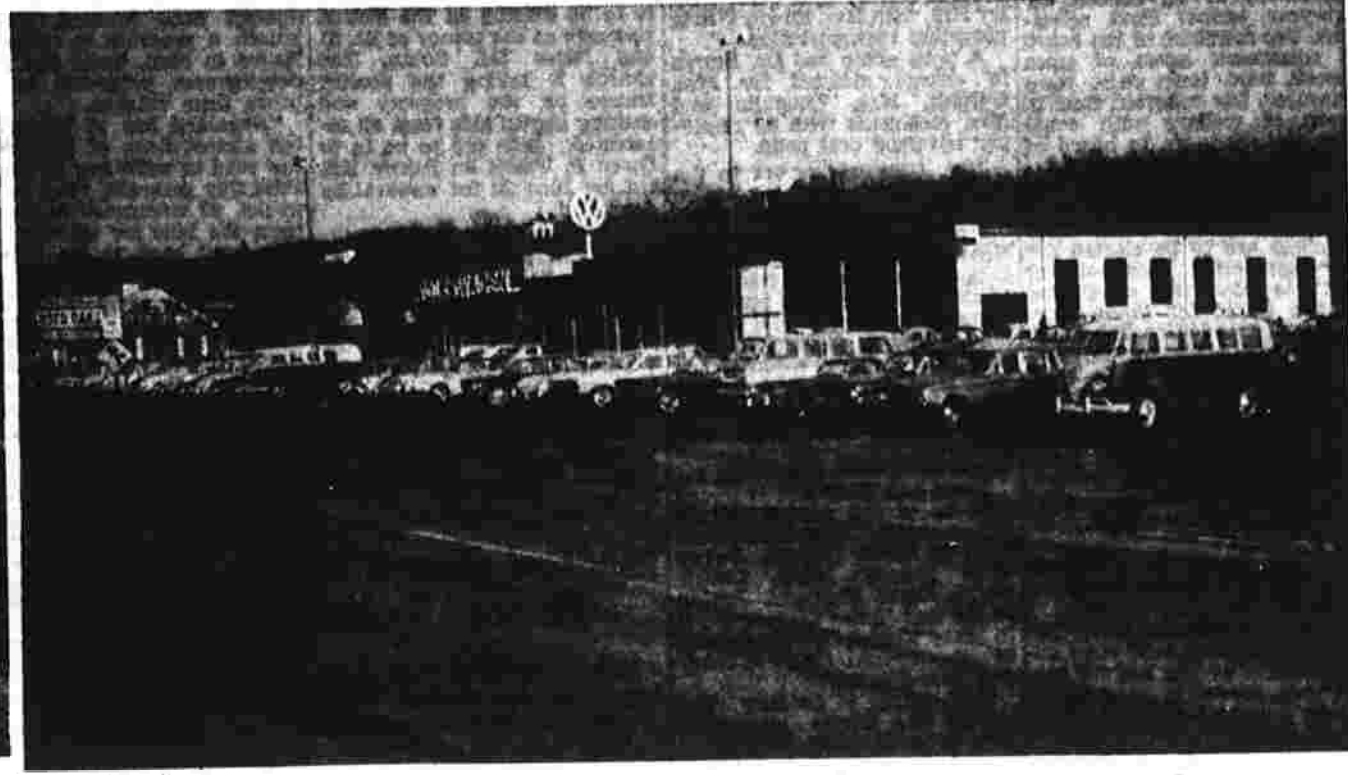
