



Representative Michael L. Morano of Greenwich has called on the State Traf-Commission to put an end to the cowboy tactics of some truck drivers on the Connecticut Turnpike. The call should be heeded. If it is ignored, a public clamor is justified. The turnpike is no place for rodeo stars or jockeys. It is not a Wild West show or a race track. While the state can be more than satisfied with its safe-ty record over the Fourth of July week-end, driving tactics of some truck drivwill surely result in a horrible mul-

ers will surely result in a horrible mul-tiple crash.

The danger is not because of any lack of skill on the part of truck and bus drivers. The accident record of these professionals is good. But they seem to believe that all other drivers have equal skill. Some of their more flamboyant driving tactics frighten non-professional drivers half to death. This results in accidents or near misses in which the truck and bus drivers are not directly

There is no question that trucks and There is no question that trucks and especially buses habitually violate speed limits and lame regulations. This is dangerous and annoying to the citizen driver whose license is in jeopardy if he goes over the speed limit. Rep. Morano introduced a bill which would have made it illegal for trucks and buses to drive in any but the right lane except when passing. He was told that department regulations would better accomplish the purpose. He is calling on the commission for such regulations and for their enforcement. New Jersey has done it very well on its turnpike. Connecticut can do it if enough drivers become angry at the increased accident rates which results in increased insurance premiums and demand that trucks be kept in line. — STAMFORD ADVO-CATE.
