Radiation Studies in Hiroshima Continue

HIROSHIMA, Japan (AP)—At least 30 cases of leukemia died, 1% of them every year, on Aug. 8, the city of Hiroshima solemnly places a new name under the city's name under the name of the atom bomb.

Twenty-five toll doves wheel in the air and citizens of the first city to be hit by atomic weapons bow their heads in prayer.

But the truth is that despite research carried out by Japanese and American and European doctors and scientists on the effects of radiation from the Hiroshima bomb, no one can say positively that it causes or accelerates disease in humans.

Statistically, doctors and scientists have found that incidence of some diseases like cancer is much higher in persons exposed to the bomb. Despite this it has so far been impossible to say beyond doubt that radiation caused, encouraged or had nothing to do with the disease.

This conclusion was reached by Dr. James Neel of the University of Michigan. He examined all children born to bomb victims in Hiroshima from 1947 to 1964. Being genetic markers, he found no disturbances.

"That is something we can be very chary about. We like to know if it is one of the best things we have done," said Dr. Kenneth B. G. Johnson of Yale University, now in residence at the commission.

The commission has carried out many studies related to the bomb since 1947. It is jointly supported by the U.S. National Academy of Sciences-National Research Council and the Japanese National Institute of Health, a government agency. It has 800 Japanese and 20 American staff members.

Headed by Dr. George D. Darling of Yale, the commission is making an exhaustive survey of 10,000 persons, but not those exposed to the bomb. Matched by sex, age, they are periodically checked for survival curves and causes of death.

It is also studying a sampling of 20,000 children and adults to determine whether there has been any change in the occurrence of disease in relation to atomic exposures. They get detailed physical and laboratory examinations every two years.

"The most overwhelming, the most impressive and positive finding has been the development of leukemia in victims," said Dr. Johnson. "There was a long period between 1946 to 1963 when it did not appear to differ in their chemistry from the general population naturally. The theory is that radiation may be a catalyst which quickens leukemia rather than being a primary cause."

Statistically significant also, is an overall increase in malignant tumors. In the United States, there are 100,000 new cases of cancer each year.

When you have an ace in four suits with at least three aces, you should have a good play for game at notrump. How often are your opponents good enough to make the correct play in each of the four suits? This is the question that the declarer must ask himself.

West makes his normal spade opening lead—five of spades. East wins the trick and leads the ace of spades out of the dummy. East wins the trick with the king of spades and returns a spade to remove the side entry to dummy's long club.

Declarer leads a diamond from dummy, and East plays low. South must put up the king, since otherwise dummy's long suit would come in quite easily.

Declarer wins in dummy with the ace of clubs and leads another diamond. East must play low again, since otherwise the rest of the diamonds are good for South. South wins with the queen of diamonds and leads out the ace and queen of hearts.

Fourth trick. The declarer has played three aces perfectly and now make the right play. Lead the king of hearts. West returns to win the second round of hearts.

South leads a club to dummy. East holds out. South gets two tricks in each suit, but that is all.

If West took the king of hearts, the declarer would win and return a club. East would hold out, and declarer would cash dummy's jack of hearts and put East in with the ace.

Medicare and Social Security

Your Medicare and Social Security will be a wallet-size card resembling the kind State Troopers use to identify drivers.

It will signify you are eligible for Medicare and Social Security. It also will show whether you have bought supplemental health insurance entitling you to additional benefits.

The cards will be mailed by the Social Security Administration before you sign up for Medicare. But they are available to anyone who is eligible for Medicare and already getting money from Social Security.

Other people who are eligible for Medicare but who are not yet 65 years old may sign up for it before the 65th birthday. For example, a person who will be 65 on May 10, 1966, he could enroll for the supplemental insurance from Feb. 1, 1966, through Aug. 31, 1966.

