The Pope On Hiroshima

There may be some Americans who will resent the language Pope Paul VI used in his remarks commemorating the atom bombing of the Japanese city of Hiroshima. We have been hearing a great deal, on this 20th anniversary of he bomb, from our own people who built and ordered the bomb dropped, in justification of our national decision. But rather than rely on that defense, to refute the Pope, we might forgive him his quarrel with our past record, and try to turn, as we might turn to life itself, to some sharing of his hopes for the future—a more resolute sharing than we have yet demonstrated to our own national leadership.

Pope Paul, with faint deference to the fact that our attack on Hiroshima was "intended to seek" peace and a shorter war, called that attack an "infernal massacre" and an "outrage against civilization." We know that just as many people

were killed by conventional bombing attacks. We know there is just as much sin and barbarism in one death by violence as in 75,000. But again, let us not quarrel with

the Pope. Let us admit the great human tragedy in which we have been participants. Let us aim at something nobler and higher. "We pray," Pope Paul continued his

remarks, "that the world may never again see such a wretched day as that of Hiroshima; that never again may men put their confidence, their calculation and their prestige into such disastrous and flishonorable weapons. "Let us pray that murderous device may not also have killed peace in the world - although it was intended to wounded the honor of science forever and quenched serenity of life on this earth. . . . "

And Pope Paul asked for prayers that all nations "unanimously and loyally proscribe the terrible art of manufacturing, multiplying and stockpiling these weapons for the terror of people." We do place our "confidence, calculation and prestige" into these same weapons. So do an increasing number of other nations and peoples. Nobody seems capable of giving up the "terrible art." Everybody wants to get into

The blow at Hiroshima, because if carried the minds of men farther into an acceptance of massacre than ever before, may indeed "have killed peace in the world." Let us not be too sure we may not

need to have the grace to repent, rather than defend ourselves, before we glimpse any formula which says that Hiroshima was not a final act and commitment.

Swapping Armies?

An American correspondent visited a West Germany army training camp the other day. One of the things he reported was reassuring. Another was alarming. It was reassuring, we think, that he

found the German captain in charge of toughening up his recruits talking about them as follows: "Look at them. Almost all of them are in poor physical condition. It is our biggest problem. Our young men are too soft these days. They all have cars

and drive down to the corner store instead of walking." That's the kind of remark that will please American drill sergeants, and American peace lovers, too. The alarming side of the report from

the training camp of the new style German army consisted of information that the recruits of today are being taught to march by singing songs instead of by using the goose-step, and that, in keeping with that kind of atmosphere, the new German recruits are even being taught to think for them-And the way the German training

captain illustrated this was downright frightening. "For example," he said, "an American officer will show his soldiers a bridge and say, The enemy is on the other side of that bridge. Here is how

you must take that bridge and attack he enemy'. "I will say to my troops in the same situation, Here is a bridge and the enemy is on the other side. What is your goal and how must you go about reaching that goal?' Then I expect my re-

cruits to figure out a way to take the bridge and attack the enemy." Now this, if we were to believe it, would indicate that it might be the Germans who would win the next war they find themselves in and that I might be we who would be losing it. For what this German officer was saying was that Germany was finally trying to create the kind of think-for-yourself army that actually wins wars, thus profiting from its experience in two world wars, while, at the same time, the United States, with a perversity nobody can really understand, has been shifting in the direction of imitating the kind of do-it-by-rote armies which lost two world wars. It is understandable enough why the losers in a war should eventually come to the point where they might consider imitating
