'Pretty Yellow Canary' Lynda Bird Helps Unearth Skeleton

GRASSHOPPER, Ariz. (AP)—"Pretty Yellow Canary" helped, unearthing a 700-year-old skeleton in remote eastern Arizona.

"Pretty Yellow Canary" is the Apache name bestowed on Lynda Bird Johnson, the President's 21-year-old daughter.

"It's either 'Pretty Yellow Canary' or 'Pretty Yellow Wild Canary,'" she told reporters Tuesday. "I'm not so wild about that 'wild' part."

The Apache skeleton was found in traditional ceremonies last week.

"I wish I could say I found him," Miss Johnson said of the skeleton, but actually a knee-peg was discovered last year.

The digging by Miss Johnson was part of a two-week excavation at the University of Arizona archaeological camp on the site of the skeleton.

Followed by newsmen and Secret Service agents, Johnson traveled one of her father's walking wags conferences as she labored to unearth the archaeological site. She was dressed in a red and white striped shirt and a red and white striped skirt.

Dr. William A. Longacre, field director of the University of Arizona archaeological camp, said Miss Johnson had worked with pick and shovel, and brushed in extracting the skeleton.

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Good Old Pick, Shovel May Join Complicated Space Instruments

LOS ANGELES (AP)—To the many scientific instruments astronauts may take to the moon and Mars some day—add a pick and shovel.

They'll be needed, a scientist says, to scoop up rock and dust on these dry and airless worlds to provide oxygen, water and even fuel for the trip home.

Just 4 1/2 pounds of any of the kinds of rock expected to be on the moon or Mars would yield more than two pounds of oxygen—the daily requirement for one man—in a process devised by Dr. Sanders Rosenberg, a chemist.

A plant capable of producing 24,000 pounds of oxygen a month—enough for two months of transport—would weigh 25,000 pounds, he says.

"Several other methods have been proposed for producing oxygen, and this oxygen, on the lunar surface, would be used as rocket fuel," he says.

Rosenberg's method, already being tested in his laboratory, involves heating a suspended metal furnace—the moon it would be nuclear powered—to convert lunar rock to carbon monoxide and hydrogen. In a second step, these are turned into methane and water. Then the water is broken down into hydrogen and oxygen.

The water and oxygen would supply astronaut needs and the remaining oxygen stored as a rocket fuel.

But with huge reservoirs in the Blue Mountains to the west, there are no water restrictions.

"It is bad, really bad," says John L. Green, chairman of the New South Wales government's special drought subcommittee.

In some areas of western New South Wales, rivers have dried up. Water for stock comes from dams on ranch properties, and from artesian supplies.

In the central west of New South Wales, farmers await rain to plant their wheat—there is no water restriction.

A government ranger in the Waigaita area, A.O. Coleman, said: "There is no rain in three months I don't think anyone will be worrying very much. There will be nothing left to worry about."

OWNERS OF TV, TELEPHONES May Lose Welfare Payment
GOLDSBORO, N.C. (AP)—Ownership in determining whether an applicant needs assistance in paying telephone bills, a new welfare law in North Carolina says.

Mr. James Whitford is a 72-year-old widow who looks forward each day to her favorite television program.

Each week Mrs. Whitford made a decision—give up her television or her welfare payment.

"My daughter gave this television set to my husband 20 years ago when he was 65," she explains. "I don't know what to do now."

The County Welfare Board in the eastern North Carolina town has issued an order that anyone owning a television set or a telephone will not be eligible as of July 1, for public assistance.

The board made a couple of exceptions: a television set that remains where there are adult inmates or handicapped persons. The TV set must have been donated by an organization, not an individual.

The telephone must be removed from all his homes if there are no essential needs.

When the board ruling was released, a cry of protest arose from many county residents.

The board then scheduled a public hearing on the issue this afternoon.

Several individuals, some of whom are welfare recipients, have asked for an appearance before the board. Petitions protesting the ruling now bear names: Mrs. Jack Bartlett of the nearby Mount Olive, chairman of the Welfare Board, said the ruling was made "after we found welfare recipients with televisions and two television sets."

Mrs. Bartlett added: "I don't believe in welfare recipients making payments on televisions or on anything else that is not a necessity for their lives."

The board sent recipients a letter recently which said, "If you have a television or a telephone, you must give up one of the exemptions, you have until July 1 to comply."