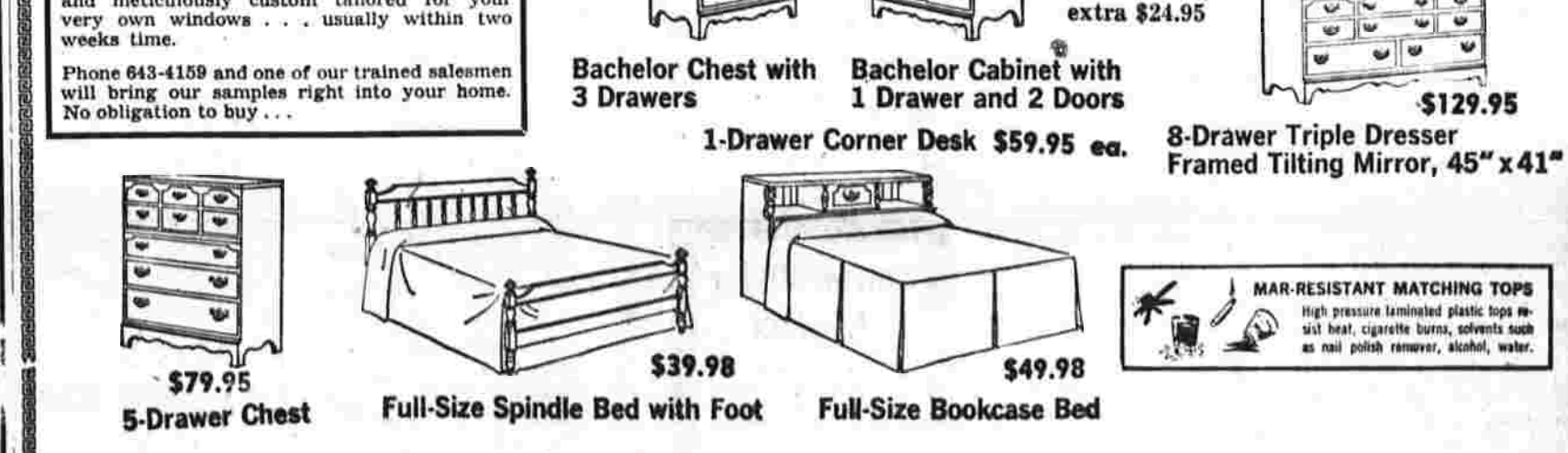

Navy Awaits First Draftees, Considers Extending Duty

WASHINGTON (AP) — The Navy set out today to muster the first draftees it has used in a decade. It also is considering involuntary extensions of duty for skilled men whose enlistments are expiring.

The service is suggesting that the total manpower be increased by about 20,000, but this figure is still under scrutiny by both Navy and Defense Department officials.

Pentagon call for the biggest Army draft quota since the Korean War, and the Navy has a similar provision for the Navy to get 4,000 draftees in October.

A Defense Department announcement Tuesday was the first official step putting into effect President Johnson's order to raise monthly draft quotas from the previous 17,000 level to as high as 20,000.

The department did these things: 1. Revised the 17,000 call for September, which was issued only 12 days ago, to a new total of 27,400 men, all for the Army. 2. Requested 20,000 monthly quotas at the post-war level since the 80,000 monthly quotas at the post-war level since the Korean War. 3. Specified that 4,000 of the October quota be for the Navy. The Marines and Air Force, as usual, requested no draftees.

The Navy's last request for draftees was made for two months late in 1955 and one month early in 1956 when the number of volunteers fell to the point where the Navy was under its required strength.

Humphrey Kept Aware Of Viet News

WASHINGTON (AP) — Vice President Hubert H. Humphrey has a voice in conferences which decide on the Vietnam war, but he is kept fully abreast of Viet Nam developments despite his extensive travels, aides said today.

When he travels, Humphrey makes certain before he leaves Washington that he has the latest word on foreign developments. When he returns he briefs the White House for a fresh fill-in.

In the weekend while Johnson was making some vital decisions in Viet Nam, the Vice President was commuting to the National Governors Conference in Minneapolis, Minn. The question arose as to how much time he had for participation in any part of the decision-making process.

Before he set out for Minneapolis, Humphrey sat down July 22 to lengthy, separate briefings from Secretary of Defense Dean Rusk and Secretary of Defense Robert S. McNamara.

