Two Conferences About Us Two international gatherings, each of tramendous potential importance, but neither to be attended by the Unit-

ed States, are in the news. One conference, however, is to consist of a group of 21 nations with whom we have had the closest of ties, assosistions and alliances, and with whom we might be meeting, as one of the equal crowd, if a certain Revolution had not begun back in 1776. This is the eting, at London, of the 21 nations of the British Commonwealth of Na-

They are, almost all of them, our friends and allies. They wish us well.
But they aren't going to know quite
how to wish us well when they face ino the main dominant issue of their

meeting together.
For their main dominant issue will not be anything which has special coneern for their own living together in their loose association of freedoms, and t will not be anything which affects them more sharply than it affects other people and other nations.

meeting is, inevitably, the shadow of they would like to play. They would like to help us. But they would like to

belp us find a safe way out, not help us go in deeper. Washington may not like the kind of help these 21 friendly nations are will-ing to give us. But It may do Washing-

ton some good, to read between the lines and see what our best friends would like to tell us, if they could do it without altering their status as friends.

The second international conference coming up is probably much more important, to us and to the world, even though it may seem more remote from

It is the conference of Afro-Asian nations scheduled to open June 29 in Algiers. Like the Commonwealth conference at London, the Algiers gathering will inevitably have Vietnam hanging over it. But the issues and struggle there will be broader than that. This will be the whole section of the world which lies, like Vietnam, between opposing powers and opposing ideologies, looking for its choices. Its top choice, undoubtedly, would be to find its own unique way forward in the world.

But the rest of the world is in a suspenseful state of being fascinated by some of the conference's lesser choices. This conference at Algiers is a descendant of the famous Bandung Conference at which, back in the Eisenhower era, we were fortunate enough to have observers. One of the big questions, this time, is whether Soviet Russia is going to be able to get itself invited to Algiers, so it can guard itself, on the scene, against the expected operations of Communist China there. Communist China, remember, with its smiles and pacts of peace, was the big star performer, of the Bandung Conference. Russia wants the privilege of being on hand, this time, to contest the growth of Chinese influence and prestige in

One might ask what Vietnamese Government. But it makes no real difference whether there is or isn't a government in Vietnam. If there were wouldn't ask us for such a bomb-

ing raid unless we told it to ask us. What it comes down to is that we were having "fun," playing "war games" with real live targets. If it develops later on, as first reports seem to indicate it may, that our heavy bombers, after flying 2,500 miles toward their target, missed that target by a casual mile or two, and so did not prove a very practical weapon against a small jungle hideout, at least we had the thrill of trying it.

This was not entirely the business of war. It was partly the intoxicating madness of war. There were a few American lives lost in this mission. We would like indeed to see the Presidential letter to their survivors, explaining what the practical purpose and the sacred necessity of this particular mission might be.