County Commissioner Rich and Grady said many of the elderly people were able to attend church only by watching religious programs on television.

Commissioner Lloyd Gettins said he had written to the Welfare Board and asked to appear before the board.

North Carolina Welfare Commissioner R. Eugene Brown said he knows of no other local welfare unit with a similar ruling requiring recipients to dispose of televisions and telephones before they are eligible for assistance.

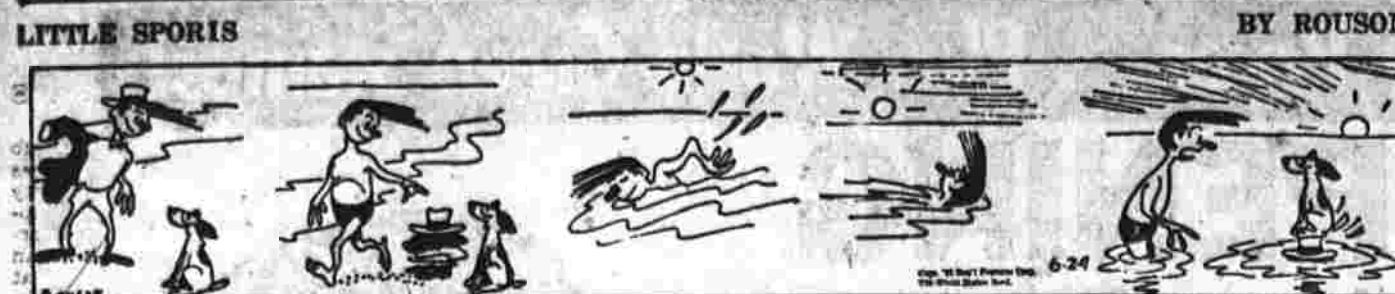

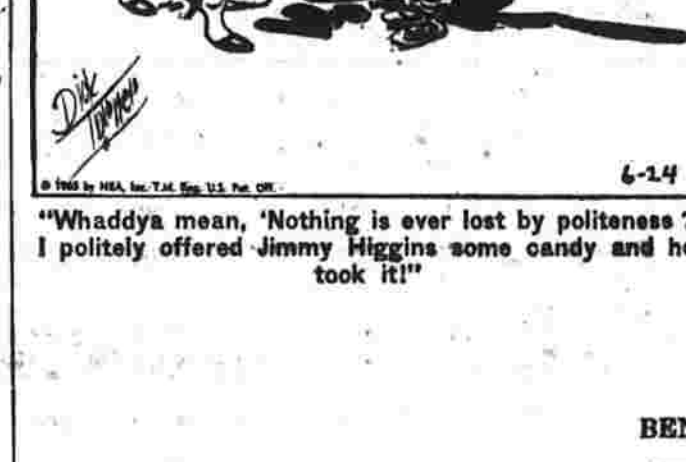

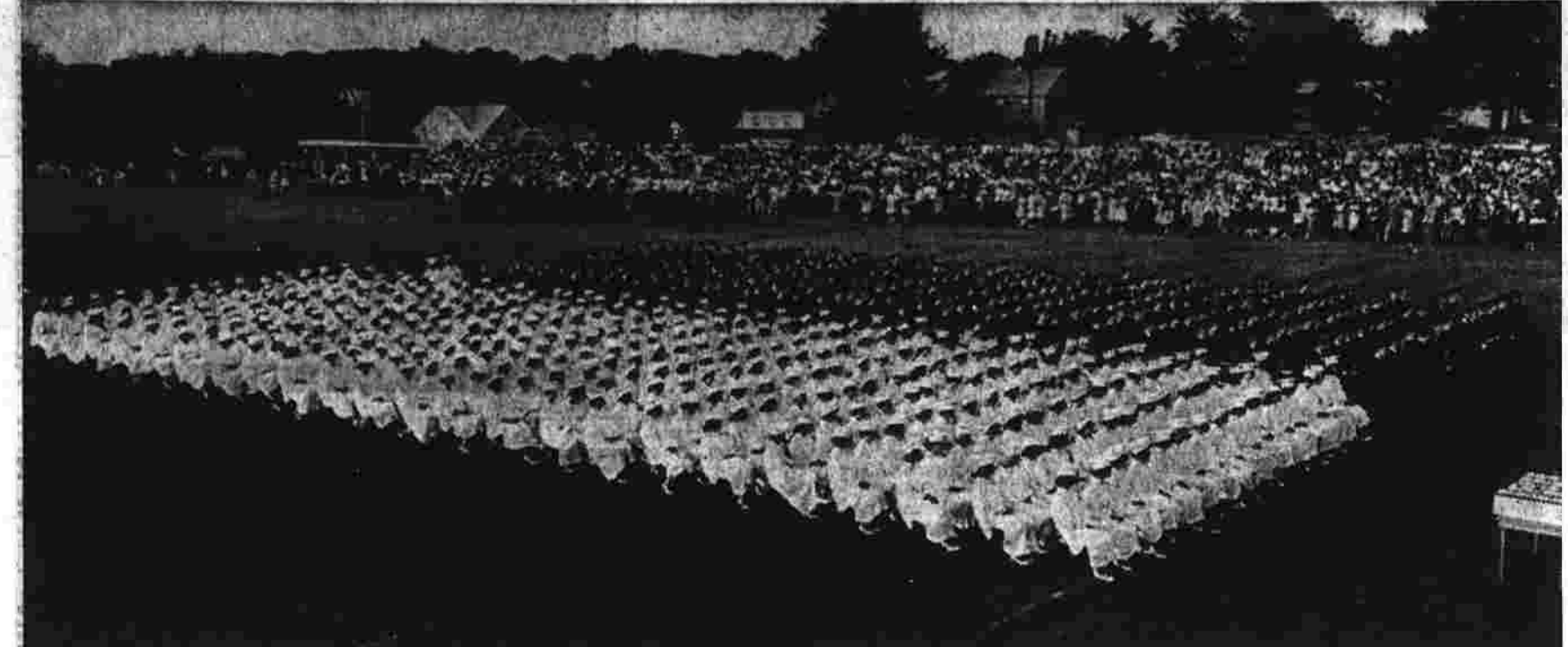

Now, said commencement speaker Chester W. Gluchowski, in part of the humanistic address, "you will have to stand up valiantly against many more storms."

84 Servicemen Dead In California Crash Of MATS Transport

EL TORO, Calif. (AP)—The Far East as replacements in various units there. The plane, a military Air Transport Service jet carrying Marine bound for Okinawa crashed and exploded after take off today. All 84 aboard were killed.

The plane crashed just below the crest of a 2-shaped ridge, rigging a crater. Then it slid down the top and the tail apparatus flipped up, acting as a catapult, flinging bodies, luggage and fragments of the plane over an area half a mile long.

Burned bodies and wreckage were widely scattered. The plane took off for Honolulu at 1:44 a.m. in low clouds and a drizzle and almost immediately disappeared from the radar screen at this Marine air base.

The wreckage was found in the hills almost 60 miles north of the base. The area is sparsely populated and brushland, with a few trees, including the native tree resort of Irvine Lake.

Many of the bodies and much of the wreckage were scattered around the country, heading for the crash and clothing to spines on a version of Boeing's 707 jet transport, and its crew of 12 were from the 16th Air Transport Squadron at McGuire Air Force Base, N.J.

