WASHINGTON — Although it would be dangerous to say that the importance of a single, localized military victory over the Viet Cong in the bloody Marine victory over the Viet Cong at Chu Lai symbolizes an improved overall situation in Viet Nam, it is still going down hill.

By no means is the improvement strictly military or even mainly military. In the first place, evidence is now available that the Soviet Union, partly as a result of the American withdrawal, is passing this along to Hanoi. Although the official Moscow word to the U.S. is that "you can't win," the growing evidence of the Viet Cong's deep impression on the Russians.

Udine Moscow, Hanoi never has been faced with a U.S. commitment to the Viet Cong. Remembering the French experience, the North Vietnamese mission to Moscow is to get a daily file of every incident in the U.S. — newspaper editorials, signed advertisements, peace demonstrations — as proof that the U.S. has not French will tire of the war and "bug out."

But the weight of evidence the other way, coupled with Hanoi's own messages to Moscow, is now for the first time forcing Hanoi to confront the truth: that the U.S. just won't be pushed out.

Several other factors must be taken into account in this new psychological equation. For more than six weeks now, the number of Viet Cong attacks (called the "incident rate" in intelligence parlance) has been lower than normal.

In addition, the tough-minded and intelligent Viet Cong recruitment problem has been much publicized, with 15-year-olds being forcibly drafted in southern hamlets and made to fight the Viet Cong.

Finally, evidence accumulates in the form of captured orders and prisoner interrogation that this year's feared monsoon of-

SAIGON—Four funerals were to be held on the little street in front of the theater on the air base. The pallbearers, who came from the units of the men who were killed, arrived early, at 9 a.m. in freshly ironed uniforms. They stood alongside each other, their faces pale and black and were to hold the caskets when they arrived from the morgue.

Two trucks came around the corner and stopped. A Vietnamese military band climbed down. The bandstand was blue berets and had gold braid looped around their shoulders. They put their instruments down on the asphalt and walked over to set the caskets on the trucks.

An old master sergeant, cap-tured and wearing glasses, came out of the theater. He tapped a microphone to make sure it was on.

All right," he called out through the microphone, "we're going to get a candle here for you men to drill with. We'll run this through a couple of times and get it down right. Let's put the cigarettes out."

The pallbearers shouldered their caskets and formed around the carpenter's horses. They faced the theater, a high white cement building with a sunburst and a sign that read "WOODEN MARQUEE had been stripped of movie posters. Only the red letters "Theater" remained.

"We'll use the same vehicle each time in the drill," the sergeant said. "In the funeral procession, the casket will come in a different vehicle."

Robin the pallbearers, Vietnamese teen-agers in shorts and with their hair cut in a bowl, were lined up on the sidewalk. The sergeant walked to a walk they were building through the crowd. He held a red-ed-wire fence separated the crowd from the sidewalk. The sergeant took off his cap and bowed to the crowd.

"What I say 'pre-ent-harms' except the group moving the body," he said. "Now let's start with the carry-casket position."

The five groups of pallbearers, officers from an Army hospital unit, stepped in front of the casket. A blue station wagon with an empty silhouette of a man in the back came down the street. It stopped in front of the helicopter officers and they reached out and took the casket out and strapped it to the awnings.

Regardless of what you call it, a patch of clover brightens the roadside and lifts the quiet, avertless atmosphere. It's better than looking at the sky. And that's the way it is.

Vernon New Unit Reinstates Fired Town Employee

The town's newly formed merit system board conducted its first hearing last night, and voted to reinstate a public works department employee.

Ronald Aniello, East Main St., had filed for a hearing after he was dismissed from the department on Aug. 13 by public works head Andrew Tricarico. Aniello had been employed by the town since Nov. 30, 1964.

In his recommendation to Mayor Thomas J. McCusker, the board said that Aniello should be reinstated without loss of pay or tenure. The mayor acted immediately, and Aniello was back at his job this morning.

The board met last night, after a lengthy hearing, to reach its decision.