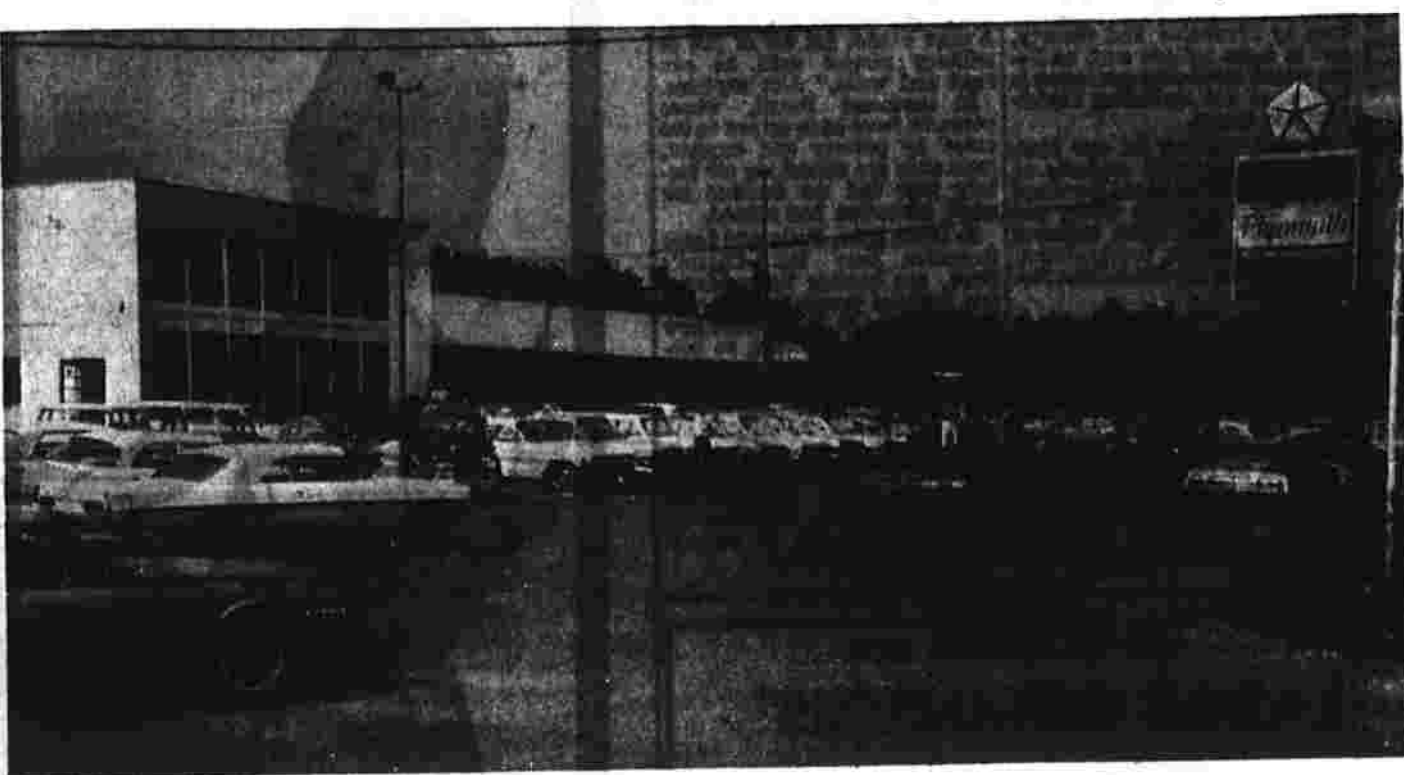

