Law Should Help Save Parks

In the fight to guarantee New Haven, Connecticut, a firm hold on park lands and open spaces which are in creasingly precious, the "save-the-park" law signed Thursday by Governor Dempsey becomes an important new

Connector, the new law — sponsored in
the General Assembly by Sen. Paul
Falsey — would require the approval of
the local aldermanic board or fown
council in any place where municipal
lands might be taken for a highway.
This makes sense. It provides for
hearings and — in a way that was nevpossible before — it invites direct resistance to the notion, so insistently held by highway planners, that publicly-owned parks provide one of the most-easily invaded routings for new high-

The new law is not a one-way law.

If the Highway Department finds a rejection by the local alderman unacceptable it may take its program to the Superior Court, outline its needs in full, makers, and seek a court decision in its

This may seem burdensome to the Highway Department — but it is a necessary protection in the face of the steady gravitation of expressways and superhighways, all across Connecticut, toward parks and preserves which have gone undefended until almost too late. Hartford's irreplaceable Bushnell Park has been swallowed up by a high-way.

the latest and most distressing of a decade-long series of bites — and swallows — which new roads have taken out of long-established and pleasantly remembered parks of the city. Armed with the new law, Connecticut cities and towns may - without any real loss of highway access or highway real loss of highway access or highway improvement — be able to stave-off the march of the buildozers in lands which were originally set aside because of their special beauty or recreational value.

As to the application of this law to the contested acreage along the Mill River in East Rock Park — the cutcome is still uncertain.

is still uncertain.

All of the land which the Highway
Department needs has not yet been
formally "taken" — and further takings formally "taken" — and further takings should, if the spirit of the law is to be upheld be offered to the New Haven Board of Aldermen for their approvat.

Such a procedure will probably be fought by the highway planners. But inconvenient as is the idea of abandonment in engineering terms, there is nothing yet on the record in support of the East Rock Connector project which really outweighs the natural damage it would do to the park and its environs.

The new law is to be cheered — and applied as fully as possible in the defense of East Rock against a superhighway which is unneeded and unwanted. — NEW HAVEN REGISTER.





### Observers Await Rally In Wall St

NEW TORK (AP) — One of Wall Street's cherished tradi-tions is the summer raily. And this year even those who scott at such things are watching the market closely for a sign of a sustained rally.


