

### Gemini Men May Study Metal Plates

CAPE KENNEDY, Fia. (AP)-The Saturn 1 rocket concluded its flight program with a 10th straight success today and hurled into orbit Pegasus 3, a giant luminescent space bird whose "feathers" may one day be plucked by space-walking astronauts. A year or so from now, if the venture appears feasible, a Gemini astronaut wearing a rocket pack may leave his spacecraft and rip off detachagasus 3 to bring them back to gasis 3 to bring them back to earth for study.

The satellite joined two earlier Pegasus payloads already in space recording the impact of meteorites to learn how much of a threat they pose to lengthy manned space flight.

If an astronaut could return one or more of the paper-thin aluminum sheets to earth, experts would be able to learn more than radio signals tell.

perts would be able to learn more than radio signals tell. Saturn 1 thundered away from its launching pad right on schedule at 8 a.m. and spewed a tail of flame more than 300 feet long as it darted across the dark

The first-stage power plant, a cluster of eight engines, generated a thrust of 1.5 million pounds and the second stage fired with a 90,000-pound burst to drill the satellite into orbit about 200 miles high in the about 330 miles high — in the same orbital plane used by Gemini spacecraft.

The Saturn 1 will be succeeded next year by the more powerful Saturn 1B.

With such interpretation in the air -the same interpretation to which, we selieve, the American people and all our real friends in the world would like to hold actual American policy in the days, weeks and months ahead-Secretary General Thant would have been lelinquent indeed if he had failed to make immediate and positive response to the President, and thus staked out is own new license to move and act. So Secretary General Thant wrote as ollows: "Knowing the very great importance which I attach in the present droumstances to the question of Vietsam, you may rest assured that I look forward to continuous mutual consulta-

ion on this issue. "In this connection, Mr. President, dease allow me to thank you for your words about my efforts in the past to find some way to remove the depute over Vietnam from the battlefield to the negotiating table. I am heartened by your wish that my efforts should be continued, and I gladly assure you of my determination to pursue them by all the means at my disposal, since I believe most strongly that concerted efforts should be made to put an early end to all further hostile
