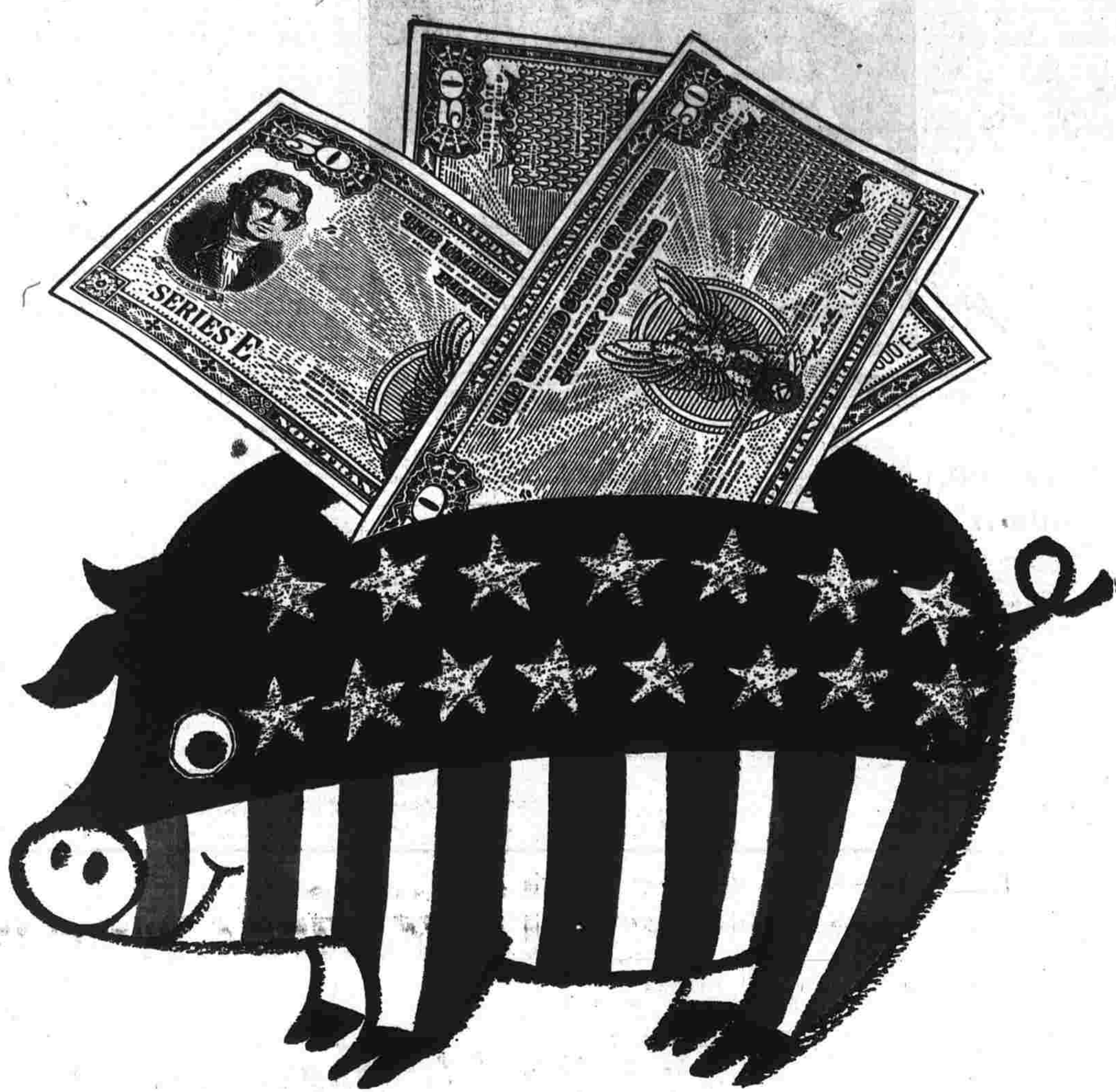

The survey, prepared by Bruce Ladd Jr., said Nixon's "errors were multiplied tenfold by presidential candidate Barry M. Goldwater in 1964, to the extent that Senator Goldwater became one of the least understood and most frequently misinterpreted candidates ever to seek the presidency."

Game Wardens Wage War On Alligator Poachers

NEW ORLEANS (AP) — Charges included killing alligators, possessing fresh-killed alligators, and aiding and abetting the taking of alligators in closed season.

NEW ORLEANS (AP) — Sweeping the sites with planes and churning through bayous in high-powered boats, Louisiana's game wardens are waging a blistering war on alligator poachers.

At least one warden was shot while chasing hide hunters.

There has been shooting in the swamps from both sides.

Wildlife agents are using the most modern pursuit equipment. The marshes are also being patrolled with two-way radios. And state judges are cracking down with jail terms of up to six months and stiff fines.

The trouble stems from a scarcity of alligators in Louisiana. The State Wildlife and Fisheries Commission, trying to increase the alligator population, has closed the hunting season for the past two years.

But the reptiles' tough skin remains in demand for the leather goods industry. Hides bring \$5 to \$6 a foot. Some hunters call it the "black gold."

"We're going to continue this strict enforcement until the legislature or the state board decides it's going to open the season," says Julius L. Book, enforcement division chief for the commission.

