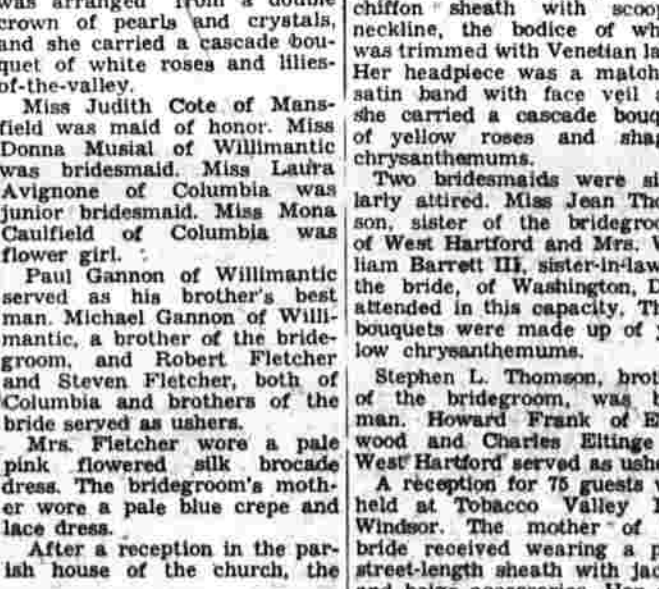

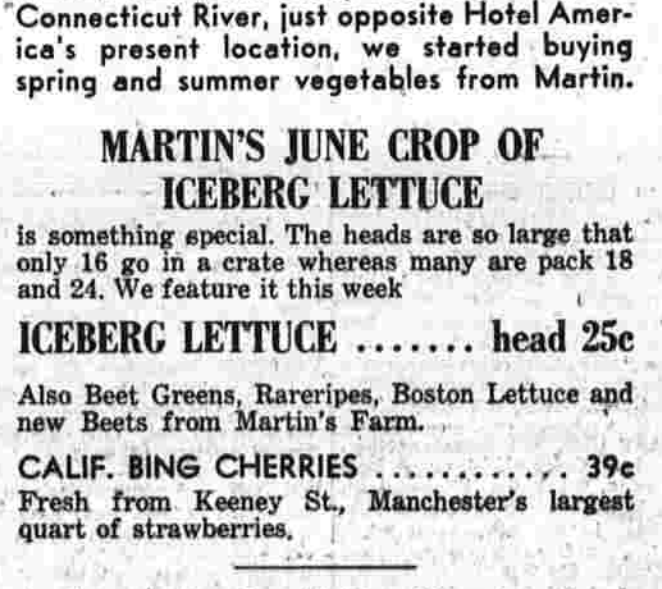

### Consumers Share in Excise Tax Cut

WASHINGTON (AP) — The new excise tax cut bill is on President Johnson's desk. It does away with most of the federal "sales" taxes, hangers-on from Korean War days and even earlier.

It was indefinite when Johnson would sign it into law. He was asked about it at a news conference Thursday, but gave no definite answer.

WASHINGTON (AP) — Here are questions and answers on consumer angles of the new excise tax reduction bill passed by Congress and awaiting President Johnson's signature.

Q. How soon will retail prices reflect the repeal of the other group of excises — those levied on manufacturers, such as the 10 per cent tax on frezers and refrigerators?

A. By \$4.6 billion of tax savings, a stimulus to prod the business expansion, and quite probably, a small drop in the cost of living.

Q. How soon stimulus to job and production is foreseen?

A. Economists say the savings, when spent and respent, will generate about \$10 billion worth of new national output. That is about one-third as much as the massive 1964 income tax cut provided.

Q. What will happen to living costs?

A. A decline of 2 to 1 per cent in the July consumer price index is possible, and then a smaller drop in January when the second stage of cuts takes effect.

Q. Why "possible"? Why not certain?

A. Because price rises for other products may cancel out the savings. And because some firms may not pass on all the tax savings to consumers in the form of price reductions.

Q. Aren't price reductions automatic?

A. No. Manufacturers and sellers are not legally bound to

### Andover Junk Autos May Result In Arrests

David R. Finchbaugh, chairman of the Planning and Zoning Commission, has announced that some town residents and land owners will be warned that unless they get rid of unregistered motor vehicles on their property they will be brought into court.