On July 28 Humphrey flew into Washington for two White House meetings. The following day he attended a conference at which Johnson, McNamara, Rusk and others briefed congressional committee chairmen on the Viet Nam decision.

Boarding a plane, he stopped off at Detroit to address the National League of Cities. The next day he flew to Minneapolis for a speech at the Governors' annual state dinner.

Early the next day he was back in Washington, making the White House to get the latest developments.

His aides said that in this period he was being kept "fully abreast" of what was going on.

"UFOs are something that can be explained scientifically. I'm certain of that," Putnam says. "But the scientists and Air Force have been overlooking them under the rug because they can't explain them."

Putnam leans to the theory that the UFOs originate in outer space (possibly from "another dimension") and that their pilots are beings of great intelligence who have been checking us for centuries.

How come they haven't landed and zapped us with a heat ray? Putnam says the visitors are basically good guys, not of the heat-ray-zapping type.

All right. Why don't they land and do good?

Putnam offers: "They have seen that our technology is leading to disastrous results, and they don't think they can help us."

The stock market first appraised the outlook for increasing U.S. investment as a threat. And then it decided the moderate, if steady, stepping up of U.S. military effort would improve prospects for some industries while putting few blocks in the path of others.

So stock prices, which had slumped early last week during the period of rumors, went up again strongly when President Johnson said a state of emergency wasn't called for at this time.

Many businessmen feel that the real answer to how a larger war in Viet Nam will affect the economy won't come until late this year. But for the moment they see little reason to change their forecasts of continuing, if moderating, gains in general activity.

Increased military spending should in time aid the prospects for steel and other metals, for makers of military hardware from planes to bombs, for the railroads who will be carrying raw materials to the factories and military gear to camps or piers.

But stepping up military demands, at least within the bounds now foreseen, should drain little from the rest of the economy.

Even the cost of the Viet Nam war rises by \$10 billion or \$4 billion a year, as some congressional leaders forecast, the economy can take it in stride without skipping civilian production.

A look at July performance and August outlook helps explain business confidence.

Such leveling off of activity as July produced scarcely merits the designation of a summer slump.

Example: Steel production slipped from its record high set in the Spring. But this July was the best July the industry had ever had. Shipments through August seem likely to stay at around the July level.

It's September that the industry is watching now and mainly because of the uncertainty as to contract negotiations under the gun of a Sept. 1 strike deadline. But even if this fall finds many steel users living off the stockpile built up in