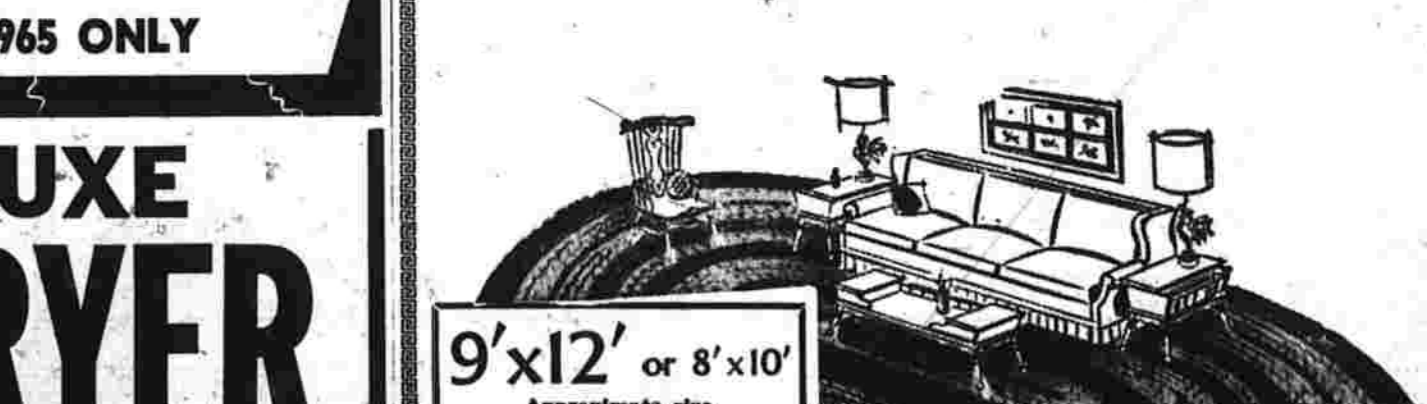

Senate Passes Measure Trimming Coinage Silver

WASHINGTON (AP)—The Senate has passed a bill which would eliminate silver from the 50-cent piece, too. This was the 20th measure to be passed by the Senate in the past week.

Mining states senators argued that the effect of the administration bill was to debase the nation's coinage system. They said the bill would reduce the silver content of half dollars, quarters and dimes to a 74-26 ratio. The bill was sent to the House, where a similar measure may come up for debate next week.

Under the Senate bill, the 80 per cent silver content of the half dollar would be reduced to 40 per cent, as requested by President Johnson. The House bill, which would remove the silver from dimes and quarters as well as half dollars, includes an amendment which would eliminate all of the silver from half dollars.

The President had called for a reduction of silver in coins on June 8. In a special message to Congress, he urged quick action in view of the rapidly diminishing Treasury stock of silver. He also expressed concern that a prolonged debate might encourage the hoarding of silver coins.

Western senators made six unsuccessful efforts to revise the bill more to their liking. They proposed to keep 40 per cent silver in the dime and quarter as well as the half dollar, was rejected 57 to 40.

On the other side of the argument, Sen. John O. Pastore, D-R.I., from a silver-using state, said that the bill would reduce the amount of silver in circulation by 100 million pounds of coin and cents which would have been purchased through ASICS county offices by Connecticut farmers, at reduced prices, for feeding substantial assistance to farmers who had heavy losses because of last year's extensive drought. 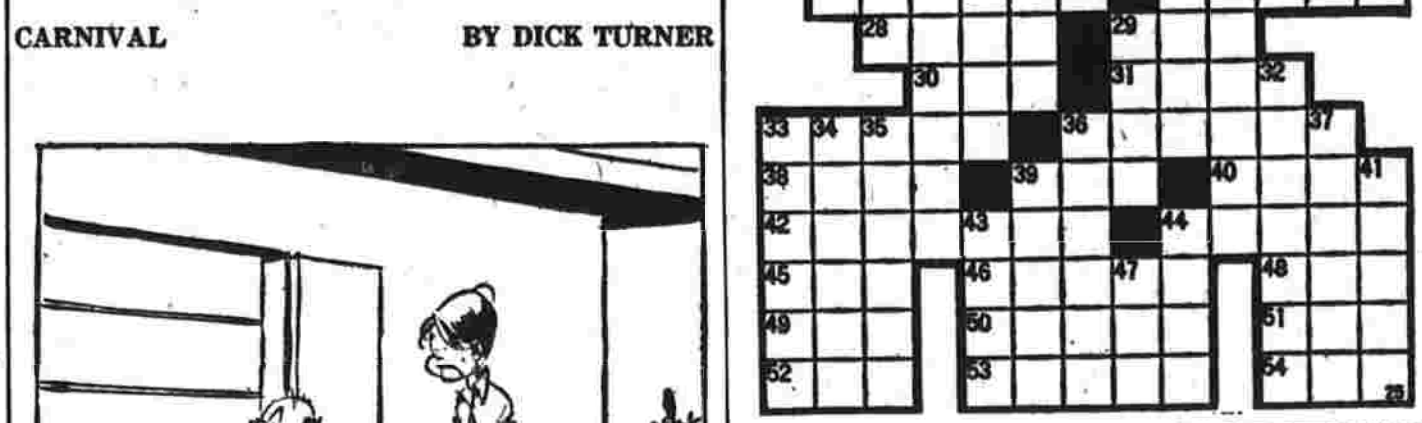

