



The mint is geared to get into production quickly on the new coins and produce more than 3.5 million of them in the next year, he said.

There seems little doubt that such products as square strawberries, bananas, peaches and apples will make possible an economy of millions in the item of packaging and transportation costs alone. The slicing and preparation of all vegetables will be enormously simplified, and no ear of corn at picnics will be rolling off the paper plate into the dust at the crucial moment when it has been nicely dressed in its butter

Bouquet For The Authority

Unlike primitive societies which leave their aged and infirm to die, we are becoming more and more concerned with caring for our elders. Social and legis-lative action is increasingly oriented toward this end. One of the most notable and most re-cent examples of the trend is a medicare bill which puts to rest many of the fears which haunt the nation's

elderly.

Another earlier and equally important program—housing for the aged—has shown notable success in Bristol.

In less than five years the Housing Authority has built or pushed through the planning stage some 200 low rental apartments for Bristol's elders.

Bonnie Acres the city's first housing development for the aged, was barely occupied before a second project—the John F. Kennedy Apartments on Gaylord Street—was underway. Between them, they will account for 160 apartments.

Last Friday, the Housing Authority got the go-ahead on its third development when the federal government approved an allocation of \$900,000 for 60 more apartments here. The importance of these low rental apartments \$35 to \$45 monthly to their occupants cannot be over emphas Wherever state and federal projects have been built, housing boards have found oldsters paying exhorbitant rents for questionable apartments or else living with relatives in an atmosphere that was often uncomfortable to say the least.

There are some elderly persons, perhaps with better nerves and digestion than their fellows, who resent being "segregated" or relegated to "golden age ghettos." They enjoy having younger people around them.

Most of this age group however, welcome the companionship, the independence and the freedom from responsibility provided by housing projects for the elderly. the elderly.

The Bristol Housing Authority rates a vote of appreciation from the city for its efforts for the aged.

It has brought comfort and peace of mind to several hundred of Bristo's citizens.
