But, considering how far things have moved in the few brief years of the Peace Corps, and observing how the spirit and seal and aptitude for such service seems to have leaped ahead in resent day youth, one can find no exaise at all for a very pessimistic timetable for U Thant's wish. Why shouldn't it come quickly? We are all used, in the tales from

the age when knighthood flowered, to the idea that the young man should go out and prove himself with deeds of virtue and of valor. We all remember, from our knowledge of the customs of the age when armored jousting went out of style, how the fashionable young man who could afford it would make his grand tour of other countries. And far too many modern civilizations have required of their young men a span of service in their armed forces.

Why not, indeed, democratise all these ancient customs and privileges and obligations and send young people of many nations out on missions of peace and development until, to put it bluntly, almost all the young men and women who would have to fight one another in war have had at least a preliminary acquaintance in more constructive and decisive pursuits?

The date for the meeting and the request for council recommended srchitects were voiced at a meeting of the council last night.

Councilman James Throwe presented a drawing of the new town hall in Coventry and commented on the beauty and austerity of this building. The cost of the Coventry town hall was \$150,000, or 15,000 sq. ft. at approximately \$10 per sq. ft.

Throwe noted that Mr. Walter Douglas had designed the Coventry town hall and that, with Douglas's permission, he would like to turn the drawing over to the building commission for its consideration.

Mayor John Egan commented that Douglas was among the architects already invited to the joint meeting of the council and the building commission.

mission.

Councilman Carlo Prestileo questioned the other council members about what locations were being considered for the proposed building.

Mayor Egan stated that the town was being viewed for town was being viewed for likely sites and that architectural designs must meet other than sesthetic needs.

He said that the site requirements would include suitability ments would include suitability for expansion and that the ad-vice of professional architects would be valuable in making

any decision on a possible site.
Councilman Prestileo observed that the commission
should be looking for suitable
locations and that, so far, nothing had been found that was
deemed suitable. He noted that
valuable time was going by and

Sidewalk Approved
The council approved construction of a sidewalk on the west side of Graham Rd., from Roberts Dr. to the right-of-way to the Eli Terry School.

Councilman Frederick Mahr, chairman of the public health and safety committee, said that the committee favors the construction of the walk for the entire width of the property on Graham Rd. immediately adjacent to the right-of-way.

The walk had been proposed for a distance of 275 feet, and would have ended in the middle of the last 100-foot lot on Graham Rd. An additional 50 feet

would bring the walk to the
end of the property.
