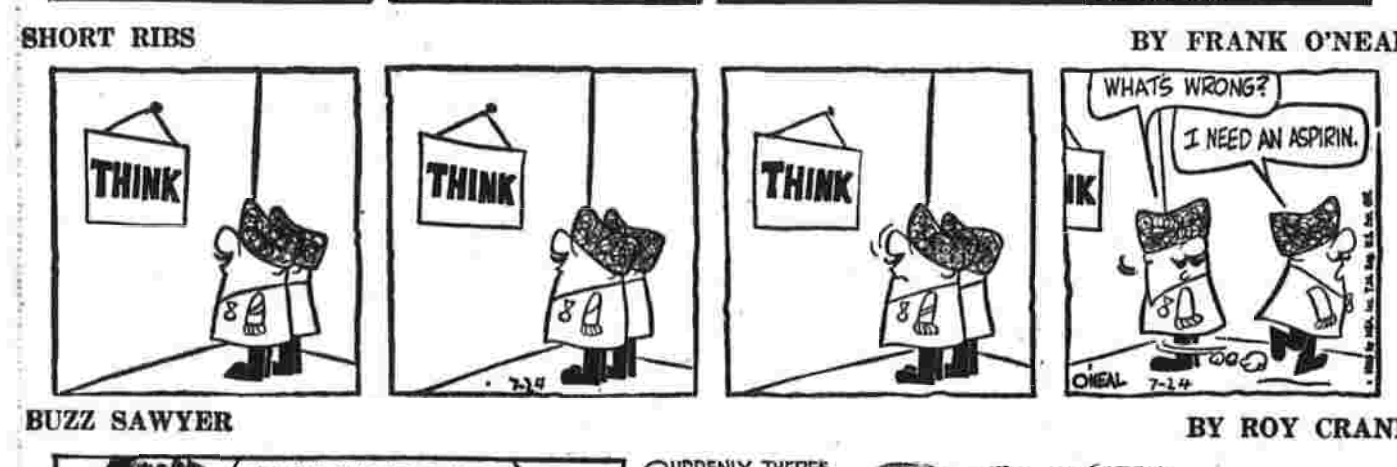

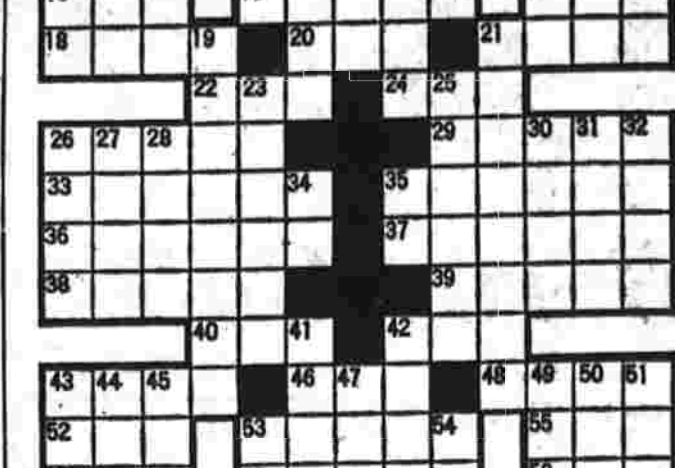

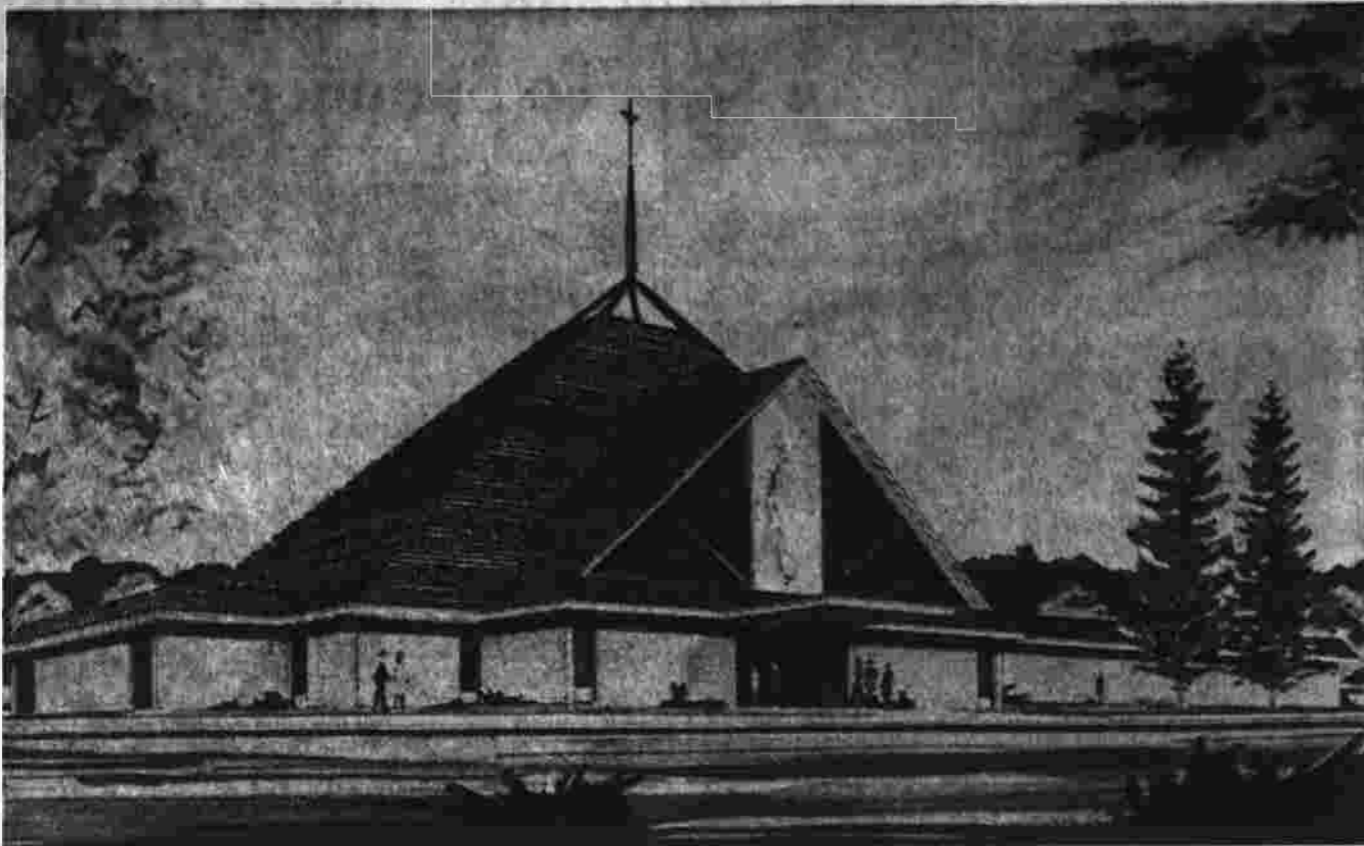

### Youth Group Plays Well

The Summer Youth Orchestra gave its final concert at Storrs last evening before embarking on a strenuous tour which will find it giving 15 concerts in the next two weeks. They played phenomenally well last night and at the end of fifteen more concerts they should sound like one of the world's greatest orchestras.

It is amazing that such relatively inexperienced players should have so thorough a grasp of the musical literature they essay, and when one considers that the results were obtained in a couple of weeks of intensive effort, the feat seems almost unbelievable.

Things started last night with the overture to Mozart's "Mozart on Fire." It should have preferred it with reduced forces but Dr. Heller utilized his entire resources, and although the work was technically well played, there was a heaviness of sound quite alien to the composer's style.

The heavy sound was excellently adapted to the Brahms Symphony No. 2 that followed. Here was a study purpose and thoroughly in keeping with the customary interpretations of the work. This was undoubtedly the highlight of the program, though everything on it was amazingly well done.

