

"So it is ouite possible that new and erious decisions will be necessary in the near future. And substantial increase in the present level of our efforts to turn back the aggressors in South Vietnam will require steps to insure that our reserves of men and equipment in the United States remain ntirely adequate for any and all emer-

This measured, deliberate statement from the President, made to his people and to the world on Tuesday, July 13, For what it does is spell out and confism what some people considered the nevitabilities of the new American polcy in Vietnam announced and inaug-

rated last February. Some people said then that the nev policy, of bombing North Vietnam in taliation for guerrilla grenade atacks on American barracks in South Vietnam, and in warning to North
