Deaths in June totaled 4,190 compared with 3,950 in June 1984. This brought the six-month count up to 21,920, a rise of 3 per cent above 21,230 of the first half of last year.

SAIGON, South Viet Nam (AP)—Vietnamese government forces today claimed a toll of about 250 Viet Cong after pinning down a Viet Cong concentration in the Mekong Delta 90 miles southwest of Saigon. the Mekong Deita 90 miles southwest of Saigon. Viet Cong were killed in heavy ground fighting and another 100 were estimated killed by air strikes. Government casualties were reported light. U.S. military sources said they considered the Vietnamese figures "pretty good" estimates, although there apparently was no complete body count. The major fighting came Thursday afternoon during a government operation 15 miles southwest of Can Tho. Taking part in the sweep through the canal-laced, rice paddy free were army, ranger, armandar regional force personnel accompanied by U.S. advisers. U.S. spokesmen said the force pinned the Viet Cong down on a wide front. Helicopters lifted in ranger units to cut off the guerrillas. U.S. and Vietnamese air force planes flew SS sorties against the Viet Cong, spokesmen said, and forward air controllers estimated 70 buildings were destroyed and about 40 others damaged. U.S. military spokesman and the control of Saigon and five miles from the Cambodian border, had been under siege for more than two months. Large numbers of troops were moved into the area early this week to relieve the pressure on the camp.







The "Improbable Kingdom" It will certainly come as news, which Correspondent Robert Keatley of the Wall Street Journal certainly realized as he reported it the other day, that what he calls the "improbable Kingdom of Laos" happens to be enjoying a

mild touch of normalcy and progress in the midet of the Asian turmoil. There are all kinds of unsound and insecure reasons for the fact that, in this part of the old Indo-China, things seem to be going from worse to better instead of from bad to worse.

Prince Souvanna Phouma, the one of the three princes who now heads what is supposed to be a coalition government in Laos, is getting one kind of break because the energy of the Communist-affiliates in Southeast Asia is currently being devoted mainly to the mituation in South Vietnam. The Laotian national army has even won a few battles against the Communist guerril-

las of Laos. Prince Souvanna got a break from the other direction when, last winter, he succeeded in snuffing out a revolt and attempted coup from the domestic right once closely affiliated with American policy in Laos.

Temporarily free of the sharpest threats from either left or right, Prince Souvanna has been building up his own strength in the middle, and Correspondent Keatley was able to notice, to his amazement, the beginning of some kind of attack on the corruption functioning of governmental depart-

The election of a new national as sembly has even been accomplished The national police force that used to specialize in lending its tanks and mortars to one political coup or another has been stripped of its war-sized equipment and even been required to

spend some time directing traffic. Such small gains have come in spite of, or along with, the fact that much of the countryside is under the same kind of local Communist control as that in Vietnam. And the whole thin structure of hopefulness might be blown down, in an instant, by any conclusive Communist victory in Vietnam.

Nonetheless, Correspondent Keatley in the country to witness the start of a meeting under U.N. auspices to work out plans for a new hydroelectric dam which may become the first tangible project under President Johnson's new aid program for Southeast Asia, is able to report what he reports, from a country where truce and coalition were considered foolish and incapable of fostering anything except chaos.

The "Folly" That Was Wisdom

Among those who would urge us to convert the war in Vietnam into a full and final showdown with the forces of world Communism, no tactic is more cherished than that of referring in sneering terms to the outcome of the war in Korea. By calling that outcome a "folly" and

a betrayal of the traditional American belief in "victory," they hope to build up a consensus which will reject any peacemaking or negotiating or anything less than the final checkmate of Communist China from the present conflict in Vietnam .

The more they repeat themselves he more often they use such words, the more they seem to think they have succeeded in promoting the idea that everybody agrees with them, and that they are citing history, not their own

It seems almost endlessly necessary, then, for those who disagree with such opinion, and who do not think it is a fair and accurate account of history, and who do not think it represents any present consensus among the American people either, to keep reiterating what they think is nearer the truth and near-

The war in Korea was fought as a police action as well as a war. It was, after some vacillation of policy in Washngton, finally fought as a war to repel aggression ,not to conquer territory or destroy even the aggressor. Because t was fought under such a label, and with such a final objective, the war in

Morea was, in the end, confined Kores. Its "victory" was for peace rather than for any nation or alliance It represented the prototype of the only kind of war this world can afford have a police action fought to enforce a world law against aggression.

Rather than failure or folly, then, i represented, the war in Korea, a kind of success for the cause of civilization And rather than a betrayal of tradi tional American concepts, it represented the finest American leadership o the precise kind our own finest principles would want to have us provide the

We do not believe all Americans ac cept the verdict that it was folly, or something that should never be re peated. We believe, to the contrary, tha a great majority of Americans recognized it as the world's first successfu effort to deal with the problem of ag gression in such a way as to keep th conflict from engulfing the whole world, and to do it without sowing the seeds of endless future wars. But whatever the actual state

American public opinion may be, the proponents of the "no Korea in Viet nam" crusade should not be allowed to think they have established their premise and won their argument just by repeating, incessantly, their own claim that our conduct in Korea was "folly." In that action, when we helped the United Nations keep North Korea and Russia from succeeding in aggression, and in the Suez crisis of 1956, when we helped the United Nations keen Britain and France and Israel from pursuing their attack on Egypt, United States policy and conduct in the world reached heights it has not occupied since. It has never been, and never will be folly to use international institutions and international law to halt aggression and restore peace.

The Lights Off Spendthrift Turning out the lights is no longer going to be a symbol of economy, and that man in the White House is either behind the times or a secret propagan dist for those natural gas resources

of his own state of Texas, according to the latest scientific advices. In certain situations, at least, it will soon be smart and thrifty to leave lights on all night, even in empty buildings. This will be when the building in question has been converted to what is being called the light-heating system, in which fluorescent tubes are used for double purposes, first, of course, to give light, but, second, to supply heat as

The idea is to make more use of the heat that is given off, anyway, by a light tube. And it has been discovered that, if this process requires more lighting than offices have hitherto possessed, the additional light power is a welcome addition to the comfort and efficiency of the people working in the office.

Where the light-heating system can be set up with maximum efficiency, as in a new building, it is supposedly very And the engineers charged with the

task of finding out how to take care

of a building which needs more heat than can be produced as part of the light-heating program have come up with some interesting devices. In one of the experimental light-heated buildings, the lighting itself provides only about 50 per cent of the daytime winter heat requirements. So the heat-engineering system has to make up the other 50 per cent. "Westminister Abbey, though part of the Church of England, is entirely nonsectarian. We feel the abbey belongs to the people. We only exclude those who exclude themselven." The abbey's 900th year coincides with completion of the restoration of its interior, which was begun at the time of Queen Elizabeth II's coronation in 1663. The stonework now looks cleaner than for many years.

The isle of Thorns amidst the riverside marshes of Westminister, some miles to the west of the old City of London, first had a monastic foundation as early as the Tth century. The Great Church of Abbey of St. Peter was finished by King Edward the Confessor in 1065. The king, who was afterward declared a saint, is buried there.

The first king crowned in Westminster Abbey was william the Conqueror, on Christim mas Day of 1068. All subsequent English monarchs have been crowned there except two—and they were both Edwards.




