GOOGLAND, Kan. (AP)—A shortage of braceros, field workers from Mexico this season, has caused growers to hire teen-age girls to replace them in the beet fields.

Joe Terzaghi, 18, said he had had a quarter-mile of beet fields. "This work is O.K.," he said. "When it gets too hot we knock off work and return in the afternoon when it's cooler. The pay is good and the work isn't too hard."

Joe is one of several girls of high school and college age hired as field hands by beet growers here. He is the first to go to work.

They are paid \$1.50 an hour, plus room and board. The girls don't seem to get tired, kids that age regenerate pretty rapidly.

Fiscal Year Starts With Record Budget

Manchester starts a new fiscal year tomorrow with a General Fund budget of over \$9.5 million, the highest in the town's history and almost \$770,000 higher than that for the 1964-65 year.

In addition, the Town Finance Department will operate under a \$500,000 budget, also the highest in the town's history, and an increase of approximately \$100,000 over the current operation.

The greater part of next year's estimated revenue will be received from property taxes, based on a 4.6-mill rate for the General Fund and a 3.5-mill rate for the Fire District. The rate for the year ending tonight is 4.2 mills for the General Fund and 3.2 mills for the Fire District.

Property owners in the 8th District pay General Fund taxes only. They contribute to fire protection provided by the 8th District's volunteer fire department and, in addition, pay district-supplied sanitary sewer services. The District tax rate, levied as of June 1, is 2.5 mills, split evenly between the two services.

The town, in addition to property tax revenue, will operate with state school aid grants and with an estimated \$197,000 surplus from the 1964-65 budget. This estimate has since risen to approximately \$200,000, but the exact amount will not be known for at least a week or two after the last minute expenditures have been tabulated by the auditor's office.

Starting with the 1966-67 fiscal period, a year from tomorrow, the town, along with the rest of the state, will start a phased removal of manufacturers' inventory taxes. Each town will be reimbursed by the state for the tax loss on a sliding scale over a 10-year period with 10 per cent removed and reimbursed the first year, 20 per cent the second, 30 per cent the third, and so on until the 10th year.

At that time, the towns will be reimbursed a full 100 per cent, and 100 per cent each year thereafter.

Reimbursement will be based on the October 1963 Grand List, and will be frozen at those figures.

Hebron Comprehensive Plan Voted; Calls for Some Large Lots

The Hebron planning and zoning commission voted at a special meeting to accept the comprehensive plan for development for the town as presented, with the exception of one paragraph concerning recommendations and the proposed land use map.

The first paragraph on page 1 of the report, concerning larger lot sizes, has been rewritten. The revision notes that Hebron is at present zoned for one-acre lots, with the exception of business zones and the Armon Lake area.

It states that "Areas for larger lots are desirable to maintain the rural character of the town" and recommends "that graduated zoning be established through a revision of zoning regulations." This recommendation further states that a study of the population makes it appear that the Armon Lake Center area is "essentially unpopulated, therefore it is unlikely that a larger lot size would be practical in this area."

The revision goes on to say that the proposed land use map indicates that this area should remain in one-acre minimum lot size with the larger lot areas zoned within the Old Hebron portion of the town, based upon "population density, land character and traffic problems."

The proposed land use map will be changed to show a free zone, enclosing Armon Lake Center to the Old Hebron center road, to be identified as a one-acre zone.

The remainder of the rural residential land is to be provisionally zoned as having a minimum size of one acre, with provision for some areas to be zoned for two-acre lots.

The effective date of the town plan will be established by the commission when the revisions are completed and filed with the town clerk and legal notice requirements have been met.

The commission will meet again on July 13 at 8 p.m. in the office building to work on the town plan.

Judge House Takes Oath Of State Supreme Court

By SOL R. COHEN

In a brief ceremony, witnessed by about 50 state dignitaries, relatives and friends, Judge Charles S. House of 150 Westland St. was sworn in this morning as a justice of the State Supreme Court of Errors.

The oath of office was administered by Chief Justice John Hamilton King in the beautiful and stately high-ceilinged Supreme Court, its dignity softened, yet enhanced, by an array of basketfuls of flowers.

The 9 a.m. ceremony was followed by another at 9:30 a.m., when Justice King swore in John P. Colter of West Hartford as a justice of the same court.

On hand to witness the ceremony was Justice House's wife, Virginia, his daughter, Betsey, and his sister, Mrs. Ralph Maher.

Chief Justice King said, "I consider it a high honor and a privilege to install the oath of office to my friend, Charles House or, Charlie, as we know him."

