Funds Shift On Agenda

The board of directors will be asked Tuesday to shift \$65,000 from one account to another to pay for planning a major sanitary relief sewer to run from the Green to Hartwood Rd. The money will be taken from funds earmarked for diverting sewage from the hospital area and will pay Anderson-Nichols of Boston, an engineering firm, for plans and specifications for the trunk sewer and for supervising construction of it. The entire project is expected to cost about \$500,000.

The money will have to be restored later when it is needed.

The directors will also be asked to waive the bidding requirement for work on the Foster-Howard water pumping station. If the waiver is approved, the work will go to B.F. Industries of Providence, R.I. The firm will install mixing tanks, a motor, and proportioning equipment for automatic operation of the station. The cost of the work is \$12,275.

The two items of business were added to the agenda for the board meeting scheduled for 8 p.m. in the hearing room of the Municipal Building. Other additions concern the proposed permit to allow Aronson authority to apply to the State Board of Education for a school aid building grant, and decisions on disposition of streets recommended by the Town Planning Commission.

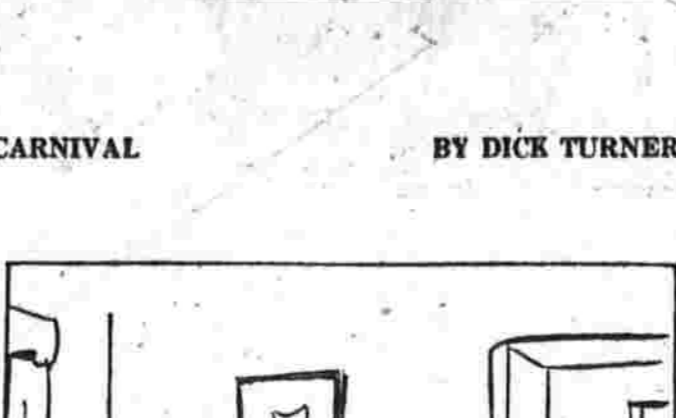

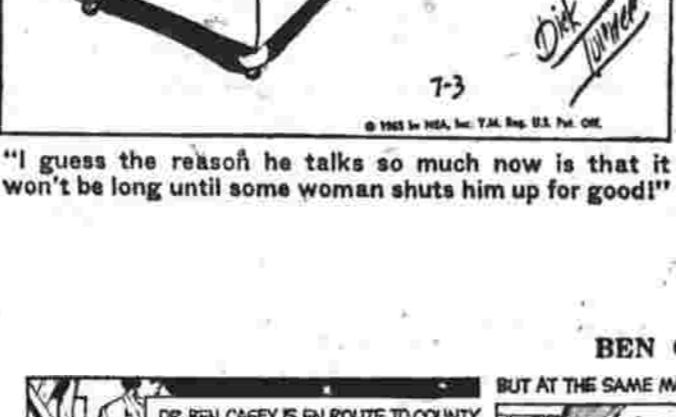

A Lament By a Viewer Done Wrong

WEST SHOKAN, N.Y. (AP) — Maybe I'm fickle, even ungrateful. Certainly this time last year I was happily boasting that television had me hooked; that I, alone on my wind-swept mountain, found companionship and solace in so many television offerings that sometimes my total viewing ran to 80 or 40 hours a week.

Now I'm reversing myself. Television has done me wrong and except for news, Danny Kays and very special events, I'm mournfully bidding it farewell. That is because my best-loved programs are no more, or soon will be.

Gone is "The Defenders," the series about a father and son team of lawyers with consciences. Call it messianic if you like, but I enjoyed the fact that "The Defenders" had an undeniable point of view and yet never developed a formula. I found myself getting a new perspective on law and even justice. It was well written, well directed and well acted.

"Profiles in Courage" also had a message, and one intelligent friend of mine found it dull. I, on the other hand, looked forward eagerly to the true tales of American men and women who risked everything for ideals. The list I keep of good people grew appreciably because of that series.

Of all my losses, perhaps the saddest is "That Was The Week That Was," not because it always hit a bull's-eye but because it kept officialdom, news gatherers including television itself, and all stuffed shirts a little uneasy about what it might lampoon next. Also there was that extraordinary musical pantomime of the Berlin wall by Burr Stiletrom, which won the Peabody award.

Both pupils and parents were among those who disagreed with me about "Mr. Novak," the story of a school and some special teachers. They said there are no Mr. Novaks in real life, but I say there should be. If ever the world needed teachers who care, the time is now. As for the parents in the weekly presentations, I meet their like all the time — utterly blind to their children's needs and what is happening to them. Any concerned teacher would stack up well against them, though I am certain not saying that all parents are as bad as many that I know.

"The Rogues" was a lovely piece about debonair rascals with hearts of gold. But it and the acting ability of Charles Boyer, David Niven, Gladys Cooper and Gig Young, who were playing them, vanished with my other pets.

Maybe I shouldn't blame the defection of Jack Paar on television because he decided all by himself to go up to Vermont or maybe New Hampshire and run his own radio station. He'll

The Truth on Dick Van Dyke From Miss Moore: 'So Nice'

HOLLYWOOD (AP) — One of the questions I'm asked most often is what is it like to work with Dick Van Dyke.

I have a feeling people don't believe what I tell them because it sounds too good to be true.

I just can't say that offstage, Dick Van Dyke is moody. Or temperamental. Or hard to get along with. I'm not sure he knows what those words mean.

The truth is that Dick doesn't lose his temper. He doesn't sulk. He doesn't throw his weight around.

He's so nice, in our hearts we know we don't deserve him.

Someone asked Dick once if he could ever be married to me in real life. And he answered very honestly — he said no. To

hid him, I asked what was the matter with me. Dick said, "I'm a marshmallow type. I'm not forceful enough for you."

I had to think that over. If Dick is a marshmallow type, it's over a steel core. He's one of the strongest men I've ever known. But he's quietly strong. (I probably need a loudly strong type.)

There are quite a few loud, strong types working to put "The Dick Van Dyke Show" together. We all sit around tossing in ideas, adding bits of action to the scripts as we go along.

There's a lot of joking and laughing and general fooling around.

Dick will be in the middle of it all. But he sits in the middle — he doesn't stand up and take center stage.

If we're working out a camera move that doesn't concern him, Dick may wander off and play the stage piano. You know what he usually plays? Johann Sebastian Bach.

That's because he's learning to play the harpsichord and he practices whenever he can. I imagine we're the only show in Hollywood that rehearses to Bach.

Dick does live up to his reputation as a funny, funny man. The great thing about working with him is that he does more hilarious things offstage than we ever have time for on camera.

We did one show in which a clothing store mannequin was part of the stage setting. During rehearsal, Dick wandered over and pretended to whisper in her ear, carrying on a great conversation in pantomime. One second he'd be a spy passing on vital secrets. The next, a mean, gossipy old woman. Then a Don Juan. It was a great performance — and one that only a couple of dozen people saw.

I've said this before and I'll keep on saying it. Dick is a born artist. He's so talented at things he's never had formal training for — dancing, playing the piano, juggling.

He makes it look as though things are easy for him. And because of this, he makes things easy for all of us who work with him. Who could ask for anything more?