Brahms is pretty heavy fare for a summer evening, particularly a Brahms Symphony. Still it must be remembered that the orchestra members are at the concert for study purposes and not for a Brahms Symphony definitely belongs in the curriculum. This being the case, the second one is the best adapted to a summer audience.

**ON BOARD AGAIN**

Gov. John Dempsey reappointed Alfred Cavedon Sr. to the Connecticut Industrial Building Commission this month for a five-year term.

Cavedon, president of Aldon Spinning Mills in Talcottville, was one of the first five members of the commission when it began in 1961. He helped formulate its policies and goals. In 1962 the governor accepted his resignation after Cavedon found other obligations demanded too much time of him.

The commission's purpose is to help industry to expand building facilities and to encourage new industry to come into the state. When an industry wants to build, the commission will insure, after approval, 90 per cent of the mortgage necessary.

Ben Gallup, the executive secretary of the commission, says that the 1965 State Legislature authorized the commission to expand its area of procurement and financing of new machinery and equipment. He says that Cavedon is needed by the com-

mission to help handle this new duty because of his experience in industrial equipment as an industry head.

More than eighteen million dollars in mortgages were backed by the commission in the last three years for buildings, says Gallup. But he expects that the new duties of the commission involving machinery may entail even larger sums.

He is a member of the Manchester Memorial Hospital board of trustees, president of the Manufacturers' Association of Connecticut, president of the People's Savings Bank of Rockville, a member of the Associated Board of the Connecticut Bank and Trust Co., and president of his own spinning mill.

He is on the executive committee of the National Association of Wool Manufacturers and is a director of Woolkilt Associates, Inc. He is a trustee of the Connecticut Public Expenditures Council and is affiliated with the East Hadam Fish and Game Club, and the Manchester Chamber of Commerce.

Gallup says of Cavedon "He contributed immensely to the commission before he resigned in 1963. We are all very happy to have him back on."

## Having Fun In the Old Prison Camp

HOLLYWOOD (AP) — Bob Crane says he is gambling a sure \$150,000 a year on a new television show which, if it hits, could make him a millionaire in five years.

If it doesn't, he could be unemployed in 13 weeks. Crane, 37, is playing Hogan of "Hogan's Heroes," a show which CBS-TV believes is the prison camp answer to its successful "Sgt. Bilko" series of a few years ago.

Crane, like Phil Silvers, plays a service con man. He is interned in a Nazi prison camp during World War II, and although the Nazis supposedly run the camp, it's actually Col. Hogan who does.

"We're kind of a cross between James Bond and 'Von Ryan's Express,'" says Crane. "For instance, we've got the only prison camp with a steam bath for the inmates."

The show is a Bing Crosby production — another sign of success. Crane is one of Los Angeles' top radio personalities. His early morning show on KNX, the CBS outlet, is one of the town's most popular. It pays him \$75,000 a year. He gets another \$75,000 or more from his role as the doctor neighbor on "The Donna Reed Show."

"I can always get my old job back at Hornell, N.Y.," says Crane. There's where he started in radio at \$38 a week. The role of Col. Hogan marks an advance in rank for Crane, once a corporal in the Connecticut National Guard.

"Whenever anyone asks me what I did in the service, I just tell him I was a member of the famed 'Remington Raiders'."

Most people, he says, go away impressed. Actually, "Remington Raiders" is the term applied to the enlisted men who push typewriters.

"In fact, once at Camp Edwards in Massachusetts, I got wounded in the office. Spilled a cup of scalding water on my arm."

"But I showed up every day at the typewriter with my arm in a sling. The war must go on." Crane was picked for the lucrative Los Angeles radio job in an unique way.

"I was doing a show in Bridgeport, Conn., and getting offers for more money from Boston and other cities in the east."

"But I figured I would hold out for New York. Then one day, I got a call out of the blue from Hollywood from KNX. It seems that Ralph Story, who did the early morning show, was going back east to emcee the '\$64,000 Challenge.'"

"They hired me because my show was heard in the New York area and was cutting into CBS' rating there. So when Hollywood started looking, they asked New York who was giving them trouble."

