What this adds up to, brutally speaking, is that an amendment supposed to take care of some situation of Presidential disability also sets up the machinery which could be used to remove a living President from authority, with a machinery much less difficult than that involved in the process of formal

The trouble all lies in Section IV of the proposed amendment, and even though it has been approved by 60 supposedly keen and informed minds in the United States Senate, a good many ordinary American minds ought sead it and let their fancy play on a few of its angles before the states gut around to discussing and voting on their own ratification.

House Moved In Bronx The Varian house, a Bronx landmark

dating from 1770, was moved to a new It is now at the Neumann-Goldma lemorial Plaza, a city park, across from its old site on the northwest corner of Bainbridge Avenue and Van Cortlandt Park East, at 206th Street. The house ilmost ruined by vandals, will be re stored for occupancy by the Bronx County Historical Society.

The removal across Bainbridge Avenue, a ponderous job, began Wednesday morning after three weeks of prepara tion. The fieldstone, three-story dwel with walls two feet thick weighed 600 tons. Supported by steel beams, the house was drawn on an enormous dolly or cart, on 48 wheels. The job cost sbout \$20,000 and was done by Nicholas thers of Yonkers, specialists in the removal of large houses.



Mr. Beller is a well-to-do New Yorker n his early 60's whose hobbies are science, mainly electronics, philosophy and the writing of poetry. His father, also William C., who was a deputy col-lector of the Port of New York, bought

The Beller family never lived in the house, but a caretaker did until a few years ago. Since then it has been uncupied and its interior was wrecked

One wing of the house was built in 1770. The rest of the dwelling was added about 1776. During the Revolution, the house was occupied by the British, but they were driven out in a clash on Jan. 17 1777 with the American Continuately. 7. 1777 with the American Continentals Valentine and was acquired early in the 19th century by Isaac L. A city with palaces, royal tombs and lush lotus ponds, Hue lies along the banks of the gently flowing River of Perfumes. It is clean and well-kept. Many of the 2,000 U.S. servicemen in Hue believe it is the most pleasant city in South Viet Nam.

Hue has so far resisted the commercialization and quickening pace of life in Saigon and Da Nang. As more Americans pour into the area — some 2,000 U.S. Marines have established a beachhead only 12 miles south of Hue at Phu Bai — this may change.










Members of three hew town agencies concerned with planning were warned last night that unless they act quickly the town will miss out on federal town will miss out on federal funds until nest year.

Members were told that they must bring together Rockville's and Vernon's planning program as soon as possible, "hopefully overnight," before they can apply for funds.

Philip Forsley, chief planner for the Connecticut Development Commission, spoke before the planning and soning commissions and the soning board of appeals. Members of the three groups were sworn in last night. They were appointed last Thursday when the consolidated government started.