"It is a great pleasure for me, personally, since I consider him my friend and a great lawyer."

"Justice House is no stranger to this court for we possess many of his opinions, written when he substituted for the late Justice William J. Shea, during his illness."

Justice King then administered the oath of office, shook Justice House's hand, and quipped, "Now you're on the payroll."

Justice House was appointed to the Supreme Court of Errors while serving as chief justice of the State Superior Court, a post he assumed in April. He had been a member of that court since July 20, 1963, upon appointment by former Gov. John Lodge.

His 1953 appointment had followed a distinguished career in both state and local government.

He has served in the State Assembly as both representative and senator, a former prosecutor and deputy judge of Manchester's Town Court, a former town counsel and a former assistant state's attorney for Hartford County.

Discharge Duty Swiftly, Dempsey Asks Delegates

Baldwin To Head Conclave

HARTFORD (AP) — Gov. John N. Dempsey called on delegates to the third constitutional convention in Connecticut history today to do their utmost toward "the swift and satisfactory discharge" of the precise duties facing them.

"Our Connecticut constitution does not, according to judicial opinion, give every citizen his right to an equal vote," Dempsey told the opening session that met in an atmosphere of tradition and bipartisan accord.

"The very first objective of this convention, then, must be to correct those portions of our constitution which have infringed upon these rights of the people."

"Let us apply our maximum efforts to the swift and satisfactory discharge of the precise duties facing us."

The opening session of the convention, the first since 1902, was held in the Old State House where the existing constitution was written at a convention in 1818.

Dempsey said the convention will give "new expression to our Connecticut tradition of Democracy and to the role of the citizen and their government."

"It is expected that the delegates to that session created the first written bill of rights in Connecticut's history, thereby guaranteeing civil liberties to each of our citizens."

Dempsey told the delegates to act swiftly in accomplishing

UNITED NATIONS, N.Y.

(AP) — The Vatican's U.N. observer said today he expects Pope Paul VI to attend the next session of the U.N. General Assembly which starts in September.

Mgr. Alberto Giovannetti, the Holy See observer, told a reporter it is premature to speculate on just when the Pope might be here or how long he might stay. But he expressed the hope the Pope could address the 11-nation assembly.

"We hope that the Holy Father will come during the 20th session of the General Assembly," he said. "The session will start Sept. 21. There will be a recess at Christmas time. Then the Assembly will return in the new year. It is quite likely that the Holy Father will be here sometime during that period."

Rebel Infiltrators Hit Da Nang Base

SAIGON, South Viet Nam (AP) — A wounded Communist from North Viet Nam was under interrogation tonight as a member of the Viet Cong task force that killed one American, destroyed three planes and damaged three others in a hit-and-run attack on the Da Nang base. The damage is estimated at \$5 million.

A U.S. spokesman said the prisoner was identified as Do Xuan Hien, 29, of the North Vietnamese province of Thanh Hoa. He was quoted as saying he infiltrated into South Viet Nam in April with the 3rd Battalion of the 18th Regiment of North Viet Nam's 325th Division.

The spokesman said the prisoner reported he was attached to a special unit for the attack on the base, launched at 1:30 a.m. from a graveyard outside the perimeter wire. He was picked up by a search patrol.

though blood trails suggested some were wounded if not dead. The American killed was a young Air Policeman, who opened up with his pistol after apparently sighting the approach of the Viet Cong.

U.S. Air Force and Navy planes struck at North Viet Nam throughout the day without letup.

Bridges, barracks and radar installations were among the prime targets, and more propaganda leaflets were dropped over populated areas, a U.S. spokesman said. He said all planes returned safely.

More U.S. Marines landed in South Viet Nam, at the coastal city of Qui Nhon. A U.S. spokesman said between 400 and 500 were coming ashore from 7th Fleet ships and would provide security for the Qui Nhon area as well as "combat support for the Republic of South Viet Nam's armed forces."

Qui Nhon, 270 miles northeast of Saigon, is the fourth area to be defended by the Leathernecks. The others are the air bases at Da Nang, 380 miles northeast of Saigon; Chu Lai, 20 miles south of Da Nang, and Phu Bai, 35 miles north of Da Nang.

In the central highlands 150 miles south of Da Nang, four Americans and about 50 Vietnamese were killed in a Communist ambush near Cheo Reo.

But the Red guerrillas were driven off with heavy losses after a day of close-in fighting.

The unofficial total of American combat dead in Viet Nam totaled 445 since December 1961.