NRDD Disposes Self, Plan 3-Town Group

The Northeast Refuse Disposal District (NRDD), by a 9 to 1 vote of its representatives last night, took its predicted action toward disbanding and dissolving.

With only Manchester's French DellaFera dissenting, Bolton representatives that his company will cooperate with them in their new district and will try to come up with an amended incinerator plan to fit their objectives.

He introduced a comprehensive report by the Third Session of the International Research Group on Refuse Disposal, which met in Toronto, Italy, on May 24 through 29.

The report, printed in English, Italian, Spanish and French, concludes that, after a comprehensive study, the 500 delegates accepted incineration as the most satisfactory type of disposal.

The NRDD members in their final report for funds to wipe out a \$310 deficit. The allocations, based on the 1960 census, are \$180 from Manchester, \$75 from Vernon, \$40 from South Windsor and \$15 from Bolton.

Last night's meeting was a final one for the NRDD. All uncompleted business will be cleared up by mail or phone.

barriers figured in two of the holiday deaths.

An Ohio woman was killed near Harrisburg, Pa., as the car in which she was riding struck the steel median barrier on the Pennsylvania Turnpike. An Ohio man was killed on Interstate 71 in Columbus when his car hit a steel fender guard rail and careened into a utility pole.

The other causes of deaths on divided highways during the holiday included striking a bridge rail, ramming into a parked car, skidding into a ditch, hitting a light pole and running off the road.

Early turnpike operations in the United States were marred by head-on collisions caused by cars crossing into oncoming lanes. However, remedial steps are being taken.

During the first seven years of the New Jersey Turnpike, from 1952 to 1959, 46 of the 132 fatal accidents were caused by cars crossing over the unprotected median strip.

There has been one cross-median fatality since installation of a steel guard rail in 1961. The Pennsylvania Turnpike is installing a steel divider along its entire 470-mile, four-lane length.

Numerous other expressways are installing or have installed steel dividers.

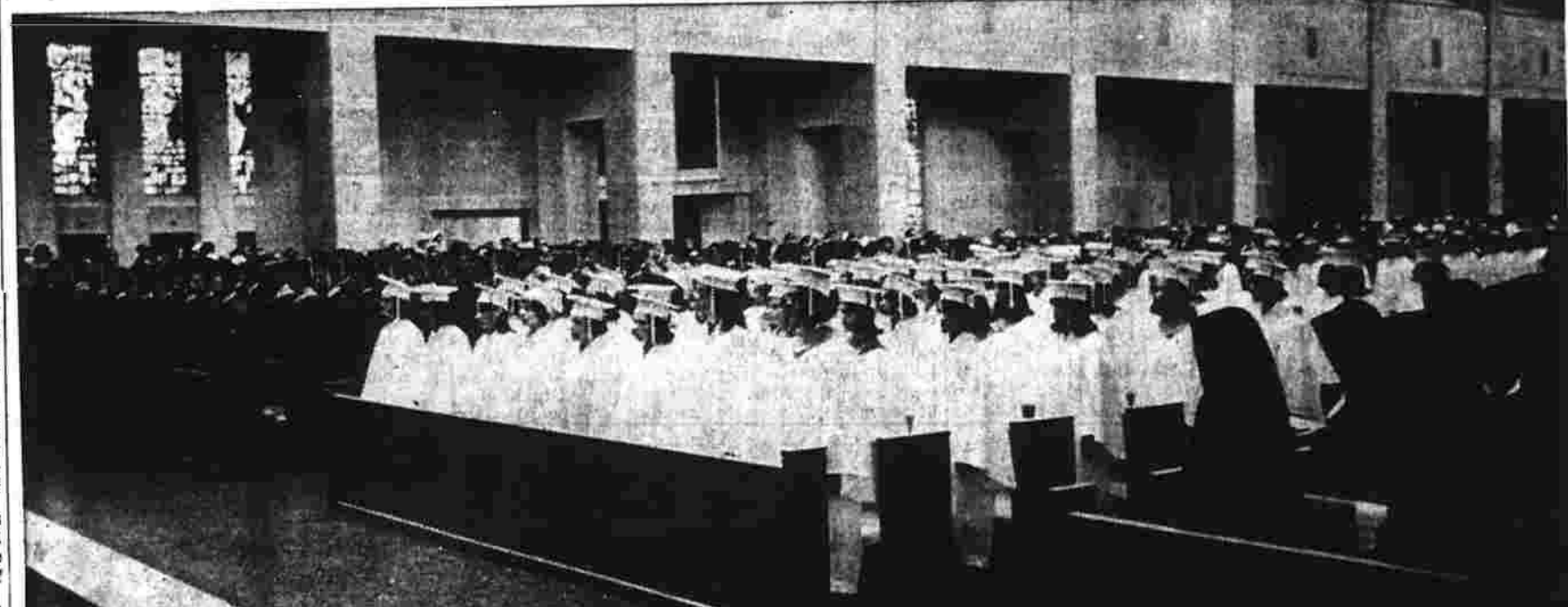


Bishop Hackett presents his ring to a graduate before presenting diplomas. Father Shaw on left. Father Shugrue addresses class.
