The nest had been laid among the broken brick rubble. The bird on the nest blended inconspicuously into the surroundings, and was unnoticed until she flew up.

They don't sing, but they utter a piercing cry as they glide overhead. They fly both gracefully and erratically. Sometimes they flutter their wings wildly, only to glide and soar with the greatest of ease, as they float about their wings wildly.

with the greatest of ease, as they float about, their wide mouth open, gobbling up insects.

The best chance we ever had to observe nighthawks at work came during the weekend when we watched them swoop and swerve in the bright spotlight focused on the steeple of a college chapel. The bright light on the white steeple attracted numerous insects, and the insects attracted the nighthawks. The nighthawks, in turn, attracted a group of interested human beings who marveled at the grace and beauty of the birds. Seen in the glare of the spotlights, the two white patches on the under side of their extended wings stood out so sharply that they seemed almost to be fluorescent.

The fact that the nighthawk is also, and more properly, called a goatsucker attests to the ancient belief that the flat-headed wide-mouthed bird was once believed to suck goats. It is, to be sure, a curious bird, unusual in its appearance and its habits. One unconventional habit, for instance, is its method of perching lengthwise of a tree limb, instead of crosswise as most birds perch. This city bird with the soft dark mostlied plumage is common, yet little known in comparison to other birds the robins and sparrows, not to mention the uniquious starilogs, which are so familiar to the urber geens.—MERIover the past two months, U.S. officials have been unable to come to a firm conclusion about Col.