The hit-and-run attack at Da Nang was carried out while a majority of the Americans on the key base were asleep.

U.S. military authorities in Saigon said their information

A heavy rain was falling on the plane lander.

The remaining guests will have to get along without food, drink and room service, but a staff of about 50 will remain until the tenants find other abodes.

Sentiments were sad as staff members and patrons bade farewell Wednesday to that gracious domain — to make way for the march of commerce.

"An era is passing by," said courtly, white-haired "Mr. Paul," the hotel's long-time supervisor of room service, whose full name is Paul Boszo. "People don't enjoy and appreciate excellent living so much anymore."

At the marble-columned entrance, a liveried bellman, John Crumble, 57, shook hands with a departing guest, Irving H. Green of Chicago. "Goodbye, We'll miss seeing you."

"We'll all miss this hotel," said Green, president of the Mercury Record Corp. "A lot of people will miss it."

Easy Path Ahead For Housing Bill

WASHINGTON (AP) — A housing bill containing a modified version of President Johnson's rent supplement plan headed for comparatively easy going in the Senate today after one of the closest votes in the House on any Johnson administration proposal.

The controversial portion of the \$9.9-billion measure — the provision for subsidizing rent of low-income families — survived a 208-202 vote in the House Wednesday only after the Democrats handling it had drastically modified it from the original administration conception of a program for families above the actual needy level.

As the House finally passed it, on a 245-169 roll call vote, the bill closely resembles legislation already approved by the Senate Banking Committee. The Senate version carries a somewhat higher price tag, but estimates of the ultimate cost of a four-

grants, loans and loan guarantees are not precise.

Under the House bill, \$100 million would be provided over the next four years for rent supplements to families who could qualify for — but do not live in — low cost public housing. Regulations on income ceilings for families qualifying for such public housing now vary from city to city.

The help would go only to the needy whose rent exceeds 25 percent of the family income and who live in housing owned by nonprofit or limited dividend organizations. None of the supplements would go to tenants of private landlords.

President Johnson praised approval of the bill as an historic step. He said the provision for rent supplements will provide new homes for hundreds of thousands "condemned to slums." And he said it would give incentive to private industry.

In addition to the controversial rent supplement provision, the House bill contains a novel no-down-payment Federal Housing Administration home loan section benefiting peace-time veterans.

It also has mortgage insurance for land development, aid for needy owners of slum property to upgrade their housing and grants for neighborhood facilities, parks and playgrounds.

The bill also contains provisions to continue programs such as FHA, slum clearance and college dormitory construction. The Senate tentatively is scheduled to take up its version of the housing bill about July 12.

Wednesday's crucial House test came on a Republican move to strike from the bill the provision under which needy families could be helped with their rent payments to the extent that those exceeded 25 percent of family income.

CLINTON, N.Y. (AP) — Heiress Gamble Benedict and once-wedded Thomas F. Gallagher, a New York State Police investigator, were married today in St. Mary's Roman Catholic church in this college community near Utica.

In Syracuse, Gallagher's ex-wife and mother of his 13-year-old daughter, Christine Ann, told a reporter the two had been divorced. The former Doris M. Kelly of Syracuse, who uses the name Doris Gallagher, declined to elaborate.

The Roman Catholic Church does not normally permit remarriage of divorced persons in the church but there have been exceptions.

The 24-year-old bride's runaway marriage in 1960 to ex-chauvetteur Andre Forumbanu ended in an annulment after she had defied her millionaire grandmother to marry him and had borne him two sons.

Gallagher, 32, denied a few weeks ago that he and Miss Benedict were planning marriage. He told a reporter that he did not know where the rumor originated and that, in fact, he had another girl.

The two were married by the Rev. James Nicholson, pastor of the church.

Fifteen guests were present. The couple planned to fly to Ireland for a three-week honeymoon.

Gamble had been living recently with her brother Douglas in this area, and it was he who introduced the pair.

The bride's late, widowed grandmother, Katherine Geddes Benedict of New York City, left Gamble and her brother an estimated \$50 million from a type-writer fortune built by the grandfather, Henry H. Benedict, who once headed the Remington Typewriter Co. in Elmhurst, N.Y.

Gallagher was born in Auburn, in central New York. He attended Baldwinville Academy near Syracuse; Leonard Hall, a prep school in Leonardtown, Md.; the Valley Forge Military Academy in Wayne, Pa.; and the Christian Brothers Academy in Syracuse briefly.

Gallagher's salary as a senior investigator is \$11,900 a year, police headquarters in Albany said.
