



Kirstaedter says RIAS pro-grams are widely listened to in the Soviet Union itself, "espe-cially our popular or jazz music shows."



ymour Topping, one of the New rk Times correspondents in Saigon, sported the other day on the nature of the propagands being broadcast by iberation radio," which is the regular radio station of the rebel Vietcong. Correspondent Topping's report left doubt that the Communist Vietcong get the last full measure of comfort, and then some, out of any items of debate about Vietnam back here in this

The Victoong radio tells the peasants of Vietnam that most of the American people actually support the guerrilla cause. As proof, it cites every scrap of news it can get about public protests in the United States against President Johnson's Vietnam policies. It cites the debates on American college campuses, and meetings of protest by American left-wing groups, and, one supposes, the continual fulminating against "McNamara's war" by Senator Wayne Morse of Oregon, plus the occasional perhaps more meaningful questionings which have come from other members of the Senate. One supposes, also, that the Communist radio propaganda in Vietnam has used editorials in the New York Times which have questioned the wisdom of purely military escalation as a policy, and columns by Walter Lipp-

has gone far enough, the Vietcong radio have been unhappy about some policy decisions in Vietnam, just as the polis reveal the American people themselves

In any case, what they can find and quote Vietcong propagandists use, according to Correspondent Topping, in making their own claim that so many Americans back their cause that this country is seriously divided, which means that the Vietcong are certain to win in the long run because to quote some of the broadcast language "righteous United States and British citizens all came to the conclusion that U.S. imperialists are stupid and criminal ag-

One could go on, quoting Topping quoting the Communist propaganda, but the important point has already been established. Almost any word or gesture of disagreement, here in this country, with the Johnson policy in Metnam is likely to be taken and exaggerated, by the Communist propagandists in Vietnam, into a distorted amount of comfort and assistance to

This raises the issue to which there are two sides, but only, of course, one real answer. Should Americans who disagree with

something their own President does hide and submerge their difference of opinion and criticism because it might lend some comfort to the Communists? What should good Americans do when they think and feel a Presidential decision is wrong, mistaken, dangerous, and doomed to failure? Decide to keep quiet and go with the ship, whatever happens to it? Or speak up and try to get some sorrective action and policy started, even if this does advertise to the world that there is a dispute over direction and helmsmanship here at home?

Those who answer such questions most loudly keep repeating that the most important thing of all is never to give aid and comfort to the "enemy," and that those who deliberately run the risk of doing this by disagreeing with their President's policy deserve to be And those who think and argue this

way will point to Topping's report from Saigon as full and conclusive proof of their argument.

We are certain the other answer and the only real answer almost automatically suggests itself to most other Americans. We could give the Communist world no greater good news, no greater portent of hope for itself, than proof of a collapse of our own democratic privileges and strengths. We could court no greater disaster for ourselves and for the country we cherish than the disaster of complete surrender of our own responsibilities and voices as citizens and institutions.

Indeed, every Communist-Indoctrines-

Cigarettes are the most lucrative commodity. To get them from Switzerland into Italy smugglers use helicopters, submarines, frogmen, eatapults, dogs, tunnels and even a home made ski lift.

Italy has a state tobacco momopoly. Many Italians have picturesque but not very complimentary Latin expressions to describe the local digarette brands.

They prefer imported foreign makes, particularly American. In Italy these cost 70 cents a pack. In Switzerland the same pack costs 27 cents. Thus smuggling can be profitable.

Italian guards find it impossible to patrol the whole border efficiently. The Swiss take little interest in the traffic — they even grant export licenses.

Swiss officials admit that the smuggling provides a healthy export boost for a country which runs a billion-dollar trade deficit annually.

The latest available figures show that Swiss exports of to-bacco to Italy were worth \$22 million in 1963. According to the Italians, they legally import to-bacco from Switzerland worth only \$452,000.
