Roberts Winner in Astro Debut

NEW YORK (AP)—The Philadelphia Phillies' manager, Gene Mauch, said today that Robin Roberts did not fit into his plans for the team's rotation. Roberts, who made his debut for the Phillies last night, pitched a complete game, winning 5-1 against the Los Angeles Dodgers. Mauch said that Roberts' style of pitching, which relied heavily on his fastball, did not fit the rotation plan he had devised for the team.

Roberts was acquired from the Los Angeles Dodgers in a trade with the Phillies in late 1964. He pitched for the Dodgers in 1964 and 1965, winning 18 games and losing 10. Roberts' debut for the Phillies was a complete game, a feat he had achieved only once in his previous four seasons with the Dodgers. He pitched for 194 minutes, throwing 130 pitches, of which 81 were strikes.

The Phillies were looking for a starting pitcher who could give them a boost in their performance. Roberts' performance last night was a strong indication that he could do the job. The Phillies' record is currently 14-16, and they are in a tight race for the second place position in the National League East.