The other members of the commission, Raymond D. Stever, zoning agent, vice chairman Raymond T. Houli, secretary Guy T. Outlaw and member Paul Yurawich gave their full support to the chairman.

Complaints have been received during the past two years from the zoning officials and residents that junk vehicles not only create an eyesore, but that they are a definite safety hazard to children. In some instances they block access routes for proper fire protection of dwellings.

In checking the state statutes Finchbaugh noted that "any owner of two or more unregistered vehicles" constitutes a "motor vehicle junkyard." He said the announcement is intended to make people aware of the regulations and encourage violators to some cleaning up on their own.

Through the summer letters will be sent to people who have been investigated and established the presence of unregistered vehicles. If the condition is not corrected after a reasonable time indicated in the warning, the selectmen and zoning enforcement officials will join with state motor vehicle inspectors to arrest and prosecute violators.

The commission is also recommending that township vote to adopt a health ordinance and housing code as town ordinances at a forthcoming town meeting.

At present, there are no such local regulations.

The recommendation is simply to approve the Public Health Code of the state for enforcement on a local basis whenever a business or industry found to exist. Adoption of this code is a logical step, the commission believes.

Two international gatherings, each of tremendous potential importance, but neither to be attended by the United States...

They are almost all of them, our friends and allies. They wish us well. But they aren't going to know quite how to wish us well when they face into the main dominant issue of their meeting together.

For their main dominant issue will not be anything which has special concern for their own living together in their loose association of freedom, and it will not be anything which affects them more deeply than it affects other people and other nations.

The big shadow hanging over their meeting is, inevitably, the shadow of the great American involvement in Vietnam.

One knows beforehand, what role they would like to play. They would like to help us. But they would like to help us in a safe way, not help us in a deeper way.

Washington may not like the kind of help these 21 friendly nations are willing to give us. It may do nothing to stop some good, 50-year tradition between the lines and see what our best friends would like to tell us if they could do so without altering their status as friends.

**"Games" With Live Targets**

Considering the number of planes and bombs we have in the Vietnam area, flying a group of heavy bombers all the way from Guam was probably the most expensive way we could devise of trying to set flames to a section of Vietnamese jungle. But we wanted to see if we could perform such an exploit.

As an explanation of why we did this, our official version is that we executed this particular bombing mission "at the request of the Vietnamese Government." One might ask what Vietnamese Government. But it makes no real difference whether there is or isn't a government in Vietnam. If there were it wouldn't ask us for such a bombing raid unless we told it to ask us.

What it comes down to is that we were having "fun," playing "war games" with real live targets. It develops later on, as first reports seem to indicate, that our heavy bombers, after flying 2,500 miles toward their target, missed that target by a casual mile or two, and so did not prove a very practical weapon against a small jungle hideout, at least we had the thrill of trying it.

That was not entirely the business of war. It was partly the intoxicating madness of war. There were a few American lives lost in this mission. We would like indeed to see the President's letter to their survivors, explaining what the practical purpose and the sacred necessity of this particular mission might be.

Ways And Means

By Phineas Fiske

An opinion, written last month by Manchester's town council, has shed some additional light on the thinking behind a series of charter revisions announced in 1963 and adopted last year.

The light falls not so much upon the content of the revisions, nor upon the politics of the revision commission, as it does upon the kind of philosophy that governed the majority party.

And, because the actions of the Democratic members of the commission cannot be separated from decisions of the party leadership, they may well be taken as indicative of party policy as well.

Some of the members of the 1963 Charter Revision Commission surely were aware that this kind of conflict did exist. Other towns experienced the same kind of uncertainty.

Others on the commission probably were not aware of the Act's dictates — although the Commission's members were given a preliminary review of plans of development because of the legislature's powers permitted.

In either case, the commission decided that the intent of the Act's dictates was to be interpreted in the State House. The town's chief elected policy maker had the ultimate authority for the community's development — was a sound one.

So it agreed to a liberal interpretation of the state's statutes, in order to reach the goal that it had decided to be both valid and necessary for the community.

It is the decision to accept the liberal interpretation of the laws — to achieve ends that would presumably tend to the common good — that has already distinguished both in the narrow and in the broad as being a hallmark of our current era, as it has been during periods of change in decades past.

And here, as we have seen, it leaves the voters to decide in the road of one's own mind, having to decide on the wisdom of a proposal, the citizens may also have to decide if they can support the method by which that proposal is to be made reality.

