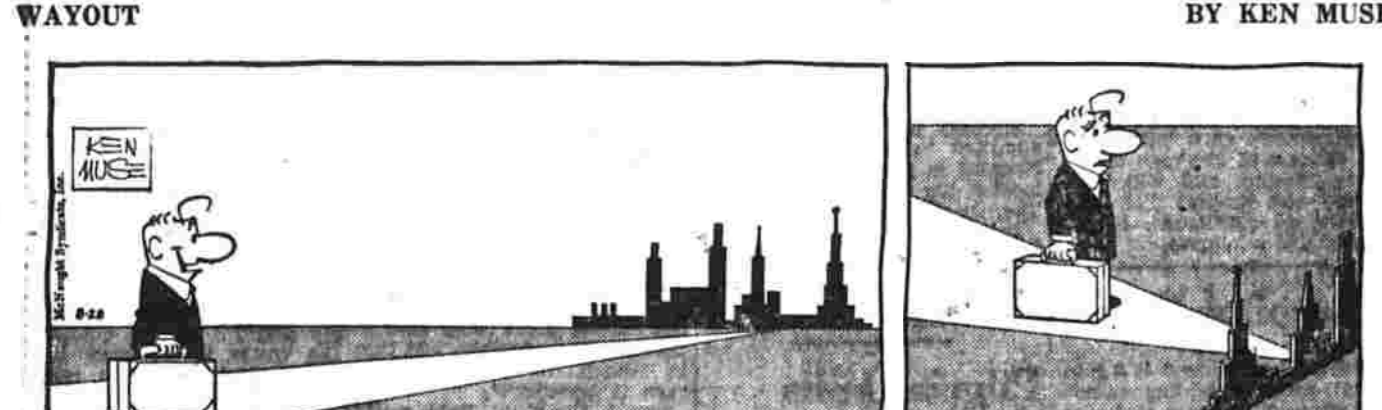

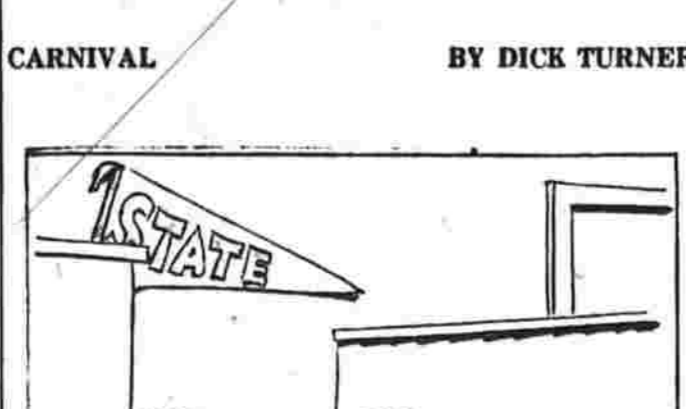

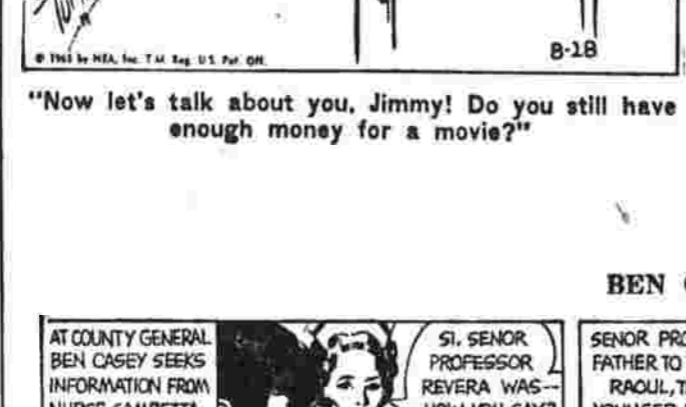

The Colechester State Police Troop is looking for auxiliary troopers to assist its regulars in traffic control and emergency duty.

Qualified applicants may apply at the barracks, and, if accepted, will begin training Oct. 1. Training begins with intensive classroom instruction at the barracks Wednesday evenings at 7, and leads to field training at 7 and 10 p.m.

To be eligible, an applicant must be male, between 21 and 50 years old, at least five feet, seven and one half inches tall and in good physical condition.

MEA Files Petition Seeking New Vote

The Manchester Education Association (MEA) yesterday formally petitioned the State Department of Education for a teacher referendum to decide who will negotiate for public school teachers in Manchester.

