

Two bandits fled with an estimated \$35,000 to \$40,000 today after forcing a teller to open the Westville branch of the General Bank and Trust Co. and hitting him over the head.
The teller, 20-year-old Ronald Naiman, told police he was accosted by the two Negroes in work clothes as he parked his car in a lot in the rear of the bank shortly after 8 a.m.





Admittingly, the good Secretary's words were more a matter of style than of substance. But let it be clearly understood, from some occasional hearer, viewer, reader, that there is some esidual reluctance to concede that any portion of man's fate as it is symbolized in the jungles of Vietnam is reasonable or logical.

Whenever, these days, some one tells us "it is reasonable to assume" something, what is being offered our credulity and our tolerance is probably something totally preposterous.

The Drought-Breaker

It was remarked, during one of those cleased straight-down intervals Sunday afternoon, that the rain falls on the just and the unjust. That, it was being proved that very afternoon, is another of those enticing half-truths which are continually offering themselves as substitutes for reality. The reality, Sunday afternoon, was

that it was raining about twice as hard, and about twice the quantity, on the southern and eastern rim of Manchester as it was on the western and northern edges. One doubts there has ever been a clearer geographical demarcation between the aforesaid fust and unjust than that, and yet, Sunday afternoon, in the breaking of the drought, the rain could measure four inches at one end of the town and

The purpose in noting such a differential is not to set up a complaint for one end of town or the other. Into each life, and every section, some rain must fall, and the minimum blessing for all hand of drought was lifted from the lawns and gardens and shrubs, so that the surface disaster which loomed was averted, perhaps not to return so hreateningly close again this year. If, in some other sections, the down-

pour was sufficiently greater in quantity to offer some touch of repair to the state of streams, ponds, reservoirs, and even the undersurface water table, that was a very nice extra dividend. There was ample reason, Sunday, for everybody to be happy, and absolutely no necessity for anyone to raise the possibility that some of those upon whom the beautiful cascades were falling might be more just than others. As an actual matter of fact, what we feel about a great drought-breaking rain is that, for the moment at least, for the purpose of fresh start at least, it grants a kind of absolution to everything it touches, from lawn to soul.