### Push Urged for Federal Funds As Town Explores Park Needs

By ROY R. COHEN

A host of town officers, school officials and members of town boards and commissions, all concerned with public recreation, met in the Municipal Building Hearing Room last night and left behind them, for future consideration, an equal host of immediate and long-range recommendations.

There were many questions raised last night but there were no answers, in deference to a ruling by the meeting moderator, Park and Rec. Supt. Horace Murphy.

At the start of the 8 p.m. meeting he announced, "We are not here for the night to explore the night we are only to explore."

And, explore they did. The discussion ranged from the topics to tennis courts, from the bit of grass on a Village Green, and from the need for a new recreation center.

Again and again, the emerging ideas and suggestions were stated and federal grants, although many of the speakers alluded away from large-scale planning and pressed for remains and improvements to existing facilities.

Supt. of Schools, William Curtis expressed the philosophy of "Get it while you can," and urged town officers to apply immediately for funds for recreation under the Federal program. Many of those present joined with him in pressing for applications for those and other funds.

Curtis said, "The money here and there, regardless of your philosophy or political beliefs, you must apply for it. If we don't move to get the money, someone else will."

He added, "Seventy-five per cent of the tax dollar in Washington, and we have a responsibility to get our share."

He said, "The money has been passed by the school system for Operation Head Start, and the \$600,000 received by the Community College for teaching kids in only a sample of what we can do and get."

Curtis pressed for the construction of recreation facilities in the state as a whole, for Bennett Junior High and North Main Schools, and expressed great concern over the lack of an effective land conservation program in the state as a whole.

Mayor Francis Mahoney, who concurred with Curtis' philosophy of applying for federal and state funds, said that he was down to the necessity for having someone to check into all the possibilities for grants—somebody who can devote his time to reading all of the legislation and to making application for the town.

James Murray, secretary of the Advisory Park and Rec. Board, criticized Murphy for the lack of communication between the town and the board and asked, "How can we attempt to plan anything when we are never told of what is going on?"

He urged that much of the town's equipment and facilities are becoming deteriorated from lack of attention, and urged, "Let's put what we have in better shape, and worry about facilities later."

Joseph Eshwartz, another board member, agreed with Murray and said, "We on the board make recommendations and suggestions, but that's as far as we get. It takes months before the rec department lets us know what the possibilities of the facilities at Charter Oak Field."

Henry McCann, chairman of the advisory board, echoed Murray's suggestion that the present facilities be repaired first, and said, "With the full cooperation of this group, we can fix this lack of recreation facilities and again make Manchester the City of Village Charm."

Mayor Mahoney wrapped up the discussion Tuesday night in the meeting Tuesday night in the American Legion. Dr. Smith, a member of the Capitol Regional Planning Agency, said that by 2000 studies indicate there will be 2,000,000 people in the Capitol Region and of these 92,000 will be in Manchester.

To accommodate these people within the land area intelligent planning is necessary, he stated, and that planning is the purpose of the agency. Open areas should be reserved for recreation, urban development should be encouraged to grow in clusters, and industrial development should be restricted toward the floor of the Connecticut Valley. Dr. Smith, who is on the agency's land use committee, said that the desired ratio of open space to people by 2000 is 140 acres per 1,000 people, or 40 per cent of the land in the Capitol Region.

### Army Secretary Testifies Today About Holdings

WASHINGTON (AP) — Stephen Ailes, whose resignation as secretary of the Army effective July 1 was announced Thursday by President Johnson, today goes before a congressional committee which is investigating alleged sharp practices of a firm making loans to servicemen.

It was learned earlier this week that Ailes in 1954 had bought 50 shares of stock in the firm, Federal Services Finance Corp., for each of his four children. Each of these holdings now amounts to 144 shares.

The firm does a \$67-million a year business.

It was known in the Pentagon at least three months ago that Ailes wanted to resign and return to his Washington law practice, so there was nothing hidden about the decision. The President nominated Stanley F. Resor, now undersecretary of the Army, to replace Ailes.

At the time of the stock disclosure, a Pentagon announcement said Ailes "has never participated in any corporation or government action affecting the operation" of the finance company. It said he invested only in the stock as guardian of his children under the will of his mother.

The company has denied any wrongdoing in its lending practices to servicemen. There had been making before a House Banking subcommittee about servicemen signing blank powers of attorney and paying charges they had not been told about.