Aniello was dismissed, Tricarico told the board last night after an argument on Aug. 13. Tricarico charged "misconduct" and "insubordination" as the reasons for the dismissal.

Aniello's side was taken by Dominic Badolito, a representative of the AFL-CIO municipal employees' union.

Town public works employees voted recently to form a union, and Aniello was chosen the local steward.

According to testimony presented at the hearing, the dismissal followed an argument that occurred about lunch time on Aug. 13, after Aniello pulled a flat tire on his truck.

He pointed out the flat to town mechanic, according to testimony, and added that the vehicle's brakes were faulty.

"Mr. Tricarico came over," Aniello said, "and asked me what was going on. I explained it to him."

An argument developed over the maintenance of the town's vehicles.

Tricarico charged that Aniello had needed him in front of other public works employees, and said he would take his case to Mayor Thomas J. McCusker.

Tricarico said Aniello told him, "I'll be here long after you're gone."

Badolito, a field representative for the Connecticut Council of the American Federation of State, County and Municipal Employees, asked Aniello to state his case.

"Can you tell me what his (Aniello's) specific insubordination was?"

"The charges are insubordination and insubordination. He was a disturbing element because of statements he made," Tricarico replied.

"Do you call this insubordination?" Badolito asked.

"He (Aniello) was defiant and arrogant in front of other employees," Tricarico charged.

"He challenged my authority. He made derogatory remarks about the mechanic and about me."

According to testimony, the argument ended about 12:18 a.m. after Tricarico dismissed Aniello that he was dismissed.

But, when Tricarico returned from lunch, he found Aniello back driving a truck.

Aniello said that Mr. Booth, setting public works head in Tricarico's absence, told him to take out a new truck.

"I told Booth that Aniello was not to be reassigned," Tricarico said. Booth later remarked that he assigned Aniello a new truck before lunch time and did not know that Aniello had been fired.

During the hearing, Badolito interrupted the testimony to offer his own charges, "on behalf of the employees."

"I charge that the dismissal was improper, and that Mr. Tricarico has no authority to dismiss," Badolito said.

"Mr. Aniello was not insubordinate," Mr. Tricarico has (earlier) admitted that neither is it uncommon among public works employees."

"The employees feel that this (incident) was brought about because they joined the union," he charged.

"Is there anything?" Badolito asked.

"I am subjected to very little hearing," Tricarico replied.

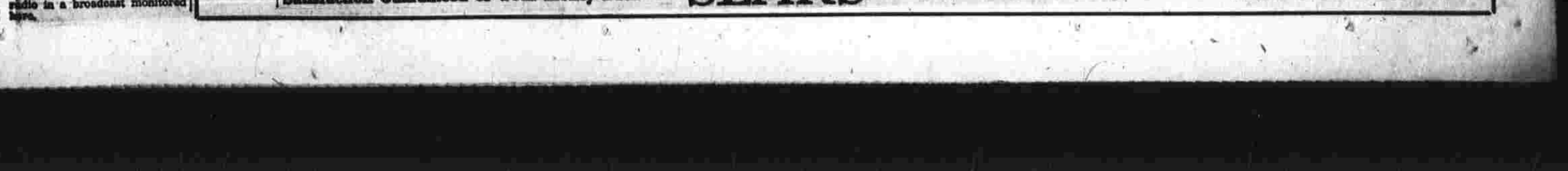

New Warrant Issued for John Doyle

NEW HAVEN (AP)—Another warrant was issued Tuesday for John Christopher Doyle, multi-millionaire former board chairman of Canadian Javelin, Ltd. The charge this time is jumping bail in U.S. District Court.

Doyle, who was arrested in Hartford July 18, but he didn't show up. He was scheduled to begin serving three months in prison for sending unregistered Canadian Javelin stock through the U.S. mails.

A warrant was issued then by U.S. District Judge T. Emmet Clark.

Doyle was indicted Tuesday for jumping his \$10,000 bond and another warrant was signed by U.S. District Judge Robert C. Zimmerman in New Haven.