By law, once the petition is filed a referendum must be held within 45 days. Thus, it is likely Manchester's second teacher referendum in a year will be held before Columbus Day, Oct. 12.

Robert Wolfert, MEA president, was not at home to answer how many signatures were on the petition.

According to the new right-to-negotiate bill, which lays down the procedure for referendum and negotiations, the petition must be signed by 20 per cent of either all the professional staff or all the supervisors or administrators, or all the teachers.

Whichever it is depends on whether the MEA wants to represent all the professional staff or just the teachers.

Since the National Education Association, the parent body of the MEA, has long professed the belief that teachers and administrators can and should be in the same organization, it is likely that the MEA petition represents all the professional staff, both teachers and administrators.

There are approximately 460 professional staff members in the Manchester School System; so Wolfert would have had to collect about 96 signatures from the 417-member MEA.

The MEA also petitioned for the first referendum, which was held in April and won, unopposed, by the MEA. However, it was soon invalidated by the right-to-negotiate bill passed by the General Assembly months later.

Since then the MEA has asked, and been refused, to speak for all professional staff members during the interim before a second referendum.

The MEA based its argument on the results of the first referendum which showed it to be the majority organization.

The Manchester Federation of Teachers, a much smaller, union-affiliated group, has taken no formal action toward petitioning for a referendum although it has expressed its intent to do so.

When it does it is likely it will ask only to represent the teachers since it and its parent affiliation, the American Federation of Teachers, believe firmly in the separation of teachers and administrators.

Silo Completed

A 150-ft high concrete silo rose to its full height in less than a week by a process called slip-form construction. The silo, completed Monday at midnight, was built for the Central Connecticut Cooperative Farmer's Association on April 11.

The base of the silo required 313 square yards of concrete and the sides another 900, all supplied continuously for a week by Manchester Sand and Gravel of 60 Adams St. It had to be supplied continuously because of the process used.

A form for the walls was placed on the base and unformed concrete poured into it. Steel rods were placed into the concrete and, when the concrete hardened, lifts attached to the rods and to the form pulled the form up so that more concrete could be poured. The lifts inched up the rods at a rate of 10 inches an hour. The form had to be kept in motion in order to keep it from sticking to the concrete.

Although the walls of the silo are only 7 inches thick all the way up to its top, the steel rods and the curving walls are said to add more than enough strength to make it a lasting structure. When the silo's four compartments are filled with grain it will be even stronger.

The total cost of the silo will be about \$80,000. It will be ready by at least Oct. 1 for the fall corn crop from the Midwest.

A Midwest construction firm, Borton Inc., Hutchinson, Kan., came east to build what is probably the first grain silo built by this process in Connecticut. In the west these silos are common features in most towns.

The whole operation was supervised by Manchester Engineering Co., 627 Main St., with engineers David Kahane and William Bayer.

Two other slip-form constructed silos were built in Portland and Rocky Hill but they were for the storage of cement.

The silo was built for the Coop in order to better serve its 250 farmer members in a 60-mile radius of Manchester, said Emanuel Hirth, manager of the cooperative for nearly six years. He said 124,000 tons of poultry feed was delivered to members last year and even more will have been sent out by the end of this year.

