

for their military and diplomatic sup-New Zealand is, at the moment, getting ready to fly a battery of 120 men and four field guns to Vietnam. The decision to make this first contribution to what the United States has long been hoping to make a multi-nation cause in Vietnam has been taken only after bitter political controversy in New Zeaand, and is still subject to cancellaion, with the Prime Minister on record that it would be called off immediately f North Vietnam should agree to receive a peace mission from the British

Commonwealth nations. The arguments which have been going on in New Zealand have not been infamiliar. The government itself is on record supporting American policy in Vietnam. The opposition fears that the United States is fighting a losing battle against a movement which has popuar support. It charges that the bombing of North Vietnam is both brutal and

Each summer, countless Americans unwittingly conduct "open houses" for thieves. They depart for vacation sites

without providing proper protection of their homes while away. On return, they are aghast to find their dwellings ransacked and valuable property stoles. A few simple precautionary measures to secure the premises and leave them with an "cocupied" awarance offer with an "occupied" appearance often-discourage and prevent burglaries. Crimes against property, however. Crimes against property, however, are only a minor part of the problem Far more appalling are the victous attacks on defenseless children by sexual deviates and the murders, rapes, and aggravated assaults which register sharp rises during the summer. The intensity and frequency of these vicinities sharp rises during the summer. The in-tensity and frequency of these violations haunt every community. Law enforce-ment is still searching for effective pre-ventive action against them, and cer-tainly, negligence and public indiffer-ence do not lessen the burden. Summer is also the season of the hitchhiker and wanderer. The motorist who stops and opens his car door to a stranger may be asking for a death ride for himself and his family. Many times, the innocent-looking young man

ride for himself and his family. Many times, the innocent-looking young man on the roadside is a trigger-happy or knife-wielding killer. For safety's sake, drivers shottid exercise that part of valor considered best—discretion—and pass up littchhikers.

Just how "long and hot" the summer will be depends on how well law enforcement and the public combine efforts to contain seasonal outbreaks.