"Poachers go out in boats at night," says Book. "They wear a headlight on their side — something like a miner's light. They shoot when they spot the alligators, even redneck snipe in a redneck glow."

Other hunters use a long pole with a hook, he said, and snag alligators in their nesting grounds. It can be dangerous work, even for experts.

"Our plans have practically broken up daytime poaching," Book said. "They spot the alligators and radio their position."

"But we still haven't eliminated hunting at night. That's when alligators go out this time of year. One game warden was shot pursuing a violator."

Survivors Describe Attack by Viet Cong

SAIGON, South Viet Nam (AP) — "It was like seeing ants on an ant hill," said Sgt. Edward Chamberlain as he lay in his hospital bed.

The slender, blond 25-year-old from Watertown, N.Y., was describing the Viet Cong guerrillas who on Tuesday swarmed over the walls of the Vietnam special forces camp at Bu Dop, 80 miles north of Saigon.

Chamberlain, one of six American Army advisers in the camp, was wounded in the right arm. The other five Americans were either killed or wounded as they fled.

A U.S. military spokesman said the Vietnamese counted the bodies of 120 Viet Cong.

"We fired all night long," said Chamberlain. "The loud noise have been with me that night."

Chamberlain was on guard in the mess hall when the Communists opened the attack with mortar. He said the guerrillas were already in the camp by the time he got to a bunker.

"I had to take 30 steps to get to a bunker," he said. "I was three more times before I could lie down and just wait there."

Sgt. Willie Chesnam, 28, of Tampa, Fla., called the battle "five hours of hell." Chesnam was hit by submachine-gun fire. Two Americans with him were killed. He had to watch for them being hit as well as in front of him," he said. "I was suddenly an automatic rifle to hold the guerrillas at bay."

Chesnam, a husky Negro, said he first used an M79 grenade launcher, then switched to an automatic rifle to hold the guerrillas at bay.

"They moved toward the wall slowly and cautiously," he said. "Then they would charge and I'd open up on them."

"I looked to me like they were charging at a time when we'd get one group of six and another was right behind them."

But the total spending by the federal government decreased by only \$600 million, from \$85.3 billion to \$84.7 billion.

The White House said the fiscal 1965 deficit was \$3.5 billion — compared with the \$3.8-billion deficit which had been estimated in January. Expenditures dropped by a billion and revenues rose by \$1.5 billion.

WASHINGTON (AP) — General Accounting Office auditors told Congress Wednesday that almost half of 188,000 tons of corn sent to the United Arab Republic in 1961 — supposedly for free distribution — was sold.

The corn, worth \$2.7 million, was sent to the U.A.R. in response to representations that a crop failure had threatened a famine. The auditors said the corn did not fall and that no effort was ever made to find out if the corn got to the intended recipients.

WASHINGTON (AP) — The Reserve Officers Association, in a new move against the controversial Army Reserve-National Guard merger, said today a halt in the action is necessary to restore morale and effectiveness in preparation for possible Reserve call to active duty.

Brig. Gen. Donald S. Dawson, the association's national president, said that although international development and congressional reaction has forestalled the merger, no Pentagon order to this effect has been issued.

The statement said that, despite official disclaimers, the reduction-merger has actually been under way for some time. Dawson said that the merger should be abandoned as being "unsound" and should not be simply postponed.

Vernon Commissions Hear Talk On Training Programs

Members of three new local planning commissions met in joint session Tuesday night to hear educational recommendations of representatives of the University of Connecticut and the State Development Commission.

James Brennan, of Vernon, an associate professor for UConn's Institute of Public Service, presented members of the commissions with a book outlining the training programs available.

Following Brennan's talk, Philip Forley, head of the planning section of the State Development Commission met with the commissions.

Forley presented the second phase of an abbreviated training program, designed to equate new commission members with general phases of planning.

Forley's program includes an evaluation of the old programs of the former City of Rockville and the Vernon Fire District. Both sections have been united under the town's consolidation, which became a reality July 1.

Forley also presented outlines of a commission's preparation for selecting and working with a consultant, public relations; and Urban Planning Association Program as authorized by Section 70 of the federal housing act of 1964 (commonly referred to as the HUD plan).

One of the basic purposes of the 100 program is to assist municipalities in solving planning problems resulting from increased population, Forley said.

The program does this through grants of federal funds of up to two-thirds the cost of an urban planning program.

In discussing the role of a paid consultant in municipal planning, Forley noted that because of the increasing complexity of community development problems and solutions, the skills of professionals trained and experienced in specific fields of community planning are desirable.

He listed the steps needed in preparing for the employment of a planning consultant and warned that the educational phase of the local planning act is "the most important step."

"Without a working knowledge of the basic planning concepts," Forley said, "a planning program would be destined for failure through innumerable delays, lack of sufficient interest, and a general indifference to planning by agency members and the general public alike."

In his discussion on public relations in planning, Forley noted that the important objective is to thoroughly educate all to the purposes, aims, values and services of a planning commission.

Among his proposals were that a publicity chairman be appointed; full press coverage should be utilized; a mimeographed publication should be printed regularly; and before public, private and service organizations should be arranged.

Prior to the educational features of the meetings, all three boards met separately to work on by-law and other administrative details. No formal applications were considered.

Deposits Increase
