

Saturday, August 7 Welcome Meddlers

The last we looked, the famous Andre Malraux, President de Gaulle's Minister of Culture, had just achieved the year's most successful penetration of the Asian Communist atmosphere and had spent a grand total of seven hours in consultation with the heads of state of Communist China and was triumphantly on his way back to Paris to bring to President de Gaulle and to the West the down-to-earth facts about the

prospects for peace through negotiation in Vietnam. It was in the same day's news that the Foreign Minister of the African nation of Ghana, Alex Quaison-Sackey, was flying his way to Washington with a special message on Vietnam from President Kwame Nkrumah to President Johnson. The special message supposedly concerned the recent penetration of Hanoi, in North Vietnam, by President Nkrumah's special envoy. At the same time, President Nasser

of the United Arab Republic is supposed to be making "soundings" in Peking and Hanoi, a mission he is undertaking after consultations with President Tito of Yugoslavia and Prime Minister Shastri of India. At the same time one can assume

that United Nations Secretary General Thant, having just received his first cordial go-ahead signals from the United States, has been busying himself somewhere in the area between the bel-Research in Vietnam There is all this activity. Considering

that the life of all humanity may be at stake, any neutral or disengaged statesman who didn't try to see if something couldn't be done about Vietnam would be a fool. Not to meddle may be to join in an act of suicide. The situation howls for meddlers.

Nonetheless, at the risk of encountering a pleasant surprise to the contrary, we will venture the opinion that none of these meddlers will prove able to bring out of Hanoi or Peking anything that the responsible policy makers sitting in Washington will feel able to consider the basis for peace or even for a start of negotiation. We doubt that anybody will be able

to bring out of Hanoi or Peking indication that the Asian Communist movement is willing to settle for something Washington will consider reasonable This is as sad and discouraging as any blank wall can be. But, even while we wonder what recourse that leaves us, we might try to engage in a little mental gymnastics. Suppose we imagine that these same emissaries, these same would-be intermediaries, were all heading in the direction of Washington, to ind out what kind of hints or propositions they might carry to Hanol or Peking. Would they be able to take over to Hanoi or Peking, on the basis of their conversations in Washington,

anything that responsible Communist officials could publicly consider a basis for peace or even for negotiation? Strangely enough, although Hanoi and Peking say they will discuss nothing but four points, and although Washington says it is willing to undertake egotiations which are "unconditional," one gets the impression that both sides add up to about the same thing - especially as either side would have to be reported, through intermediaries, to the other. Our willingness to negotiate is "imconditional" in slogan, but full of onditions, one can believe, as it appears to Communist leadership. And our official language of statesmanship on the Vietnam issue is so full of alterating swings of emphasis, as we alternate between the wings of the dove and the hawk, that it is no automatic matter to conclude that even the neutral intermediaries now at work in the world consider it much easier to lead us to the negotiating table than it might be to lead the Asian Communists. They do pay us, these intermediaries, the compliment — sometimes perhaps the unintentional compliment, but the telling compliment just the same - of sensing that it is to Peking and Hanoi that they must go first. And we Americans ourselves hope and believe, most of us, that our national policy leaning is and should be toward a peace which is both honorable and civilized. But noth-

ing can make the self-appointed task of

precious meddlers, an easy task. There is no easy language, there are no easy terms, between antagonists who have the world in their teeth.

The Revolution And The Law Dr. Martin Luther King wreatles, occasionally, with the question of whether or not civil rights demonstrators have a right to be a law unto themselves. Does the unjustice suffered by a great group of American citizens in our past history entitle them to break some of the technical rules as they pursue their revolution? Can it be argued that they have to challenge some existing law in order to make their dramatic point with the

Dr. King handles this question with a suave and expert use of his mind and vocabulary. He makes it sound quite plausible, that we must forgive demonatrators something because of the long suffering, the long injustice, which lie in the past, and because of the great cure which has to come, quickly, if we are all not to perish of our failure to be able to live together in one society, one nation, one world. When he gets through explaining it, most of us are willing to forgive the civil rights demonstrators and agitators almost anything, even that non-violent strategy which so often seems almost to ask for violence.

But we are likely to have, most of us, some troublesome second thoughts, as soon as we slip away from Dr. King's soft persuasiveness. The civil rights movement is a movement in law as well as in the hearts and minds of men; the institution of the law is fundamental not only to the original proclamation of those rights which are civil, but to their protection and implementation. All this may also explain why many

of us will know we are reading something that has to be said, and maintained, not only by the courts themselves, but by the leaders of our internal social and economic revolutions, when we read what Federal District Judge Frank M. Johnson, Jr., said down in Alabama the other day as he refused to take the cases of some 150 civil rights demonstrators out of the hands of local authorities in Montgom-

What Judge Johnson said was this: "The philosophy that a person mayif his cause is labeled 'civil rights' or 'states' rights'-determine for himself what laws and court decisions are morally right or wrong and either obey or refuse to obey them according to his own determination, is a philosophy that is foreign to our 'rule-of-law' theory of government."

Judge Johnson took pains to make it equally clear that "this does not mean to say that peaceful, orderly and lawful demonstrations for purposes of dramatizing grievances or protesting discrimination can ever justify arrests and prosecutions." We are living in an era when there

isn't the slightest doubt that the lines laid down by this federal judge are being violated all the time, both ways. There are obvious instances when the law is perverted, by those in charge of its enforcement, and obvious instances when it is trampled on by agitators. One thing that has to be learned, in process of our revolution, is that both

kinds of twisting of the law have to be stopped. And the very first thing we all have to learn, in that connection, is that one kind of law-twisting does not justify or excuse the other, no matter how emotionally plausible or just it may seem to one partisan or the other. We have to have, at the center of things, the law. And it has to have a reasonable chance of standing and being respected for itself, and for not becoming the pliant creature of any faction's will.





Scarcely a week passes but that my attention is directed to someone who virtually has lost his faith in Christianity as he knows it. These miserable persons have been perceptive enough to see and objective enough to admit the serious shortcomings of their church.
