The Red Cross said it "wishes to express sincere thanks to all those who took the time to remember that there is always a need for blood, especially in the summer, and in particular during this month."

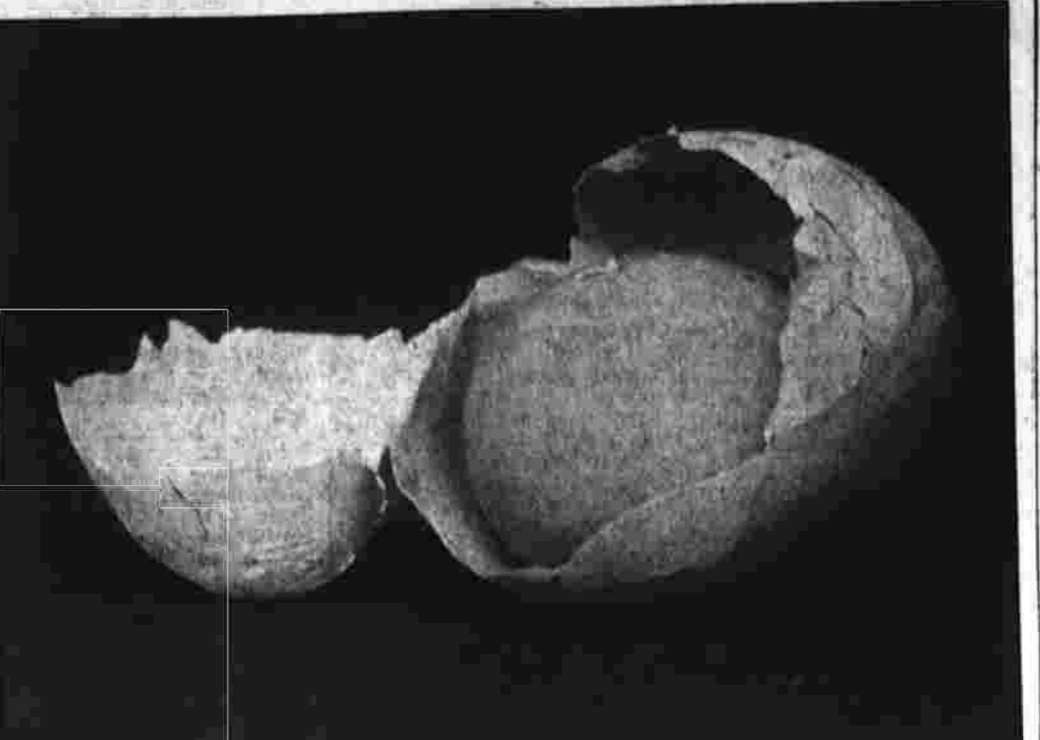