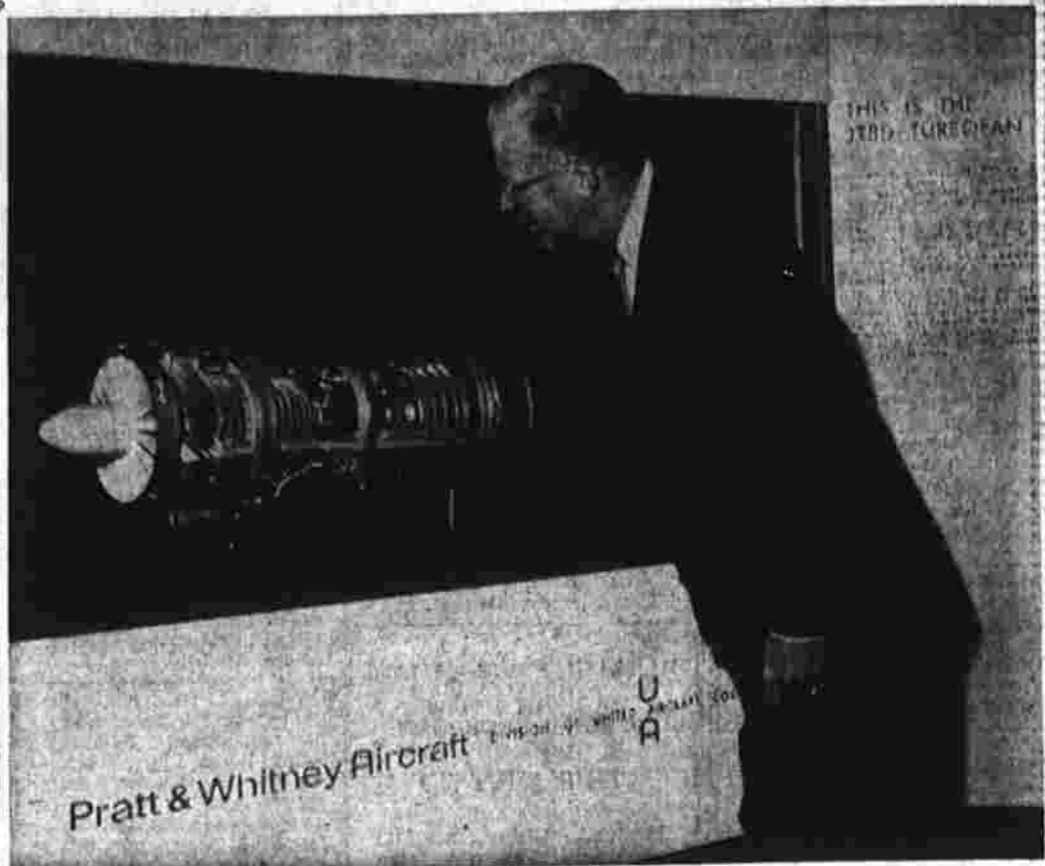

WEATHER DATA An electronic system that talks to pilots in human voice to give them weather information in flight has been developed for the Air Force for possible use in air bases throughout the world.

The information is radiated to the pilots by means of a speech-producing unit in which are stored scores of words and phrases recorded on film sound tracks. Through a light and photocell arrangement controlled electronically, the proper combination of words and phrases is put together to reflect current weather conditions around the airfield.

Whenever it is called for, the message formed by the combination, revised as weather conditions change, is communicated to pilots by the recorded voice.

The digital-to-voice system is called AVLOW for Automatic Voice Link, Operational in the Air Force System Command's Electronic Systems Division by United Aircraft Corporate Systems Center of Farmington and Cognitronics Corp. of Briarcliff Manor, N.Y.

AVLOW will be used by air fields to provide information on approach-zone weather to incoming or passing pilots.

Tom and Dick Smothers are basically folk singers but though they sing the ethnic songs like pros, they just use music as an excuse for comedy.

Dick, in the tradition of comedy teams, is the straight man of the act. Tom is the bewildered one who plays guitar and blinks out at the world in tortured confusion.

At Las Vegas, they proved to be the comedy hit of the summer season. And no place hates folk singers more than Las Vegas.

Only Belafonte has cracked the Nevada resort in the past.

Come Sept. 17, the Smothers Brothers television series makes its debut on CBS.

The format has Tom coming

to earth as a bewildered angel — on probation. It takes off from there.

Perfectionists both, the two were not satisfied with their first shows. They hired a new producer-director, Freddy De Cordova, and will re-shoot most of them. They, naturally, own a piece of the show.

Both brothers report that the question most frequently asked them is: Is Smothers really your name?

Every song they sing gets an introduction just like the regular folk singers do.

His final act of courage came when he pitted his strength against that of a machine. When the race was over, John Henry laid down his nine-pound hammer and died. And a railroad man looked down at his inert form and said: 'Look at that big, dumb Jack Hank — thought he could beat a machine.'"

"The founding of the Colonies: The original 13 Colonies were founded by our forefathers who were fleeing from religious prosecution (sic) and the common market. The Puritans were very religious people who worked hard to carve a home from the wilderness. But on Saturday night everyone let down his hair and relaxed around the fireside with a fun-packed, frolicsome witch burning."

HOLLYWOOD (AP) — Walter Brennan, playing the richest man in California in an ABC comedy series last season, ordered an assistant to buy the airline when he was unable to get a plane reservation.

Burl Ives, playing the richest man in the world in a new ABC comedy series this season, will order an assistant to buy a hotel when he is unable to get the accommodations he wants.