Doyle is apparently safe from arrest by U.S. authorities as long as he stays out of the country. There is no extradition agreement between the U.S. and Canada covering the charge he was convicted of.

Doyle pleaded guilty to the charge and then accepted his conviction, an unusual legal move.

The U.S. Court of Appeals, 2nd Circuit, turned down his appeal and Doyle is now in the hands of the Supreme Court.

Justice John Marshall Harlan of the Supreme Court ruled that while the appeal was pending, Doyle would have to surrender himself and begin serving his prison term.

Doyle is a good friend of Newfoundland Premier Joseph I. Smallwood, who made a trip to Washington, D.C., two years ago to try to get the U.S. Army to buy the production of Doyle's Judge Javelin.

Doyle's bond set at \$100,000 if he is ever arrested.

Senate Beaten Down In Foreign Aid Fight

WASHINGTON (AP)—Conferees to study the President's \$3.26-billion foreign aid authorization bill were defeated in the Senate Tuesday. The bill, which would increase the overseas-aid program by \$1.2 billion, was defeated 53-43.

The Senate's battle with the House over the bill is expected to continue through the end of the session.

The Senate voted Tuesday when it voted 67-27 passage of a bill tailored to House demands and previously approved by that body. All it needs is Johnson's signature.

The amount of authorization didn't even figure in the major dispute this year, and the House agreed upon totals came within \$700,000 of what Johnson asked.

The final amount that actually will be made available to finance the program will be fought out in a subsequent appropriations bill providing the money.

Here's what the Senate wanted, and for which its conferees argued unsuccessfully in meetings with House negotiators:

1. A two-year authorization to avoid the yearly struggle over foreign aid legislation, and to give aid officials more time for planning their overseas military and economic assistance programs.
2. Termination of the program in its present form at the end of two years and the creation of a congressional committee to investigate its administration and recommend changes to reduce spending and concentrate future aid in countries where it will be most effective.
3. To get nothing. Instead it got promises from the House conferees to consider a multi-year authorization next year, and from the administration to recommend a longer program than it got promises from both the administration and the House conferees to study the program.

Cranberry Crop Believed Small

WASHINGTON (AP)—The Agriculture Department forecasts fewer cranberries for this year's Thanksgiving and other turkey dinners.

Based on conditions as of Aug. 18, the agency Tuesday forecast this year's crop at 1,500,000 barrels, a 10 per cent less than last year but 1 per cent above the 1963-64 average. Production is expected to be less than last year in Massachusetts, Wisconsin and New Jersey. Larger crops are expected in Washington and Oregon.

This year's production compared to last year, respectively by state included: Massachusetts, 600,000 barrels this year and 600,000 last year; Wisconsin, 150,000 and 150,000; Washington, 600,000 and 600,000; and Oregon, 400,000 and 400,000.

MANNED SPACE CENTER, Houston, Tex. (AP)—The Soviet Union has not been inclined to cooperate in space.

So, U.S. diplomats in Moscow say, it is unlikely a Russian representative will accept President Johnson's invitation to observe the Gemini 6 launch in October.

The reason apparently is the Russian government's policy of not having to return the favor by inviting Americans to observe Russian space launches, which are kept secret until after the spacecrafts are launched.

Guam-Based SAC Bombers Hit Viet Cong Jungle Target

SAIGON, South Viet Nam (AP)—Guam-based B52 jet bombers of the U.S. Strategic Air Command struck today at a suspected Viet Cong installation 30 miles north-east of Saigon in the Zone D jungle, a U.S. military spokesman announced.

This was the 12th raid of the war by the big eight-engine craft. The spokesman said it was their third strike within the zone, a Communist-infested territory about 800 square miles stretching from a point north of Saigon eastward toward the South China Sea.

Under new security regulations, no further details were released.

Two South Vietnamese planes dropped \$8,000 worth of napalm on three North Vietnamese cities during the night, the spokesman said.
