

At Last, A Cure For Speeders? It is nothing new for civilization to stumble on the solution to some of its most troublesome problems, and it seems to us that the miracle has happened again, and there has at last been found a real and effective answer to the problem of speeding. The new method of dealing with

speeders has a chance of being much more effective than previous devices, such as blood tests, or breath tests, or fines in court, or suspension of licenses.