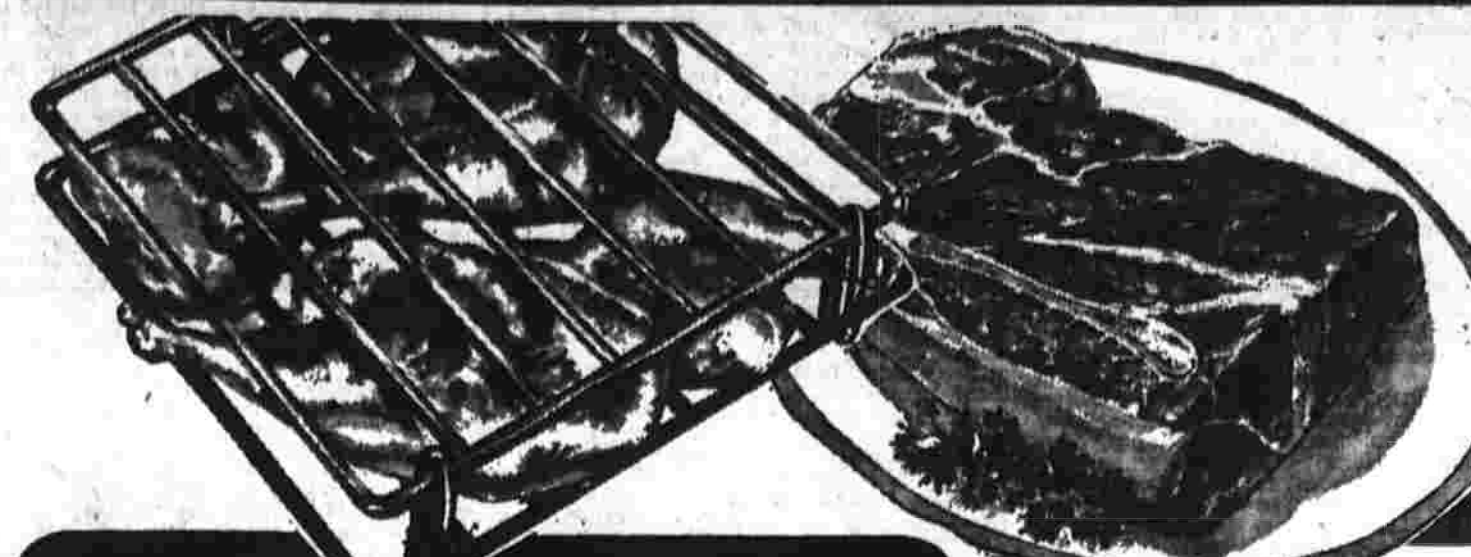

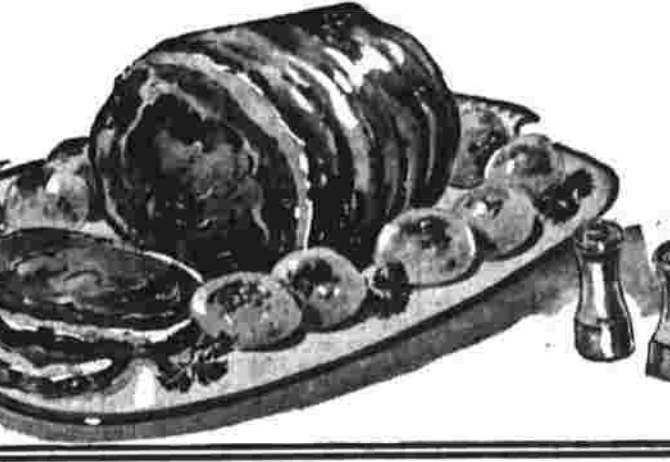

Vernon Town Races Against Time To Install School Sewer

Town officials and a Hartford engineering firm have begun a race against time to construct a sewer line connecting the new junior high school under construction on West St. with the town filtration plant before the school is completed next year.

The board of representatives Monday night appointed the firm of Anderson-Nichols, of Hartford, to act as engineer for the sewer project. A Richard Lombardi, a Vernon resident and member of the firm, reported that there is little time to waste in starting the sewer line.

The sewer line will be laid along Rt. 63 from the filtration plant, up Center Rd., along Peterson and Regan Rds., and across Rt. 50 to the school. Lombardi estimates that the line will take about three months to complete engineering plans. Much of the groundwork has already been laid by the firm, which recently completed a survey of the rural area of town under a federal grant.

Once the plans are completed, the town must advertise for a builder (that will start about one month), before construction starts. The school is scheduled to be completed by September 1966. Actual construction of the sewer line, necessary before the school can be occupied, will require an estimated five months.

However, it will be winter before construction can begin, and laying a sewer line in the winter is not always easy, especially considering other potential water problems, Lombardi told the town fathers.

"If construction starts in early spring," Lombardi said, "we are ready, then we can make it." The estimated cost of the line is \$380,000. The town's sewer advisory committee, also present at Wednesday's meeting, submitted its first report to the board of representatives.

In its report, the commission recommended: "That a sewerage trunk line be placed along Talbotville Rd. (Rt. 63), Regan Rd., Center Rd., and Peterson Rd., to West St. This line will accommodate the needs of the new junior high school, which will provide service for presently planned and proposed future building developments in this area."

Originally, the school sewer line was planned along West St. to South St. The report continues: "Preliminary estimates indicate \$100,000 would be needed to place a suggested trunk line along West St. for the sole purpose of servicing the new school. This sum includes the necessary pumping station, 4,800 feet of line along West St., and an additional 1,500 feet of replacement pipe within the city limits. (This would be necessary to handle the anticipated volume of flow.)"

