Our Daily Bombs

Somebody, somewhere, is supposed to be balancing the arguments pro and con the use of our big B-52 bombers, based ay off on Guam, for trying to hit fetcong hideouts in South Vietnam. SAnd somebody is supposed to have reached the decision that these raids are such a good thing they should be continued on a daily basis. The presumption is that, although

we do not often get any real chance to check on what they have been accomplishing, these raids upset the Vietcong enough to be worth while. The bombing theory is that a relatively small squadron of these big fellows do a better job of saturating a nated section of the map with es than the smaller fighter-bombsetually stationed in South Vieter some neighboring territory. there can be no precise assessment be validity of the arguments which apparently won the day for daily runs over South Vietnam, neither there be any accurate judgment as to just how much harm these bombing are presiminally trying to serve.

It has happened before, in war, that bombers have had to hit the land and

destroy the villages they have been trying to defend or to liberate. But it can be questioned whether the pearants of South Vietnam have the same sircumstance as the farmers of France may have had in 1945. We have now entered a phase of our activity in South Vietnam where we are doing more damage to the countryside, destroying more crops, destroying more villages, destroying more enterprise, creating more refugees and driving them toward the coastal enclaves, and taking more civilian lives than the Victoria, whom we label the enemy to the people

of South Vietnam. The possible schism between our in tent and our result is easily imaginable. We are doing this kind of bombing in order to be able to stay in South Vietnam and avoid losing it to the Vietcong. But it may be this kind of bombng which, in the end, turns the people the country against us so that they force us out.

One is not sure that the bombing of North Vietnam, however mistaken and ruitless that may seem to have been is a policy so far, doesn't make more sense than this new pattern of daily sembing in South Vietnam.

One New Word Can Get Lost Of all the people responsible for the almost daily and certainly continuous process of supplying our era with a vocabulary unique and fitting to its accomplishments and problems, those who win our greatest gratitude are those who offer us terms which, even in some new and very sophisticated context, nevertheless assist the neophyte toward some understanding of their own mean-

Thus when the original launching of Gemini 5 was suddenly 'scrubbed," we got the idea that something unexpected had happened to it, and we rather easlly deduced that what was meant was not that the project had been subjected to soap and water and washeloth behind the ears, but to some kind of postponement or temporary wiping out. We had an even happier and most instantaneous understanding of "splashdown," when that new word entered the language to tell the story of the end of the Gemini 5 flight.

Similarly, we have not had too much trouble with "escalation," which is a very good and quite self explanatory word for the way computers run a war when they get the chance.

And almost everybody has had enough grounding in Latin to think of the word "nihilism" to apply to instances of revolt and unrest in which the ideal seemed to be some sheer pointlessness of tearing down anything and everything toward a state of nothing-

But, after all these relatively easy language adjustments, "reductionism" has us stumped, and we are glad that a whole college campus was devoted, not long ago, to a concerted effort to at least neutralize the word if not expunge it from the language.

All this volunteer gathering of experts up at Bowdoin College had to do to convert us into a dislike of "reductionism" was to explain something of what it meant. It is, it seems, the term which covers the theory that everything that is can and must be ultimately explained in terms of the laws of inanimate nature.

The mere thought of such a thing is enough to send the very animate hackles of one's being rising, and we choose to join, in as complete a loyalty as one compiler of sentences and sentiments can ever extend to the compilation of others, the fine declaration of revolution and scorn authored by the scholars assembled at Bowdoin. We buy it, in the modern sense of subscribing

After citing the theory of reduction fsm, the Bowdoin manifesto takes off and escalates as follows:

"In the light of such a reductionist program, the finalistic nature of living the sentience of animals and their intelligence, the responsible choices of man, his moral and aesthetic ideals, the fact of human greatness seem all of them anomalies that will be removed eventually by further prog-

"Their existence even the existence of science itself-has no legitimate grounds; our deepest convictions lack all theoretical foundation.

"This movement claims to unify science and to comprehend in it all subjects of study. But, since its ideal is fundamentally mistaken, the result has been to debase the conception of man entertained by the psychological and special sciences and at the same time to isolate the humanistic core of history and criticism.

"It has displaced the traditional endeavor of philosophy to comprehend the whole domain of human thought and produced instead distortion and fragmentation."

This "reductionism" is obviously a very bad, bad word, which ought to be scrubbed in favor of that nihilism for which it is really just a fancy syno-

There are many points to be considered, of course, and one is the desire. of people to put pre-fabricated homes on undersized lots. The developer may have received permission for the sub-division with intentions of building one type of home; then a purchaser comes along who wants another type house which cannot fit the sub-division regu-lations.

A meeting of the Planning and Zon-ing Commission and the Zoning Board of Appeals is in order. Somewhere there has to be an understanding that benefits the community and not just the petitioner for variances. At the present pace, it would only be a matter of time before the subdivision regulations are completely ignored. Variances granted indiscriminately vitiate the code.—
