Won't Prevent Accidents



The major cause of the tragic high-way death toll is not, and has not been, the automobile. The cause is the driver. No automobile ever fled a salesroom, parking lot or family garage, raced along a highway and crashed into a manned vehicle. Accidents just don't "happen." They occur in the main because drivers through negligence, carelessness or some other human failure invites them.

Safety-belts in the rear seat, padded dashboards and visors will reduce the possibilities of serious injuries after an accident has occurred. These devices will do nothing to prevent accidents.

Until driving habits and patterns are changed, the grisly highway death toll will continue. Manufacturers can build greater injury-prevention features into the car but they can't control the drivers.