Brennan's "Tycoon," unfortunately, lived but a single season, quite possibly because the public had become so conditioned to his image as a lovable, foxy hillbilly of all those seasons of "The Real McCoys" that it just didn't identify him as a lovable, foxy millionaire.

Ives, ABC's new model of the lovable, foxy millionaire, is under no such handicap. He first achieved fame as a folk singer and balladeer, then moved on to a stellar Broadway and motion picture career as an actor with a range from tragedy to comedy. "O.K. Crackerby" will be his first television series.

Where as Brennan's diamond-in-the-rough tycoon spent the season hankering for the good old days when he was poor, anonymous and struggling, Ives' will be concentrating on social climbing and culture. The idea of the series belongs to Cleveland Amory, a proper Bostonian whose writing speciality is the surgical dissection of high and pseudohigh society. The first script was put together by Abe Burrows, who wrote the book for "How To Succeed in Business Without Really Trying."

"But the execution of the series," Ives explained, "was turned over to the Hollywood professionals."

This may forebode the usual, tired format of a series. But Ives believes that his character will strike the Walter Mitty chord in the average person, cowed and helplessly angered when encountering arrogance.

"He puts snobs in their place," the bearded, round-faced actor said. "You know how people are treated by maitre d'hôtels, headwaiters, petty officials, clerks in snitzy stores — any of these cats who like to push people around."

Television has had little impact on fashions, men's or women's. This has been due largely to the fact that most shows have been in black and white, and much detail was lost.

Como has been credited with popularizing comfortable, colorful sweaters, and Williams has made a hit with his sweaters, slacks, and colorful suede boots. He wears clothes with flair and obviously is not afraid of exotic plumage.

His personal wardrobe, he insists, is not large: just six suits, a couple of sports jackets, and about 100 sweaters and 30 pairs of slacks.

The clothes he wears on his

show, however, are not his, even though he picks them. They are owned by the producers of the program, are worn only on the show, and hence are tax-deductible. Williams never sees the bills, but his producer estimates the bill between \$18,000 and \$20,000.

Williams' wardrobe draws considerable fan mail, a lot of it from people who think it would be nice if he gave them his cast-offs. Some even offer to buy some at half price. Since the clothes aren't his, the requests are a waste of effort and stamps.

Andy is one of the television stars who starts shooting the next season's shows very early to be free for night-club and fair engagements during the summer. He has just finished a four-day date at the Wisconsin State Fair and opens at the Iowa State Fair in Des Moines Tuesday.

## 'Private World' Retreats But 'The Nurses' Returns

HOLLYWOOD (AP) — It seems inevitable now that Lisa Hughes, the star-crossed heroine of "Our Private World," soon will be returning to safety and more suffering in "As the World Turns."

When CBS' "Dick Van Dyke Show" returns to the air for a new season Sept. 15, the network's cautious imitation of "Peyton Place" will be concluded, something less than a hit. But somehow, from the very beginning of "Our Private World," one had a feeling that CBS didn't really think it was long for the nighttime television world. In the first place, it was just a summer replacement. Secondly, the principal character was spun off the long-playing daytime soap opera. And Lisa carefully kept the door open so she could slip back to the daytime fold.

However, the network programmers have not yet finished fooling around with sudsy formats on the 15 network offerings. Strange things are happening to CBS' nighttime program, "The Doctors and the Nurses," now on reruns.

The hour series for several seasons was called "The Nurses," and the title roles were played by Shiri Conway, as Liz Thorpe, a mature angel of mercy, and Zina Bethune as Gail Lucas, a young one. In an effort to bolster its flagging ratings, CBS last season added two male physicians as leading roles, changed the title to "The Doctors and the Nurses," and spiced up the story lines.

This drastic treatment failed to cure rating troubles, so the network dropped the show at season's end. But the show's producer stubbornly refused to let it die. It will pop up again on ABC Sept. 27 as a daytime soap opera called — again — "The Nurses."

Another ABC detergent drama, "Time For Us," is on the way out, despite valiant first aid treatment. Originally it was called "Flame in the Wind" and centered on a woman novelist writing a book about her home town — a sort of spin-off on the author of the book, "Peyton Place."

The feminine audience didn't seem to care, so they changed the name, dropped the novelist, and concentrated on her two young nieces. The patient failed to rally in the ratings, so on Sept. 24 its time runs out.