"And my competition kindly mentioned me. They killed two birds with one stone — they got rid of a nuisance and hired a new boy at the same time." End Adv for Sat PMs July 24.

## Peter Breck Happy in a New Series

NEW YORK (NEA)—Peter Breck is very happy, thank you, to be in another television series.

His new series, ABC's "The Big Valley," with Barbara Stanwyck as the family matriarch of three sons (one illegitimate) is sort of a "Bonanza" in reverse. Breck hopes the reception of the color (like "Bonanza") series is as good.

"If you are a leading man in Hollywood, you either draw \$250,000 like Steve McQueen or you had better be in a series. It's difficult for leading men to work otherwise. If you're a character actor like Herschel Bernardi, you can work all the time, but not otherwise."

Breck's first series was "Black Saddle," in which he played a frontier lawyer. It was on for one and a half seasons.

"When I was in that series I weighed 140 pounds. (He stands 6 feet 1). When I went off I immediately gained 30 pounds, which helped because it changed my looks. Then I went to Warner Brothers. After all the brothers and cousins had been used up in "Maverick," they put me in the series as Doc Holliday."

"After that I went on my own, and boy, it was cold out there. You immediately find yourself in competition with people like Brad Dillman and Tony Franciosa, who had established themselves as good guest stars."

Breck turned down one series, which became a hit last season. "Maybe I was wrong, but I'm glad I turned it down. I was also close to getting 12 O'Clock High, but after what happened to Robert Lansing, I'm glad I didn't. I was also up for "The Fugitive," or so producer Quinn Martin told me. But he has never hired me to work for him."

During the time Peter was at Warner Brothers, he made two movies for them. The company was having a large party for its employees at the time both movies were playing across the country. "Jack Warner came up to me and said, 'How do you do? Are you with the company?'"

I said, 'Yeah.' He said, 'What do you do?' I said, 'I'm a grip.' He said, 'Fine, we're delighted to have you with us.' An actor doesn't mind being a prop, but he doesn't want to be told. You can print this, because I couldn't go back to work for Warner Brothers anyway. My price has gone up."

## Making the Monster a Fall Guy

HOLLYWOOD (AP)—I suppose there are many reasons why "The Munsters" became a hit, but I think the principal reason is that we were successful in our attempt to depict a monster as funny instead of frightening, and good-natured as well as grotesque.

This concept — the idea of making a bumbling fall guy out of a monster — was the brain child of Joe Connelly and Bob Mosher, producers and writers of "The Munsters."

Connelly and Mosher established the premise that, instead of the old adults-only horror approach, this would be off-beat comedy, something that would make the kids laugh rather than give them nightmares, and still have something to offer adults.

Then they left it largely to me to decide just how we would characterize our thinly disguised Frankenstein monster. This was no easy task, because we were dealing with an historic and readily identifiable movie figure, and we still had to give it our own distinctive touch.

To begin with, the original monster was a symbol of absolute terror who stood moviegoers' hair on ends decades ago. He was a real horror and no one — no one on this earth, at least — could identify with him.

Therefore we had to humanize our monster. The best way to do that was to make him fallible — more so than the average person. Hence there are times when Herman is the perfect caricature of the clumsy oaf, as likely to fall over a chair as to walk past it.

But beneath that horrendous exterior beats a second-hand

heart of purest gold. Our Herman emerges as just about the nicest person you could imagine, a gentle, childlike character, a loving husband and father, and righteous to the point of being downright square.

This, I think, is the source of much of Herman's appeal. While his physical strength is monumental, he can be as petulant and sensitive as a small boy. But he loves and seeks love as naturally as the warmest of human beings — although there is some question of his own warmth: Herman's niece, Marilyn, once asked if her temperature of 98.6 wasn't normal, and Herman said, "Oh heavens, no. We Munsters never average over 50 degrees!"

Another appealing aspect of the show is the Munsters' close family relationship. However grim their surroundings, Herman's morbidly lovely wife Lily, Dracula-like grandpa, son Eddie and Marilyn live together with Herman in an atmosphere of affection and respect.

