In The End, It Was Mandatory

The real question about medicare, under present social and economic condilons, might be phrased this way: "What ever made anybody think we could get along without it?" The component factors in the situation which almost makes medicare

mandatory are obvious and known to

1. People retire earlier in life.

2. People live longer. 3. People who are retired and living longer no longer retire to live with their children, or to be supported by their children. 4. Retired people living longer by

themselves and on their own fixed retirement resources need medical attention and services. 5. The cost of attention and services keeps climbing in accordance with an inflation which does not, however, step up the fixed incomes of the retired peo-

6. There are only two ways in which the bills for such medical expense can be met-through insurance held by the people involved, or through welfare department payment of their expenses

insurance plan which can reach and service those who would need it most. Anybody who wanted to fight medicare, then, would have had to start a long time ago-opposing the idea of having people retire earlier,-warning that, if we wanted to have people drink the fountain of youth, society would have to pay for the privilege of longer life-battling inflation in all its insidious and intoxicating influences in our life-and arranging for old people to

live with their own children rather than in apartments, homes, or villages of It rather seems, indeed, as if all anybody needed to do to prevent medicare was to repeal the twentieth century. Some of us might jest with the idea of voting for that. But all any of us ever really did, while the whole pattern was building, was to quarrel with some special cutting edge it may have turned toward us now and then. For better or for worse, the whole package is here, and the time was fast coming when we should have had to hang our national head in shame if we didn't see to it that medicare was also provided. The differences of opinion in the past should merge into one good resolve to make it work, to its best efficiency for all. and with proper respect to the dignity of all, patient and practitioners alike,

### Two-Way Ambassador?

James Reston in the New York Times has described how he thinks Ambassador Arthur Goldberg is going to function at the United Nations, and, even more importantly, at Washington. And the picture Reston draws is the picture many of us have fashioned in our hopes and what the world needs perhaps desperately. "Mr. Goldberg," writes Reston, "did

not resign from the Supreme Court of the United States in order to provide 'the U.N. with cold war speeches written by other men in Washington. He is a militant peacemaker, and while he will carry out the policy of his Government, he will be in on the making of it, or he'll be out of it in a hurry." "The importance of the Goldberg apointment," Reston thinks, "is not so much what he is likely to do at the U.N. in New York as what he is likely to do within the private councils of the Government in Washington. He will be influential here, not because he is diplomatic but because he isn't.

He is, says Reston, a "pugnacious dove' who is now likely to join "the very few in Johnson's upper inner circle who believe more can now be done by imaginative and persistent diplomatic explorations than by increased

military violence." Reston wraps up his theme by saying that "Goldberg will not only be the U.S. Ambassador to the U.N., but, on the side, the Ambassador of the U.N.

and the peacemakers in general to the United States."

What Reston thus gives, as his opinion about Goldberg, is the most significant and valuable kind of assurancethat here is a man who believes in something strongly enough to fight for t-and, if need be, to refuse to lend his face and voice and name to any slight and subtle and convenient and practical betrayal of his own beliefs. it is possible to hold that, with all his brilliant service to his country and

his world and his time, the late Adlai Stevenson provided a tragic disservice to his country and to himself as well as to the U.N. on those occasions when he stood up and said to the world the things he himself could not possibly It is not known that there is, in the

nner circle discussions of the Johnson Administration, a single advocate of that moderation Senate Majority Leader Mansfield is supposed to have advocated in that policy paper he took to the President's discussion of the Viet-

But now it is possible-or so Reston seems to believe or hope—that the considerable body of sentiment in Congress and in the country which would like to see President Johnson hold to the course he has taken publicly-and not be engaged in step by step yielding to the hawks behind the cover of such moderate words-has a representative and ally who will get in to the inner circle and who will at least be heard.