"This commission feels that these monies would best be utilized if applied to the cost of the Center Rd. trunk line project. 'We believe,' the report continues, 'that trunk sewer lines are of a general benefit nature and therefore recommend that they should be financed as a general obligation of the town.'"

The consolidated charter requires that sewer lines be considered a general benefit nature and are of a general benefit nature and the cost of these (sewer) lines shall be borne of owners of properties which benefit from them."

The report also calls for assessments for feeder lines only. If a trunk line serves an abutting property owner as a feeder line, the owner will be assessed only on the basis of a feeder line, and not the more expensive trunk line.

Water Storage Still Declines

Water storage in the town's four reservoirs dropped approximately 48 million gallons during July, bringing the stored supply to about 60 per cent of full capacity. Porter, showed, hearing Brook and Globe Hollow Reservoirs measured approximately 25 million gallons on Monday, according to a report issued by Town Water Department Superintendent Lawrence Whitlocke. Total capacity is approximately 70 million gallons.

Whitlocke reported a July rainfall of 2.64 inches against a monthly average of 4.09 inches. Local rainfall, since Jan. 1, shows a deficit of 8.18 inches below the seven-month average of 21.4 inches. The town's reservoirs on Monday measured 13 million gallons below the storage of a year ago. 71.5 million gallons below two years ago, and 81.5 million gallons below three years ago.

Whitlocke said that the results of Monday's double-barrel rainfall have yet to be measured and that, for the present, the 5 to 8 p.m. ban on the outdoor use of water will remain in effect. He said that he will make a study of the complete local water situation before making recommendations for a more drastic ban.

Sixties in eastern West Virginia, recorded 27 degrees, eclipsing the record of 46 set for the date in 1912. Records also were established in Parkersburg, W. Va., 43; Charleston, W. Va., 44; and Philadelphia, Pa. The previous low mark in Philadelphia for Aug. 4 was 59 degrees in 1945.

Temperatures throughout most of the Northeast were low normal. Davenport, Iowa, got 1.67 inches of rain during the night. 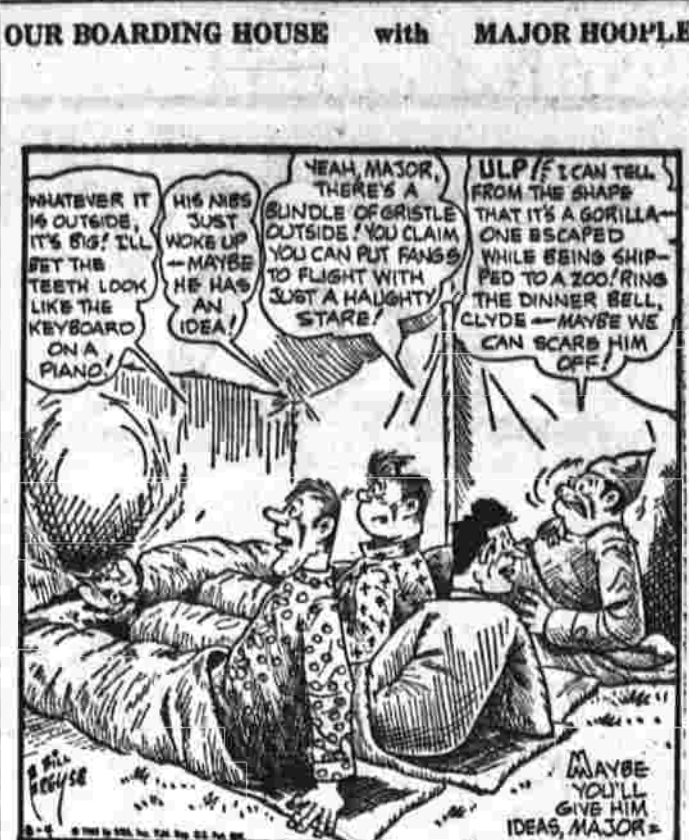