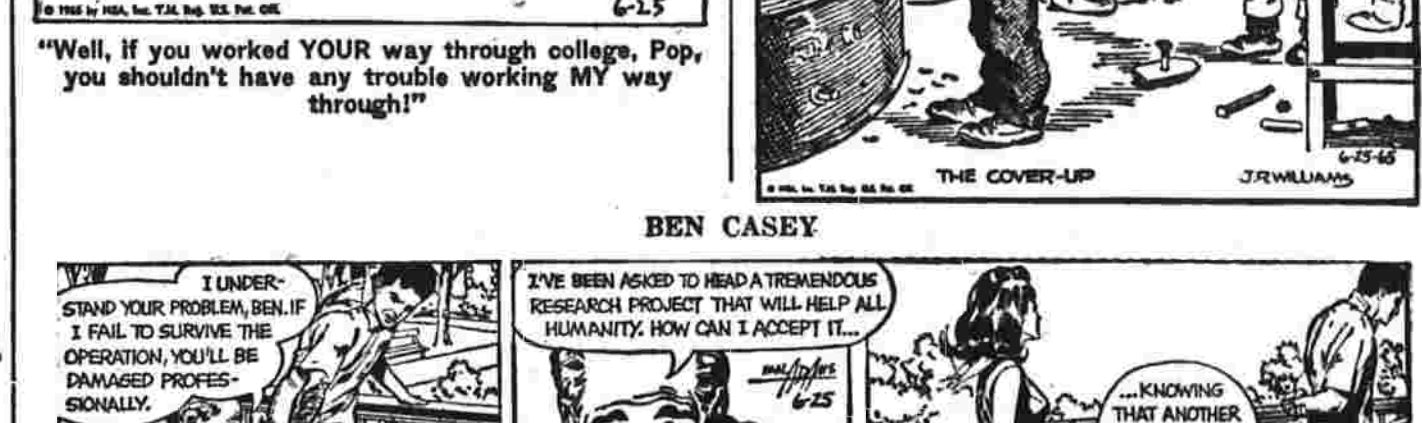

CONG MAJOR OFFENSIVE OVERRUNS TWO AREAS

SAIGON, South Viet Nam (AP)—Communist Viet Cong forces overran a district town and a battalion command post in separate attacks today. It was their first major offensive since the battle of Dong Koi two weeks ago.

Military spokesmen said 44 Vietcong infantrymen were killed and another 40 wounded but the command post near Duc Hoa, 20 miles west of Saigon, Viet Cong dead were given as 24.

The Viet Cong overran the district town of Tam Marung, 45 miles north of Kontum, near the Laotian border. Spokesmen said they had killed 200 defenders.

The district town was captured because of a low ceiling in the area, which was a deep hole in a stream, a U.S. Marine spokesman said.

5 Marines Drowned As Tank Sinks

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Air Force's Probe Seeks Crash Cause

EL TORO, Calif. (AP)—Air Force investigators concentrated today on learning the cause of the crash of a big jet transport plane that took 84 lives, including 72 Okinawa-bound Marines.

The four-engine jet crashed into flames fragmented after it John Anderson, a helicopter sergeant, was the first to locate the wreckage.

At 11:30 p.m. a helicopter sergeant, was the first to locate the wreckage. Anderson, 46, told newsmen: "At first I thought there were survivors sitting in the wreckage. Then we got closer and saw they were little green trees."

"I've covered in 24 years of service, including Korea and World War II," Anderson said.

Gen. Howell M. Estes, commander of the Military Air Transport Service, flew from Fort Meade, Md., to El Toro to inspect the wreckage.

Rep. Robert F. Kennedy, observing their wedding anniversary, said: "It was a terrible accident. I am returning to Korea tonight."

Reporters speculated that the tail section of the big transport plane was cracked, like a whip, after it hit the ridge — separating beds of baggage and clothing over a wide area.

The tail whipped over the top of the ridge and its fuselage apparently exploded, further scattering bodies and wreckage.

Several bodies and a wheel were hurled nearly a mile. The cockpit section, with a body still strapped in, was located a full mile away from the point of impact.

Personal effects — including photographs of loved ones — were everywhere. Remnants of green uniforms and Marine dress blues were impaled on the thorns of cactus plants.

The crash scene is at the 1,200-foot sea level.