They lead a normal family life, and it is this illusion of normalcy that enables the show to exploit its way-out comedy. Herman, whose mere glance shatters mirrors, simply cannot comprehend why people flee when he appears. The rest of the family feel the same way.

The unfortunate one in the family is Marilyn, with her blonde hair, blue eyes and peach-and-cream complexion. The Munsters smother her with sympathy and affection to let her know that she is loved in spite of her inadequacies.

Nearly everyone appears to like the Munsters, according to our fan mail, which has been

heavy ever since the show went on the air.

Children write to express their devotion to big Herman and his pals, and parents write to thank us for taking the "boo" out of the bogeyman by showing the kids that even a monster really can be a nice guy at heart.

In 'Gunsmoke'

Festus a Singer

By GENE HANDSAKER HOLLYWOOD (AP) — In Festus talk, the word "this" comes out "these-us." "That" is "they-it." "Brown" is "bray-own" and a love sonnet goes: "You're as purty as a mess o' possum livers a-sistin' in hog fat."

Festus is, of course, Festus Hagen, illiterate, drawing, straggly-bearded scalawag with a heart-of-gold on television's "Gunsmoke." He replaced Dennis Weaver as the comedy relief when marshal Matt Dillon's deputy Chester limped off into TV-land to attempt a series of his own.

Festus is, in real life, a handsome, blue-eyed, 48-year-old ex-promed student who bears the less picturesque name Ken Curtis and once was hired as Frank Sinatra's replacement with the Tommy Dorsey band.

"I am basically a singer," says Curtis in pleasant and wholly un-Festuslike accents that, when vocalizing, come out as a mellow baritone. His background includes six years with the Sons of the Pioneers, a series of musical Western movies with Big Boy Williams and parts in such films as "The Alamo," "The Quiet Man," "How the West Was Won" and "Cheyenne Autumn."

A Texas Ranger character he played in the movie "The Searchers" became "Monk" on two episodes of "Have Gun, Will Travel." Monk, in turn, was the model for Festus.

"Festus is from part of the country the dry lands of Southeast Colorado, the Texas and Oklahoma Panhandles and part of Kansas," said Curtis. "He's a combination of people I've known all my life."

When he affectionately calls Gunsmoke's Doc Adams "you old scudder," he uses an expression originated by his uncle. For the exclamation "well, golly-bill!" he is indebted to his father. Scriptwriters and deotors let Curtis ad-lib freely, as when he cons saloon hostess Kitty out of \$10:

"I'll pay you back before you can say 'A rat ran over the roof with a piece of raw liver in his mouth' — another of his father's phrases.

Curtis was born in Lamar, Colo. For six years his father was sheriff at nearby Las Animas, where the family lived in the jail and his mother cooked for the prisoners. When his father was away on business, 10-year-old Ken was jailkeeper.

At Colorado College, success as a songwriter for a campus production turned Curtis toward show business. After singing with Dorsey and Shep Fields, he served a wartime hitch in the Army.

Adoring autograph hunters now besiege Curtis. "They recognize this mangy beard," he explains. A make-up man regularly attends to its wild patches with an electric clipper.

Is he forever typecast as Festus? "Could be," he says. "I don't care. I've no great ambition to do shakespeare. I want to do what I can do best, and I think this is my cup of tea."

Face Slapped By a Dolphin NEW YORK (NEA) — Meet Brian Kelly, the only actor who has ever been slapped in the face by a dolphin.

Kelly, the adult human star of NBC's popular "Flipper," recalls his first scene with Susie, the dolphin who plays the starring role.

"The director Rico Browning set up a shot in which I was to swim behind Susie. He told me to treat her like a woman. We did the scene and I grabbed her and held on. She gave me a smack across the face with her tail. The next time, as we were setting up the scene, she swam close to me, and I pushed her away and turned my back. Just like a woman, she swam back to me and nestled in my arms."

Brian, the tall, handsome son of a former Michigan governor, has the feeling that with all the animals and children around, no one sees him.

"We had a pelican on the series who sat perched on a pier and didn't move for months.
