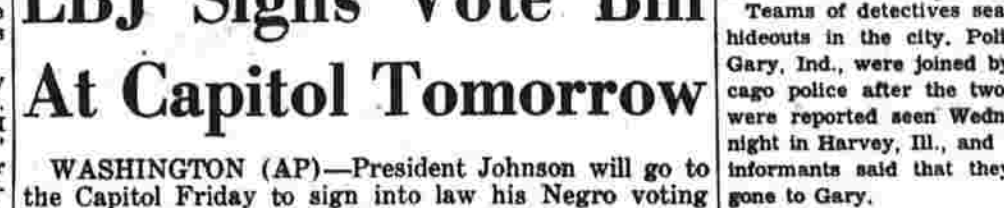

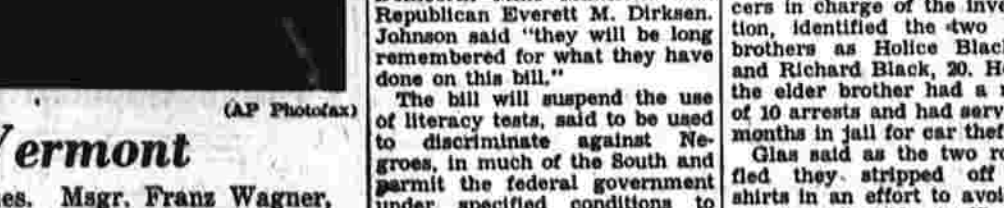

stander civilians. And, in the ultimate war which lies not too far beyond our present level of willingness to fight each other, there will really be no civilians at all, and those who used to be classified as civilians will probably be the ones who would be killed first, an hour or two before the people wearing uniforms. But the jungle war in Vietnam seems, for all its avoidance, so far, of nuclear weapons, for all its relative innocuousness, to have an unusual curse upon it. Both we and the Vietnam seem to have better luck finding and killing innocent peasants than we do finding and killing each other.

So long as on-the-scene coverage continues and so long as the war and its participants continue to grow tougher, the more we are likely to hear and read, for a time, of some of the incidental horrors of war. Later, as the war intensifies, and the incidents repeat themselves more often, we will grow less conscious of them. But they will still contain the same cruel mockery of humanity's proper purpose here on earth as they do this week, when even our Marine commanders have found the time and grace to apologize for the killing of a child or to promise to try to see that it doesn't happen again. It is more likely that the next time it happens nobody will notice. That more than any individual incident of horror, is the real price, the real terror, of war, and the ultimate reason why civilized man should be sure to employ every civilized resource before he resigns himself to the beast we can all train ourselves to be, if we have to.

Along with the torments of a drought year—the clouds which pass unmoved and unrelenting overhead no matter how fierce the imprecations we hurl up at these barren beauty that is the clearing which comes after no rain—there are compensations. When rain does come, what an instant, powerful magic it does work! Cucumber vines will double their area. Tomatoes, overnight, will be one third as large again. Pepper plants that never bloomed will suddenly display middle-sized green knobs. Lettuce leaf out and head; pumpkins explode with blossoms as big as pumpkins; the whole improvement comes about in a matter of a few days. When rain does come, what an instant, powerful magic it does work!

It took them all day, and they killed a few civilians in the process of firing into and setting fire to the village huts, and they would have killed more, according to the American correspondent's cable to his network, if he himself hadn't talked them into letting somebody who spoke the native language call in the huts and advise the people to come out.

Vernon New Court Proposed For Renewal Area

A proposal to construct a new court on the former Rockville Leader site in the redevelopment area was disclosed last night at a meeting of the Rockville Redevelopment Agency.

First Hartford Realty Co. has expressed interest in the judicial facility, a pilot project, said Henry Fugel of the agency.

The project was discussed recently by state legislative officials in Vernon's town hall. The court is considered adequate, and much of the site is already cleared.

Under the state's proposal, the court would be constructed by a private developer, then leased by the state.

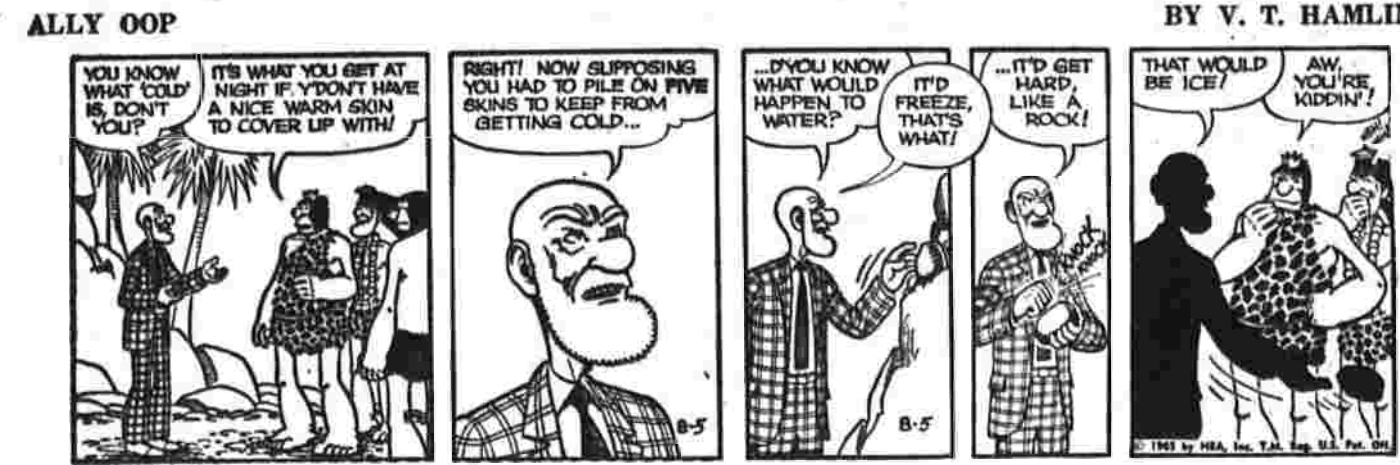
